**Original Narrative By Russell Holmes, 02/20/26 23:45**

On February 20, 2026, at approximately 1930 hours, I, Officer R. Holmes, was on routine patrol in a marked Key West Police Department patrol vehicle in the area of South Roosevelt Boulevard, Key West, Monroe County, Florida.

While traveling northbound, I observed two individuals riding bicycles northbound on the sidewalk located on the east side of S. Roosevelt Boulevard. I immediately recognized the male rider as a subject I had encountered moments

earlier in an area known for frequent narcotics activity and use. During that prior encounter, the male had been speaking with another individual with whom I needed to speak. As I approached in my patrol vehicle, the male abruptly left the area.

When I asked the remaining individual who the male was and why he departed so quickly, he replied, "I don't know." I asked what the male had on him, and the individual responded, "I don't know, why are you giving me a hard time? Go get him." I then asked if the male had drugs on him, and the individual stated, "He has a kid and maybe he has warrants."

I then conducted an unrelated traffic stop. Upon returning to the area shortly thereafter, I again observed the same male, now speaking with a female. I did not observe a car seat or an actual child at that time. As I pulled up in my clearly marked patrol vehicle, both individuals quickly began riding away northbound on their bicycles.

I continued to observe them while traveling north on S. Roosevelt Boulevard. I then observed one of the individuals discard a lit cigarette into the mangroves located on the east side of the seawall. Based on the observed littering violation and the potential fire hazard posed by throwing a lit cigarette into dry vegetation, I activated my overhead emergency lights and siren, which also activated my in-car and body-worn cameras. Using my in-car public address system, I gave loud, clear, and repeated lawful commands for both individuals to stop, as I was unsure which of the two had discarded the cigarette.

As I exited my patrol vehicle, the male immediately stated, "What are you stopping us for?" He then fled at a high rate of speed on his electric bicycle, disregarding my lawful commands to stop. I returned to my patrol vehicle and followed the male while advising Communications on Channel One that the subject was fleeing. I provided updated locations and advised of traffic violations being committed as the male rode recklessly in an apparent attempt to evade law enforcement. I followed at a safe speed with my emergency lights and siren activated, until told to cease by Sgt. Del Valle.

Additional officers responded to assist in establishing a perimeter and aiding in locating the fleeing subject. While fleeing, the male operated his electric bicycle in a reckless manner, showing no regard for his own safety or the safety of others. Due to the earlier statement that he "has a kid," I alerted responding units over the radio that the male may have a child with him.

While traveling westbound on Eagle Avenue in an attempt to intercept and slow the subject's progress, I observed the male ride onto the lawn of 3637 Eagle Avenue. The male briefly came to a stop near the passenger side of my patrol vehicle, then began to move forward again. I exited my vehicle while the male was stopped and drew my department-issued Taser. I gave clear, loud, and repeated lawful commands for him to stop and advised him he would be tased if he did not comply. The male was facing away from me and began riding away again, continuing to disregard commands. I deployed my Taser. Only one probe made contact, preventing full neuromuscular incapacitation. The male was able to flee again on his bicycle.

I immediately updated Communications with the subject's direction of travel. I re-entered my patrol vehicle and continued searching for the male. As I traveled southbound on 19th Street, I observed K9 Officer Hansell positioned in the roadway in an attempt to deter and intercept the fleeing subject. The male continued to evade officers and ultimately traveled down an alleyway connecting Kennedy Drive and 12th Street, where all units lost visual contact.

I then returned to the area on Flagler Avenue where K9 Officer Hansell was with the female from the initial stop. She was identified as Jasmine Jones (DOB 09/30/1996). Jones was not forthcoming in identifying the male subject. She initially stated his name was "Cory Dean" and that she did not know his date of birth. Jones stated that Dean was the father of her three-month-old child, [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]), and that during the incident the child had been strapped to his chest while he was riding the electric bicycle.

Upon further investigation, the male was positively identified as Kristopher Dean (DOB 09/28/1987). A records check revealed Dean had active warrants out of Monroe County for Violation of Probation (VOP), listed as no bond.

Jones stated that Dean was homeless and that she did not know where he would go. She advised that she was in possession of Dean's phone and that Dean had her phone. I accompanied Jones to her residence in an attempt to assist in locating the child. Jones attempted to contact Dean multiple times without success.

Jones stated she did not wish to report the child as missing at that time. I advised her that once the child was returned,

she should contact the Key West Police Department non-emergency number. Jones stated she intended to look for the child herself.

