With our CEI history beginning in Monroe County 34 years ago, we are excited to continue our relationship with the City of Key West and assist you in successfully delivering your CEI work program and providing excellent customer service to your residents. This team is committed to continuing to serve as an extension of the City, ensuring quality, responsive, and cost-effective services. Our team is focused on quality, experience on FEMA/ federally funded projects, local knowledge base, and multi-disciplined staff.

We have a long history of project successes throughout Florida and our ability to provide the following differentiators sets this team apart. Our Florida Keys CEI staff, comprised of Monroe County Residents who live and work here, make RS&H uniquely suited to meet the specific challenges associated with this type of work.



CEI Professional Qualifications

Our proposed team is not only working in the Florida Keys for the past 12 years, but lives here as well. As indicated in the staff location map in the Ability To Perform Services Expeditiously section, RS&H's Senior Project Engineer, Project Administrator, and Inspection Staff all reside within a few miles of Key West and can be on any project site within a matter of minutes. 4 Internal Peer Reviews

Internal Peer Review Quality Control (QC) / Quality Assurance (QA)

For each contract, RS&H establishes a rigorous quality control plan of which our team will develop, implement, and submit upon selection. Quality management personnel utilize an 18-page section of our SOP describing how projects are reviewed using a checklist tailored to each contract/task work order. This checklist includes over 45 pages of procedural queries based on contract documents, specs, CPAM, and guide-lists and will be submitted to the City within 30 days of notice to proceed.

This program will emphasize measurable performance goals and incorporate both management and inspection criteria. As part of our QA plan, we will meet with the City's Project Manager and management staff throughout the life of the contract. An in-depth project review will be performed with written results reported directly to the Construction Project Manager. Our approach to ensuring quality control, including an overview of our QA plan, is discussed in detail below.

FDOT Statewide Guide Lists will be the primary tool to ensure that the team follows Quality Control Guidelines. As part of our audit verification, RS&H will verify team members have the Statewide Guide Lists, are using them regularly in the inspection activities, and are familiar with the content.

Approach to Managing Quality

Our team of qualified professionals will monitor the contractor's operations to ensure compliance with the plans, specifications, and other contract documents. Detailed and accurate records of the contractor's operations will be recorded on approved forms. Our inspectors meet with the contractors and subcontractors prior to the end of each shift to ensure agreement and spot check the contractor on all work performed. This allows for items to be resolved quickly at the lowest possible level. RS&H will review all material test reports and Quality Control (QC) reports to verify compliance with the contract documents. RS&H will also confirm test results compare favorably to the verification test results and that all materials are being sampled in accordance with FDOT or contract sampling and testing procedures in addition to monitoring the contractor's QC processes.

RS&H's Senior Project Engineer Jacki Hart, PE and former FDOT Engineer Jason Trujillo, PE will perform peer reviews ensuring quality documentation by CEI staff for compliance to City, State and Federal standards. Below is a summary of this 18-page QA/QC SOP; a full QA/QC plan will be submitted upon selection.

- » **Purpose and Goal** - The entire purpose of the CEI contract is to provide for proper contract administration, engineering, and QA of the final finished product supplied to the City by the construction contractor. It is the goal of RS&H to ensure construction administration, inspection, testing, and record keeping functions are properly and consistently performed to the City and RS&H requirements and standards. The purpose of this CEI QA Plan is to provide for an effective means and method to meet that goal.
- » **Initial Reviews** - Upon notification of their appointment to a Peer Review Team for a new project, the two senior members will arrange for the first on site, peer review inspection of the CEI project staff to occur between the first and third months of the project.
- » **Subsequent Reviews** - If no major discrepancies are found during the first review of the project, a subsequent review inspection will take place approximately six months after the initial review and approximately every six months thereafter until project completion. At any time a major discrepancy is found, follow-up inspections will occur at approximately three-month intervals until corrected.
- » **Review of Sub-Consultant Activities** - The Peer Review Team will review sub-consultant activities in the same manner as it does those activities of RS&H personnel. Deficiencies will be brought to the attention of the Senior Project Engineer for resolution.
- » **Reports** - The Peer Review Team will make a report of their inspections. This report will evaluate the adequacy of materials, testing procedures, documentation, processes, training, supervision, and staffing to accomplish the requirements of the CEI contract. The report will also detail the Review Team's recommendations for any improvements in these areas. Lastly, the report findings will be provided to the client.

