A motion was made by Commissioner Hoover, seconded by Commissioner Weekley, that the Ordinance be Adopted as presented at \$68 million. The motion failed by the following vote:

No: Commissioner Carey, Vice Mayor Kaufman, Commissioner Lopez, Commissioner Wardlow

Yes: Commissioner Hoover, Commissioner Weekley, Mayor Johnston

Then, a motion was made by Vice Mayor Kaufman, seconded by Commissioner Carey, to adopt with the amount lowered to \$30 million. Commissioner Weekley made a motion to amend, seconded by Commissioner Hoover, the amount to \$50 million.

The motion to amend to \$50 million carried with Commissioner Carey, Vice Mayor Kaufman, and Commissioner Wardlow voting No and Commissioner Hoover, Commissioner Lopez, Commissioner Weekley, and Mayor Johnston voting Yes.

Commissioner Kaufman withdrew his main motion to adopt the Ordinance with no objections and Commissioner Carey withdrew her second with no objections.

**Bond Project Descriptions** 

A motion was made by Commissioner Weekley, seconded by Commissioner Hoover, to adopt the Ordinance with an amount of \$75 million. Vice Mayor Kaufman then made a motion to amend, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, the amount to \$50 million.

The motion to amend to \$50 million failed with Commissioner Carey, Commissioner Hoover, Commissioner Wardlow, Commissioner Weekley, and Mayor Johnston voting No and Vice Mayor Kaufman and Commissioner Lopez voting Yes.

The main motion with an amount of \$75 million also failed by the following vote:

No: Commissioner Carey, Vice Mayor Kaufman, Commissioner Lopez, and Commissioner Wardlow

Yes: Commissioner Hoover, Commissioner Weekley, and Mayor Johnston

Vice Mayor Kaufman made a new main motion to adopt the Ordinance with an amount of \$50 million. That motion failed for a lack of second. Commissioner Weekley made a motion to adopt with an amount of \$65 million which did not receive a second and was not presented.

The Meeting then went into Recess at 3:57 P.M. and Reconvened at 4:03 P.M.

A motion was then restated by Commissioner Weekley, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, to adopt the Ordinance with an amount of \$65 million. The motion carried by the following vote:

No: 3 - Commissioner Carey, Vice Mayor Kaufman and Commissioner Wardlow
