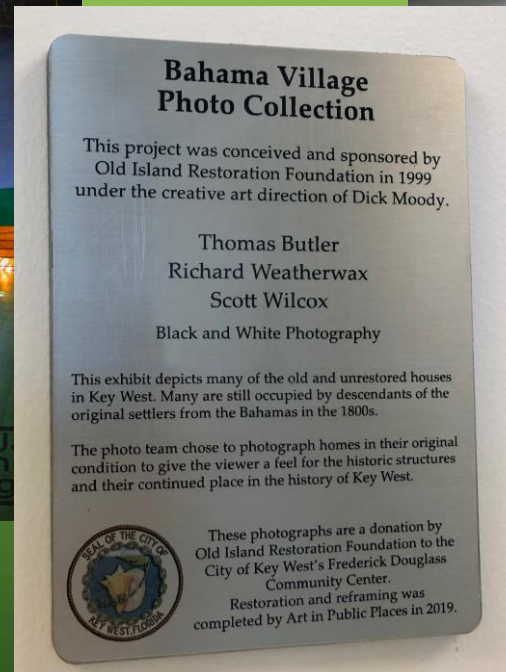

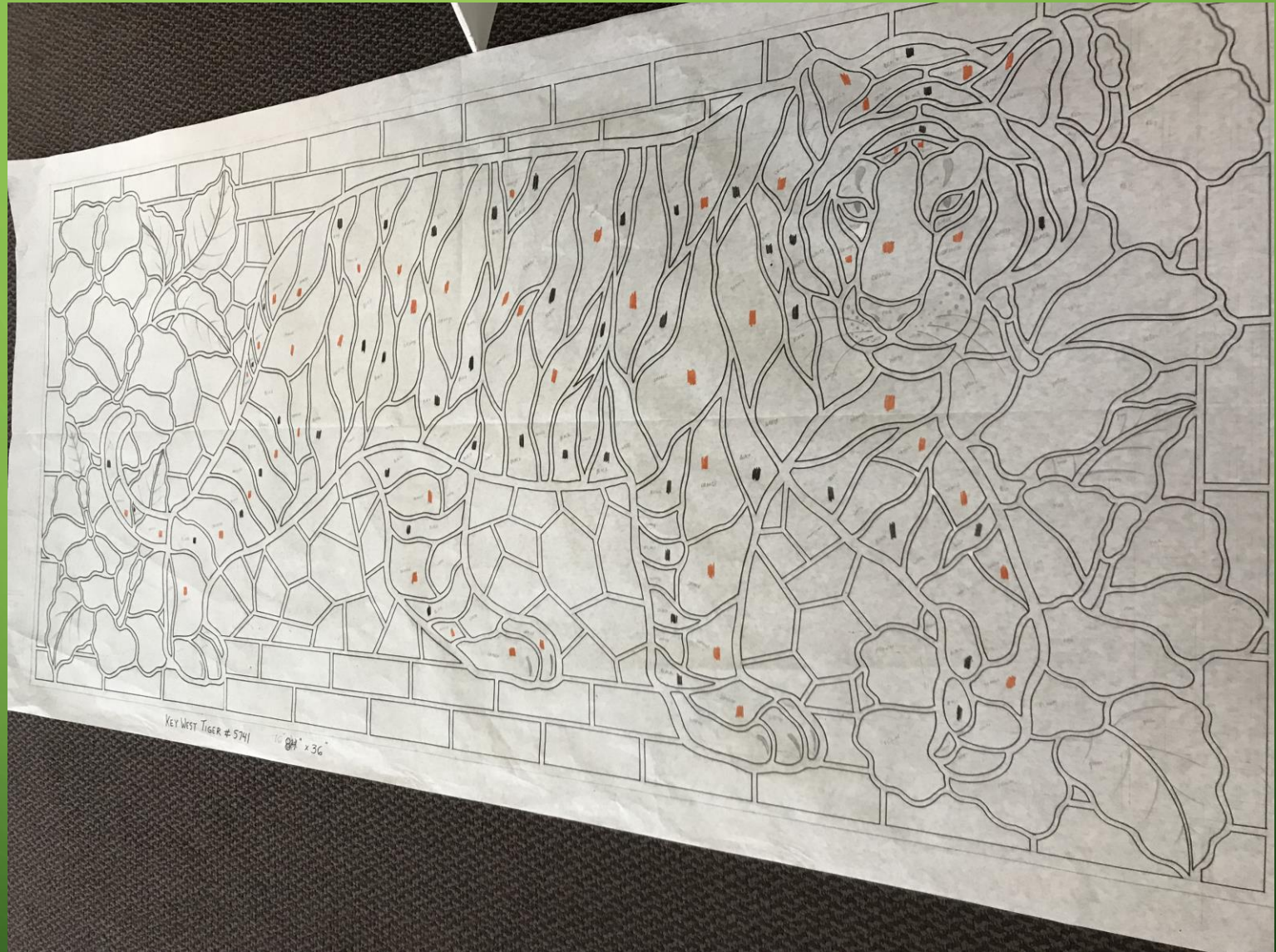