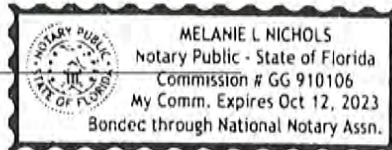



City Ordinance Sec. 2-799
Requirements for City Contractors to Provide Equal Benefits for Domestic Partners

(a) Definitions. For purposes of this section only, the following definitions shall apply:

- (1) **Benefits** means the following plan, program or policy provided or offered by a contractor to its employees as part of the employer's total compensation package: sick leave, bereavement leave, family medical leave, and health benefits.
- (2) **Bid** shall mean a competitive bid procedure established by the city through the issuance of an invitation to bid, request for proposals, request for qualifications, or request for letters of interest.
- (3) **Cash equivalent** means the amount of money paid to an employee with a domestic partner in lieu of providing benefits to the employee's domestic partner. The cash equivalent is equal to the employer's direct expense of providing benefits to an employee for his or her spouse.

The cash equivalents of the following benefits apply:

- a. For bereavement leave, cash payment for the number of days that would be allowed as paid time off for the death of a spouse. Cash payment would be in the form of the wages of the domestic partner employee for the number of days allowed.
 - b. For health benefits, the cost to the contractor of the contractor's share of the single monthly premiums that are being paid for the domestic partner employee, to be paid on a regular basis while the domestic partner employee maintains such insurance in force for himself or herself.
 - c. For family medical leave, cash payment for the number of days that would be allowed as time off for an employee to care for a spouse who has a serious health condition. Cash payment would be in the form of the wages of the domestic partner employee for the number of days allowed.
- (4) **Contract** means any written agreement, purchase order, standing order or similar instrument entered into pursuant to the award of a bid whereby the city is committed to expend or does expend funds in return for work, labor, professional services, consulting services, supplies, equipment, materials, construction, construction related services or any combination of the foregoing.
 - (5) **Contractor** means any person or persons, sole proprietorship, partnership, joint venture, corporation, or other form of doing business, that is awarded a bid and enters into a covered contract with the city, and which maintains five (5) or more full-time employees.
 - (6) **Covered contract** means a contract between the city and a contractor awarded subsequent to the date when this section becomes effective valued at over twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000).
 - (7) **Domestic partner** shall mean any two adults of the same or different sex, who have registered as domestic partners with a governmental body pursuant to state or local law authorizing such registration, or with an internal registry maintained by the employer of at least one of the domestic partners. A contractor may institute an internal registry to allow for the provision of equal benefits to employees with domestic partner who do not register their partnerships pursuant to a governmental body authorizing such registration, or who are located in a jurisdiction where no such governmental domestic partnership

registry exists. A contractor that institutes such registry shall not impose criteria for registration that are more stringent than those required for domestic partnership registration by the City of Key West pursuant to Chapter 38, Article V of the Key West Code of Ordinances.

- (8) **Equal benefits** mean the equality of benefits between employees with spouses and employees with domestic partners, and/or between spouses of employees and domestic partners of employees.

(b) Equal benefits requirements.

- (1) Except where otherwise exempt or prohibited by law, a Contractor awarded a covered contract pursuant to a bid process shall provide benefits to domestic partners of its employees on the same basis as it provides benefits to employees' spouses.
- (2) All bid requests for covered contracts which are issued on or after the effective date of this section shall include the requirement to provide equal benefits in the procurement specifications in accordance with this section.
- (3) The city shall not enter into any covered contract unless the contractor certifies that such contractor does not discriminate in the provision of benefits between employees with domestic partners and employees with spouses and/or between the domestic partners and spouses of such employees.
- (4) Such certification shall be in writing and shall be signed by an authorized officer of the contractor and delivered, along with a description of the contractor's employee benefits plan, to the city's procurement director prior to entering into such covered contract.
- (5) The city manager or his/her designee shall reject a contractor's certification of compliance if he/she determines that such contractor discriminates in the provision of benefits or if the city manager or designee determines that the certification was created, or is being used for evading the requirements of this section.
- (6) The contractor shall provide the city manager or his/her designee, access to its records for the purpose of audits and/or investigations to ascertain compliance with the provisions of this section, and upon request shall provide evidence that the contractor is in compliance with the provisions of this section upon each new bid, contract renewal, or when the city manager has received a complaint or has reason to believe the contractor may not be in compliance with the provisions of this section. This shall include but not be limited to providing the city manager or

his/her designee with certified copies of all of the contractor's records pertaining to its benefits policies and its employment policies and practices.

