As I understand it, the remodeling proposal being presented has not been approved by the City. In fact, at the three citizen meetings I attended, this proposal was voted against by the vast majority of the attendees. Both Mr. Weekly and Mr. Craig assured everyone that other meetings would be scheduled before any plans were finalized. It looks like this may not happen.

A few weeks ago the City took great pride in balancing the new year's budget by increasing the city wide parking rate by \$.50/hour and identifying 17-new pay parking spots. Now this current remodeling proposal calls for eliminating 37-spots on Caroline Street, which were used in calculating the income needed for the new budget.

If these spots are eliminated most locals will not park in the Bight Lot, they will park in the already crowded surrounding neighborhood streets of Elizabeth, William, Margaret and Eaton.

Hello Commissioner Weekley and City Commissioners,

I am writing in reference to the exciting deisgn for the Caroline Street project.

I live in Railway Condos at the end of Caroline Street and I urge you to make sure any plan you approve has a bike lane on Caroline Street. I understand we may not get one on both sides (much to my dismay) but at least from Grinnell to Elizabeth. It's a heavy traffic street and area, as is Eaton Street just one block away, and the cars parked along the way are dangerous for both pedestrians and cyclists. Caroline Street is used by many residents driving and cycling into town and this bike lane will make it much more safe for everyone.

It is my understanding that the City is only proposing the parking on the waterfront side to be removed so the street and sidewalk can be built to standard and a bike lane can be added. The other side parking is to remain or be Loading Zones, unless the proposal has changed since our final, noticed neighborhood meeting. I also think the groups at each meeting were split on whether parking should remain vs. realizing the need for a bike lane on this street, definitely not a "vast majority" on either side.

I have to respectfully disagree with any proposal that eliminates the bicycle lane from Caroline Street. There is a large lot that is underutilized and also a huge parking garage that sits mostly empty for visitor use. A bike lane is absolutely necessary and we have to design this with forward-thinking for the good of our city as a whole, not just for people who "like" to park on the other side of the street and are not satisfied with the spaces in front of them and their house. I realize those residents without a space on their own property may have a little trouble finding a space as close as they are use to, but the City does not owe them a spot wherever they want one. I also realize some businesses are concerned about the parking for their customers but I think with the Loading Zone/30 min parking spaces they should be fine. Otherwise, as long as it's easy for people to access the large lot in front of the old market and have a safe ramp to get from the lot to Caroline Street, I don't feel the businesses will be negatively effected. Actually, I think making the street more pedestrian and bicycle safe will slow traffic and perhaps increase their business! I do think this may need to be followed up with some parking attention on the side streets between Eaton & Caroline. Perhaps start enforcing Residential Parking so tourists must use the pay lots provided.

We have to stop encouraging driving around in this town and this is a great place to start.