Officers searched areas known to be frequented by Dean but were unable to locate Dean or the child. Jones advised her case worker was NaNi Roque (305-339-1919).

After explaining to Jones the issues with littering and throwing a lit cigarette into the mangroves she stated she would refrain and I issued her a verbal warning.

A review of available criminal history indicated that both Jones and Dean have prior arrests involving narcotics and weapons offenses.

My body-worn camera was activated during this incident, and the footage was uploaded to Evidence.com in accordance with department policy.

## **Supplemental Narrative By Matthew Hansell, 02/20/26 20:46**

On 02-20-2026, I K-9 Ofc. Matthew Hansell along with Ofc. M. Harrington, were riding as an FTO/PO two-person unit conducting radar enforcement on South Roosevelt Blvd.

During this time, Ofc. Holmes conducted a traffic stop a mile to our East at South Roosevelt Blvd and Flagler Ave. on two electric bicycles.

Ofc. Holmes advised the male fled the traffic stop heading inbound on Flagler Ave., as I headed toward his location. The male, Kristopher Dean was observed by me heading outbound on Flagler making a South turn onto A1A (South Roosevelt Blvd) toward Seaside Dr.

I turned onto A1A (South Roosevelt Blvd) as Dean crossed West to East and onto the sidewalk at the Riviera Canal Bridge heading South. I stopped just South of the bridge and got out of my patrol vehicle as Dean turned back around heading North over the bridge and back South onto Flagler Ave.

I ran back to my patrol vehicle and headed inbound on Flagler where I located the female involved in the traffic stop, Jasmin Jones in front of 3732 Flager Ave.

Jones was initially uncooperative with me and Ofc. Harrington asking why they were stopped. Jones said Dean did have their child in a strap along his chest as he fled police, but she was not sure why he fled. Jones seemed unbothered by the events that had occurred to this point.

Ofc. Harrington obtained Jones information and added her to the call. We eventually circulated the area without locating Dean at this time.

My Body camera and Fleet camera were working and uploaded at the conclusion of my involvement with this call.

## **Supplemental Narrative By William Howell, 02/22/26 14:22**

On Saturday, 02/21/2026 at approximately 0615 hours; I (Ofc. Howell) discovered through shift briefing/pass along that an infant minor was possibly missing. The infant minor may have been involved in an attempted traffic stop from the previous night shift.

I was informed at shift briefing/pass along that on 02/20/2026 at approximately 1930 hours, Ofc. Holmes attempted an electric bicycle traffic stop of a white female subject and a white male subject, where both subjects were riding separate electric bicycles near the intersection of South Roosevelt Boulevard and Duck Avenue.

Throughout the course of my investigation, starting at approximately 0700 hours on 02/21/2026, I discovered that Jones left Samuel's House after she was dropped off by officers at 2230 hours the previous night, 02/20/2026. It is unknown if Jones actually attempted to locate her infant minor. Other residents within Samuel's House provided hearsay and "gossip" stating that she "looked all night." Jones was instructed by Sgt. M. Del Valle to contact Key West Police Department as soon as she located her infant minor. Jones called Key West Communications and mistakenly requested to speak to Officer Del Valle, believing that was who she spoke with previously. Jones called twice at approximately 0002 hours on 02/22/2026 and again at approximately 0005 hours on 02/22/2026. Both times she was mistakenly transferred to Det. H. Del Valle's cellular phone. Through a brief conversation with Det. H. Del Valle, it was explained to Jones that she needed to speak with Sergeant M. Del Valle and that Det. H. Del Valle had no knowledge of the case. Det. H. Del Valle stated that Jones continuously asked if he had found her baby but appeared to be confused. Det. H. Del Valle explained again that he had no knowledge of the case.

I spoke with several acquaintances of Jones throughout the morning and eventually discovered that at some point in the previous night, Jones and Dean switched cellular phones. It is unknown if this was done purposely to assist Dean in avoiding and/or evading law enforcement. At approximately 1248 hours on 02/21/2026, an acquaintance of Jones explained that she was speaking with Jones through text messages as well as calls. Apparently, Jones was utilizing Dean's cellular phone. I immediately contacted Sgt. Williams and requested a "ping" of Dean's cellular phone in an attempt to locate Jones and the infant minor. The request was approved; however, the phone was deactivated and/or within a location was not accessible.