WORKS IN PROGRESS by the MCMOW GLASS ARTISTS

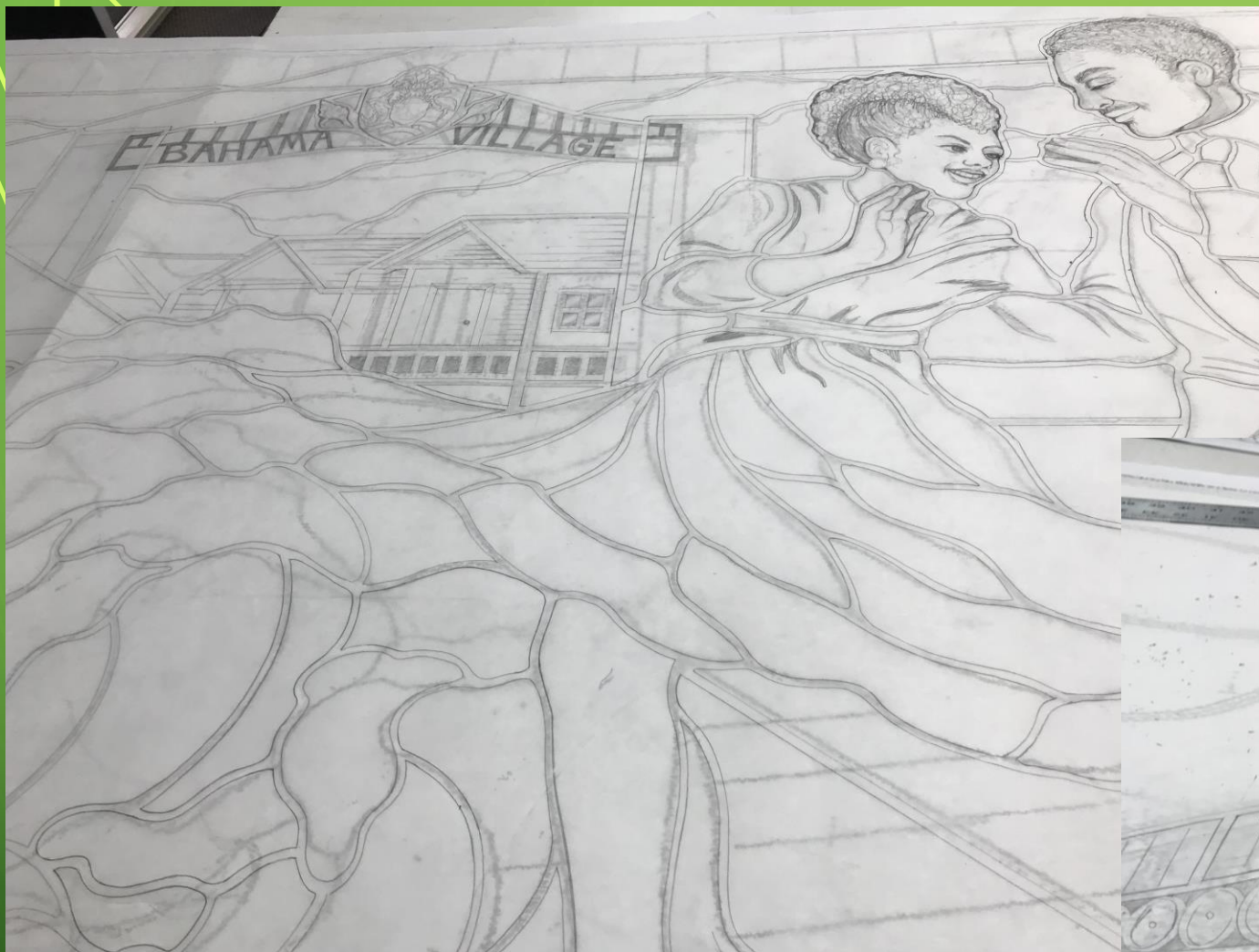

