STATEMENT OF PROBLEM

The City of Key West is an international destination known for myriad of activities attracting diverse populations to this small Island City, who may be unfamiliar with the local traffic flows and laws. This tropical destination, known as a preeminent pedestrian and bicycle friendly community, features daily fishing and water sports activities; notable historic amenities which are listed on the National Register of Historic Places including the Ernest Hemingway House, Audubon House, Little White House and the Eduardo Gato House; and a variety of other activities which are all accessible via walking or biking.

According to the FY2011 Highway Safety Matrix, the City of Key West is ranked #4 for pedestrian problems and #1 for bicycle problems among small sized cities within the State of Florida (Group 2). This low ranking demonstrates the need and supports the City's grant application which will assist in mitigating the number of pedestrian and bicycle injuries and fatalities.

PROPOSED SOLUTION

In an effort to solve this problem, the City of Key West Police Department will implement a two-fold effort which will include up to five 60- second safety videos to educate local residents and visitors of the pedestrian and bicycle laws and provide police overtime to support the much needed traffic education component.

The safety videos outlining pedestrian and bicycle laws and principles particular to the City of Key West traffic flow will assist the Police Department with public education outreach to local residents and the numerous visitors from around the globe who may be unfamiliar with a pedestrian dominated traffic flow. This safety videos will be featured on two television stations - the local government channel to target local residents and the tourist/visitors channel which will target the tourist population. The 60-second spots will provide safety tips and other essential information regarding laws and protocols to make Key West a safer place to live and visit. This public education outreach effort is also included in the Key West Bicycle Plan. The Key West Police Department will also increase traffic enforcement on high incident roadways in an effort to modify motorist, pedestrian and bicyclist behavior. This effort will include two Officers covering four hour shifts alternating between two days a week to three days a week for a total of 52 weeks. In addition, STAR operations will be in force for six hour shift for a total of 14 shifts per year. This will include one shift per month and twice monthly when special events within the City promote additional tourism.

OBJECTIVES

- 1) To produce up to five 60-second public safety videos featuring pedestrian and bicycle laws and traffic flows particular to Key West. With this public education outreach effort we hope to bring safety to the forefront of residents and visitors minds and thereby reduce overall pedestrian and bicycle injuries and crashes by 10%.
- 2) To significantly increase police traffic enforcement or high incident roadways thereby decreasing overall pedestrian and bicycle injuries and crashes by 25%.

EVALUTATION

Quarterly review of pedestrian and bicycle injuries and accidents will be used to determine the success of this program.