Ofc. Beeman and Ofc. G. Bozzetti, who were also assisting in attempting to locate the infant minor, informed me that another of Jones' close friends may work at local restaurant. I met with Jones' close friend at approximately 1345 hours. The close friend informed me that Dean had returned Jones' cellular phone and they were together. The close friend could not verify or refute if the infant minor was with Jones and Dean. I explained to Jones' close friend that she needed to contact Jones again. I explained that it was in Jones' best interest to return to Samuel's House with the infant minor and contact me or the police department immediately. The close friend complied and past the message along. A few minutes later, at approximately 1405 hours, Jones called the police department and requested to speak to Ofc. G. Bozzetti, stating that "her baby was fine."

Jones eventually agreed to meet with us at Samuel's House and stated she would be there in forty-five minutes, with the infant minor. I discovered Jones, with the infant minor, at 3228 Flagler Avenue (Circle K) at approximately 1527 hours on 02/21/2026. I followed Jones, who was still on her electric bicycle, back to Samuel's House immediately. Ofc. Beeman, Ofc. G. Bozzetti, and I interviewed Jones.

Jones was initially acquiescent, but her attitude and demeanor quickly shifted back to defiant and uncooperative. Jones eventually verified that Dean was carrying the infant minor while he fled from law enforcement the previous night, at approximately 1930 hours on 02/20/2026. According to Jones, Dean "dropped off" the infant minor with the acquaintance of a friend, at an unknown location a few hours after he fled from law enforcement. When asked, Jones stated she did not know the person and refused to provide any information, stating "I don't want her to get into trouble." Jones immediately expressed irritation when I asked if she knew the exact location of her infant minor's whereabouts from approximately 1930 hours on 02/20/2026 to approximately 1430 hours on 02/21/2026. Jones refused to answer. I again asked if she knew her infant minor's location for the past sixteen to nineteen hours. Jones continuously changed the subject or attempted to be misleading. When asked if the infant minor was properly fed within a reasonable amount of time, Jones retorted, "I assumed so, because she was with her father. It's not like he's a bad person." When asked if she knew explicitly if the infant minor was fed during the time period she was not with Jones, Jones became frustrated and refused to

answer. As Jones' frustration increased, she blurted out that the infant minor was "probably outside all night." Realizing what she just said, Jones immediately asked, "Why are you attacking me?" When asked why she did not contact law enforcement to further assist with locating the child after a reasonable amount of time, Jones simply replied, "You guys didn't call me..." Jones stated that she attempted to call the police department but could not specify a precise time. When asked who she spoke with, Jones replied, "with one of the Del Valles." When asked why she did not contact law enforcement as soon as the infant minor was returned, Jones again repeated, "You didn't call me." Jones eventually explained that she was concerned about her infant minor's well-being but refused to address or even acknowledge the obvious logical concerns of any prudent and sensible parent, especially when taking into consideration the infant minor's current state of a plausible diminished medical capacity and extremely young age. Jones became frustrated at several points throughout the interview and simply continued to yell, "Why are you attacking me?" and "I'm not doing this right now," while turning her body and the infant minor away from us.

I spoke with the Florida Department of Children and Families (D.C.F.) at great length, describing the details of the occurrence from the previous nineteen to twenty-two hours that pertained to the infant minor, Jones, and Dean. I spoke with Michael (Operator Number: 066). Michael created a case and assigned a case worker.

I plan to investigate this occurrence further and draft arrest warrants for Jones as well as Dean on my next duty day. I plan to complete the warrant process during that time as well.

My BWC was activated for the investigation/interview with Jones. I uploaded the video to Evidence.com.

At this time, no further information.

## **Supplemental Narrative By Jhavon Williams, 02/26/26 15:25**

On Thursday, February 26, 2026, at approximately 1347 hours, Officer Howell and I (Officer J. Williams) arrived at 1614 Truesdale Court (Samuel's House) in reference to a subject with an active warrant.

Officer Howell and I (Officer J. Williams) located Jasmine Jones (DOB:09/30/1996, Arrestee) at the above location. I immediately requested an additional unit for assistance when I discovered that Jones had her infant child.

While Officer Howell and I were on scene when Officer G. Bozzetti arrived to assist us with an infant car seat. Ofc. Bozzetti transported her to 1604 North Roosevelt (Key West Police Station) to await Florida Department of Children and Families.

I placed Jones in handcuffs. I transported Jones to the Monroe County Detention Center, without incident.