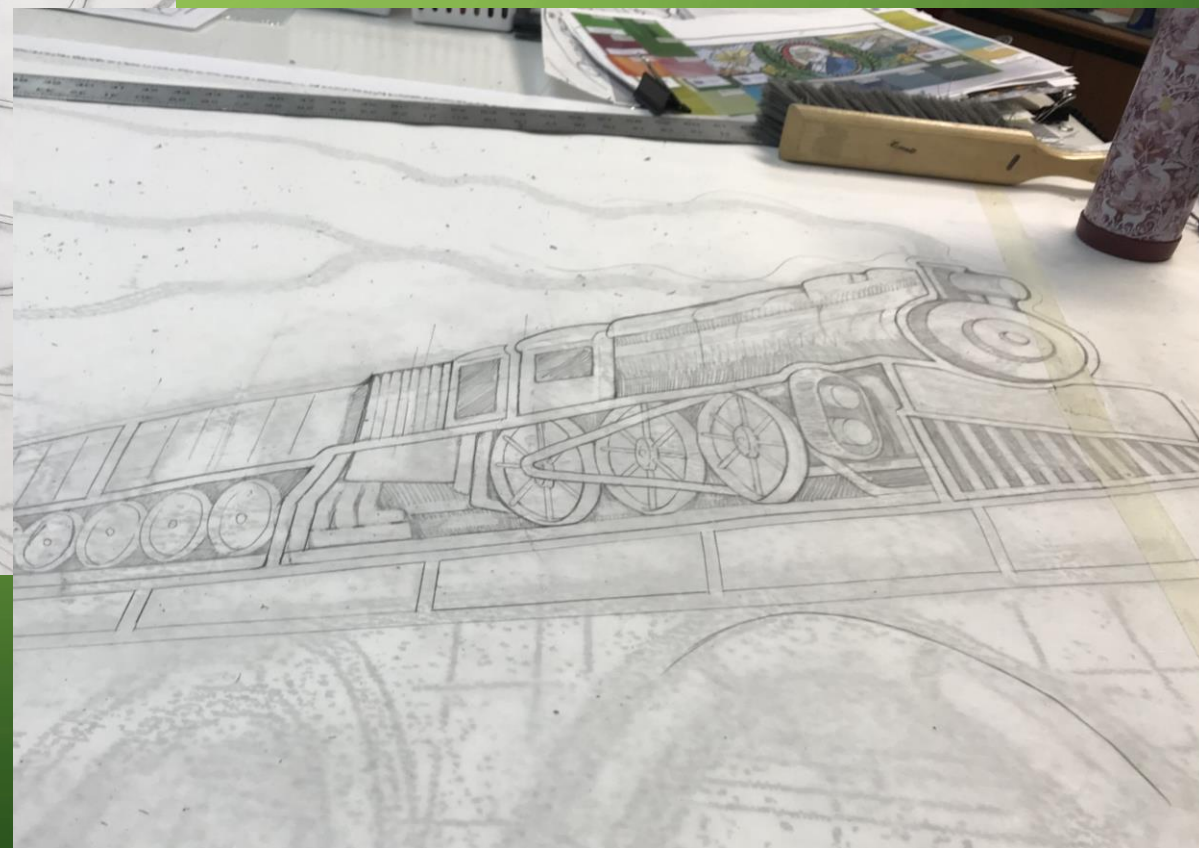