- (7) The contractor may not set up or use its contracting entity for the purpose of evading the requirements imposed by this section.

(c) Mandatory contract provisions pertaining to equal benefits. Unless otherwise exempt, every covered contract shall contain language that obligates the contractor to comply with the applicable provisions of this section. The language shall include provisions for the following:

- (1) During the performance of the covered contract, the contractor certifies and represents that it will comply with this section.
- (2) The failure of the contractor to comply with this section will be deemed to be a material breach of the covered contract.
- (3) If the contractor fails to comply with this section, the city may terminate the

covered contract and all monies due or to become due under the covered contract may be retained by the city. The city may also pursue any and all other remedies at law or in equity for any breach.

- (4) If the city manager or his designee determines that a contractor has set up or used its contracting entity for the purpose of evading the requirements of this section, the city may terminate the covered contract.

(d) Enforcement. If the contractor fails to comply with the provisions of this section:

- (1) The failure to comply may be deemed to be a material breach of the covered contract; or
- (2) The city may terminate the covered contract; or
- (3) Monies due or to become due under the covered contract may be retained by the city until compliance is achieved; or
- (4) The city may also pursue any and all other remedies at law or in equity for any breach;
- (5) Failure to comply with this section may also subject contractor to the procedures set forth in Division 5 of this article, entitled "Debarment of contractors from city work."

(e) Exceptions and waivers.

The provisions of this section shall not apply where:

- (1) The contractor does not provide benefits to employees' spouses.
- (2) The contractor is a religious organization, association, society or any non-profit charitable or educational institution or organization operated, supervised or controlled by or in conjunction with a religious organization, association or society.
- (3) The contractor is a governmental entity.
- (4) The sale or lease of city property.
- (5) The provision of this section would violate grant requirement, the laws, rules or regulations of federal or state law (for example, the acquisition services procured pursuant to Chapter 287.055, Florida Statutes known as the "Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act").
- (6) Provided that the contractor does not discriminate in the provision of benefits, a contractor may also comply with this section by providing an employee with the cash equivalent of such benefits, if the city manager or his/her designee determines that either:
 - a. The contractor has made a reasonable yet unsuccessful effort to provide equal benefits. The contractor shall provide the city manager or his/her designee with sufficient proof of such inability to provide such benefit or benefits which shall include the measures taken to provide such benefits or benefits and the cash equivalent proposed, along with its certificate of compliance, as is required under this section.
- (7) The city commission waives compliance of this section in the best interest of the city, including but not limited to the following circumstances:
 - a. The covered contract is necessary to respond to an emergency. b.

Where only one bid response is received.

- c. Where more than one bid response is received, but the bids demonstrate that none of the bidders can comply with the requirements of this section.


- (f) City's authority to cancel contract. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit the city's authority to cancel or terminate a contract, deny or withdraw approval to perform a subcontract or provide supplies, issue a non-responsibility finding, issue a non-responsiveness finding, deny a person or entity prequalification, or otherwise deny a person or entity city business.

- (g) Timing of application. This section shall be applicable only to covered contracts awarded pursuant to bids which are after the date when this section becomes effective.

City Ordinance Sec. 2-773. - Cone of silence.

