



## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Office of the First Lady reports that nearly one in three children across the United States are considered overweight or obese; and

WHEREAS, the 2009 Florida Youth Risk Behavior Survey indicates that approximately 10 percent of Florida high school students are considered obese; that only 22 percent eat the recommended five servings of fruits and vegetables each day; that at least 19 percent do not participate in the recommended 60 minutes of physical activity each day; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Health reports 19 and 32 percent of the adult population of Monroe County is considered obese or overweight, respectively; and

WHEREAS, First Lady Michelle Obama launched the *Let's Move!* campaign in February 2010 to solve the challenge of childhood obesity within a generation so that children born today will reach adulthood at a healthy weight; and

WHEREAS, *Let's Move!* is comprehensive, collaborative and community-oriented and encourages collaboration among the leaders in government, medicine and science, business, education, athletics, community organizations and more on the challenge of childhood obesity; and

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Health Department runs a wellness program that addresses the challenge of childhood obesity through projects that educate and engage the community.