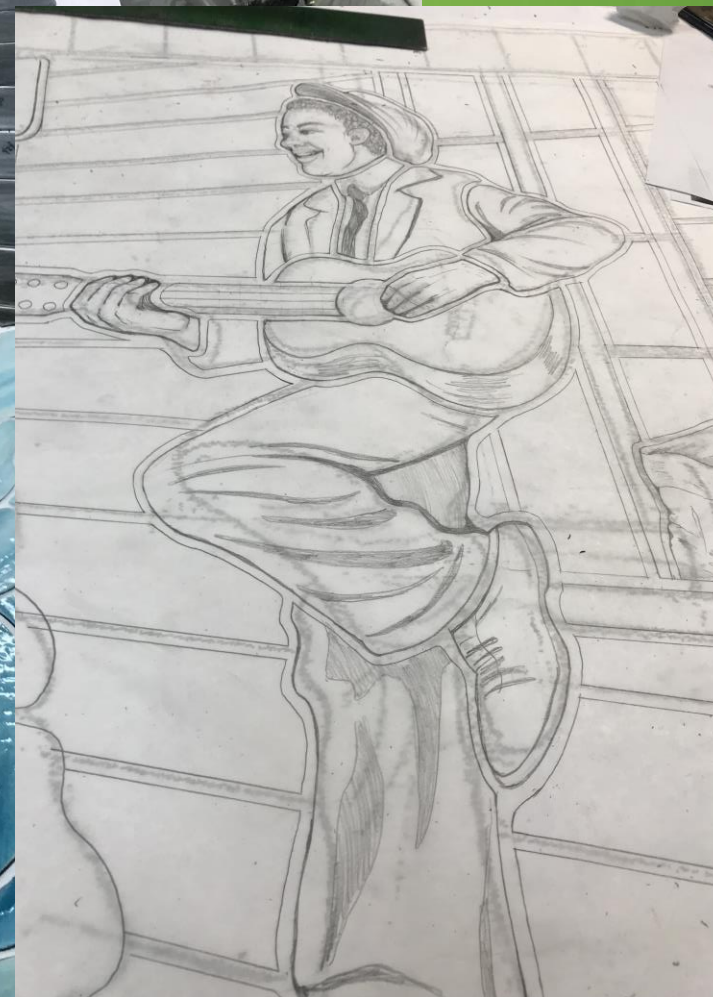
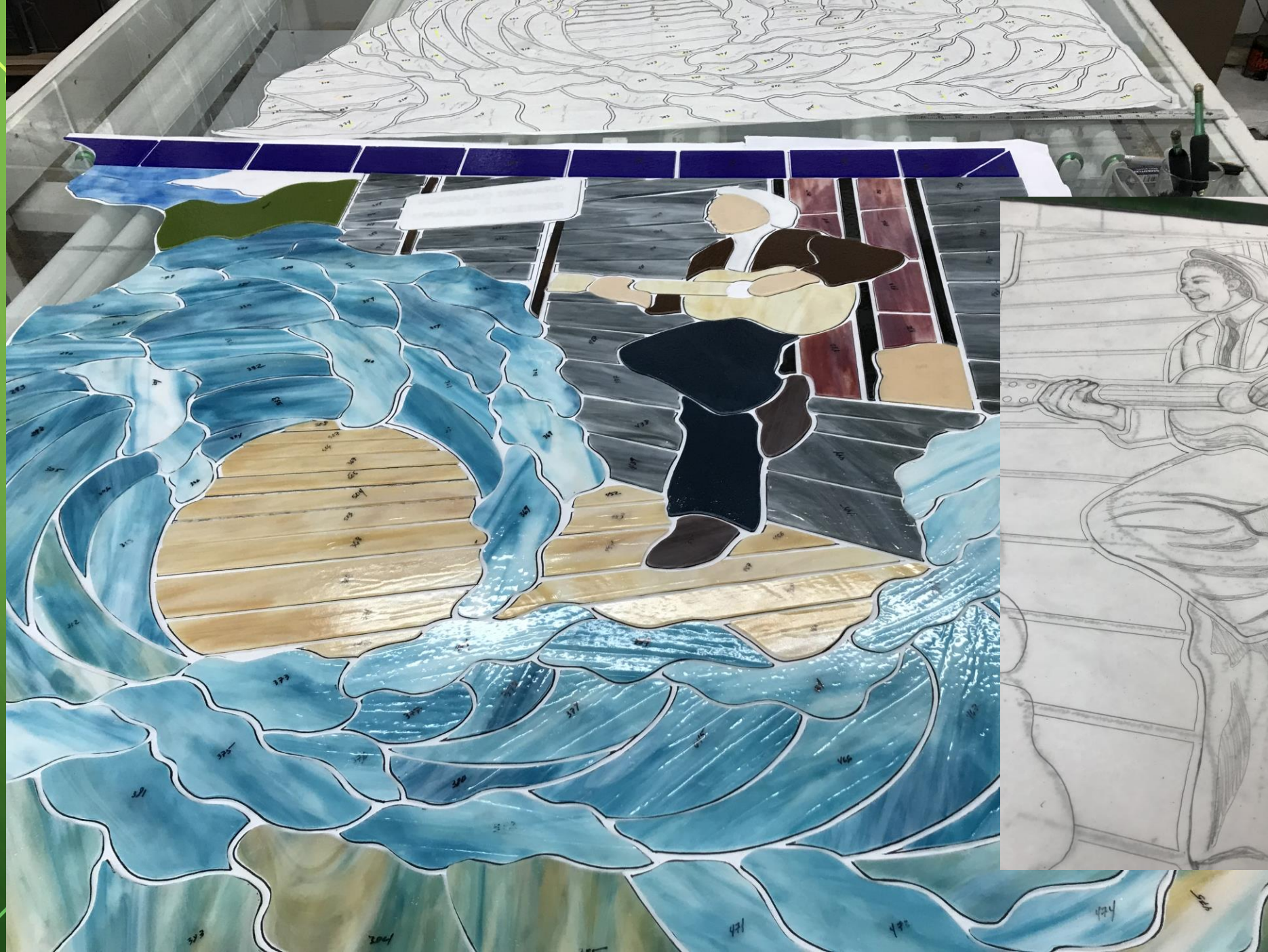