- (a) *Definitions.* For purposes of this section, reference to one gender shall include the other, use of the plural shall include the singular, and use of the singular shall include the plural. The following definitions apply unless the context in which the word or phrase is used requires a different definition:
- (1) *Competitive solicitation* means a formal process by the City of Key West relating to the acquisition of goods or services, which process is intended to provide an equal and open opportunity to qualified persons and entities to be selected to provide the goods or services. Competitive solicitation shall include request for proposals ("RFP"), request for qualifications ("RFQ"), request for letters of interest ("RFLI"), invitation to bid ("ITB") or any other advertised solicitation.
 - (2) *Cone of silence* means a period of time during which there is a prohibition on communication regarding a particular competitive solicitation.
 - (3) *Evaluation or selection committee* means a group of persons appointed or designated by the city to evaluate, rank, select, or make a recommendation regarding a vendor or the vendor's response to the competitive solicitation. A member of such a committee shall be deemed a city official for the purposes of subsection (c) below.
 - (4) *Vendor* means a person or entity that has entered into or that desires to enter into a contract with the City of Key West or that seeks an award from the city to provide goods, perform a service, render an opinion or advice, or make a recommendation related to a competitive solicitation for compensation or other consideration.
 - (5) *Vendor's representative* means an owner, individual, employee, partner, officer, or member of the board of directors of a vendor, or a consultant, lobbyist, or actual or potential subcontractor or sub-consultant who acts at the behest of a vendor in communicating regarding a competitive solicitation.
- (b) *Prohibited communications.* A cone of silence shall be in effect during the course of a competitive solicitation and prohibit:
- (1) Any communication regarding a particular competitive solicitation between a potential vendor or vendor's representative and the city's administrative staff including, but not limited to, the city manager and his or her staff;
 - (2) Any communication regarding a particular competitive solicitation between a potential vendor or vendor's representative and the mayor, city commissioners, or their respective staff;
 - (3) Any communication regarding a particular competitive solicitation between a potential vendor or vendor's representative and any member of a city evaluation and/or selection committee therefore; and
 - (4) Any communication regarding a particular competitive solicitation between the mayor, city commissioners, or their respective staff, and a member of a city evaluation and/or selection committee therefore.
- (c) *Permitted communications.* Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing contained herein shall prohibit:
- (1) Communication between members of the public who are not vendors or a vendor's representative and any city employee, official or member of the city commission;
 - (2) Communications in writing at any time with any city employee, official or member of the city commission, unless specifically prohibited by the applicable competitive solicitation.
 - (A) However, any written communication must be filed with the city clerk. Any city employee, official or member of the city commission receiving or making any written communication must immediately file it with the city clerk.
 - (B) The city clerk shall include all written communication as part of the agenda item when publishing information related to a particular competitive solicitation;

- (3) Oral communications at duly noticed pre-bid conferences;
- (4) Oral presentations before publically noticed evaluation and/or selection committees;
- (5) Contract discussions during any duly noticed public meeting;
- (6) Public presentations made to the city commission or advisory body thereof during any duly noticed public meeting;
- (7) Contract negotiations with city staff following the award of a competitive solicitation by the city commission; or
- (8) Purchases exempt from the competitive process pursuant to section 2-797 of these Code of Ordinances;

(d) *Procedure.*

- (1) The cone of silence shall be imposed upon each competitive solicitation at the time of public notice of such solicitation as provided by section 2-826 of this Code. Public notice of the cone of silence shall be included in the notice of the competitive solicitation. The city manager shall issue a written notice of the release of each competitive solicitation to the affected departments, with a copy thereof to each commission member, and shall include in any public solicitation for goods and services a statement disclosing the requirements of this ordinance.
- (2) The cone of silence shall terminate at the time the city commission or other authorized body makes final award or gives final approval of a contract, rejects all bids or responses to the competitive solicitation, or takes other action which ends the competitive solicitation.
- (3) Any city employee, official or member of the city commission that is approached concerning a competitive solicitation while the cone of silence is in effect shall notify such individual of the prohibitions contained in this section. While the cone of silence is in effect, any city employee, official or member of the city commission who is the recipient of any oral communication by a potential vendor or vendor's representative in violation of this section shall create a written record of the event. The record shall indicate the date of such communication, the persons with whom such communication occurred, and a general summation of the communication.

(e) *Violations/penalties and procedures.*


- (1) A sworn complaint alleging a violation of this ordinance may be filed with the city attorney's office. In each such instance, an initial investigation shall be performed to determine the existence of a violation. If a violation is found to exist, the penalties and process shall be as provided in section 1-15 of this Code.
- (2) In addition to the penalties described herein and otherwise provided by law, a violation of this ordinance shall render the competitive solicitation void at the discretion of the city commission.
- (3) Any person who violates a provision of this section shall be prohibited from serving on a City of Key West advisory board, evaluation and/or selection committee.
- (4) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, violation of any provision of this ordinance by a City of Key West employee shall subject said employee to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal.
- (5) If a vendor is determined to have violated the provisions of this section on two more occasions it shall constitute evidence under City Code section 2-834 that the vendor is not properly qualified to carry out the obligations or to complete the work contemplated by any new competitive solicitation. The city's purchasing agent shall also commence any available debarment from city work proceeding that may be available upon a finding of two or more violations by a vendor of this section.