Pencil sketches of the exterior panels

CLOSE-UP OF THE CAMERA MAN

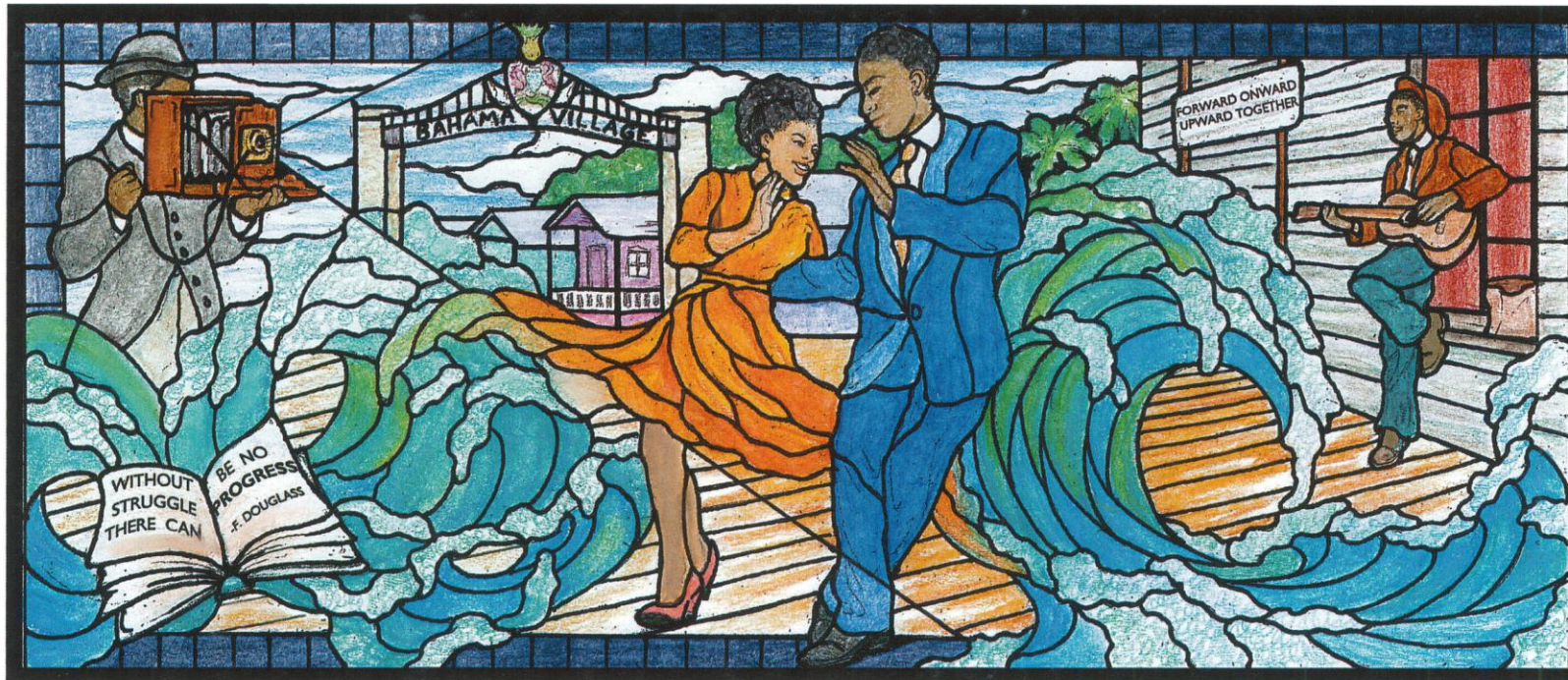


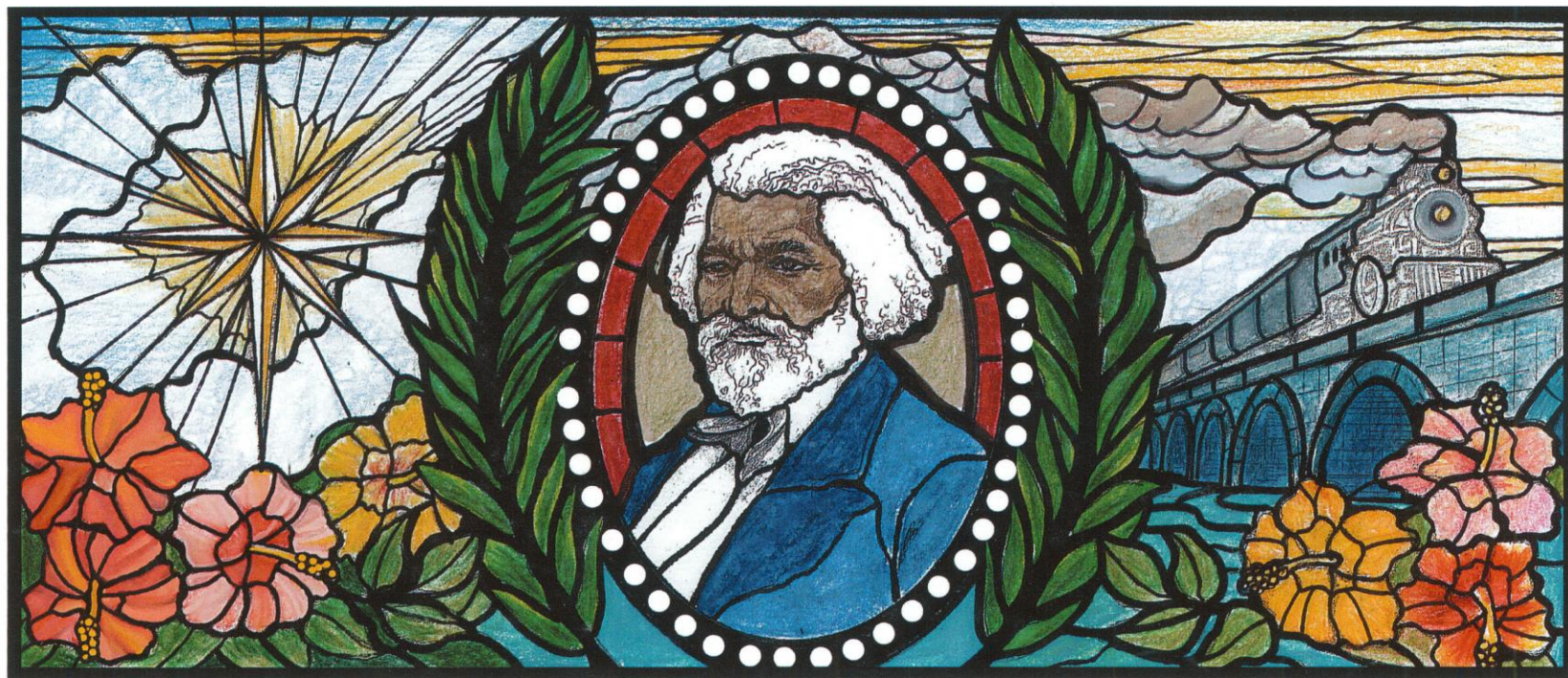
