



- Bid proposals received
 - KWFD Boat Lifts \$200K
- Spencer's Boat Yard Seawall Contractor has begun install of pile and on schedule.
- **Eaton Street Resurface and Drainage** City is continuing trench restoration with final paving in March and striping completion in April.
- South Street improvements Minor items to be completed by contractor as well as punch list resolution.
- Clinton Square Pocket Park Contractor has substantial completion and Park scheduled to open after signage and striping placement.
- John Jones Navigation Center HVAC units are set on roof in place and installed, Storm water drains and pipes installed, Wastewater pumpout station installed. Concrete poured under the building. Building painting is in process.
- Frederick Douglass Community Center Ribbon Cutting completed.
- Beach Restoration: Monitoring continues, no action levels met to date.
- Southernmost Point Plaza Progress has continued with design on the project with 100% design comments delivered back to BBC. Final TDC DAC 1 Phase 2 Grant approval documents received from the Monroe County BOCC in the amount of \$1,501,302.00
- Southernmost Point Seawall Repair Design 100%. IFB is ready to advertise in March.

- MLK Pool Quarterly Structural assessment are scheduled. The structure has a few items needing attention by or before September 2025 to maintain operation. The next Assessment is scheduled for March.
- Bayview Working with Community Services to phase work and begin improvements with funds available leaving future expansion options open.
- FDEP PCPP Agreement Fully executed document and assignment of project to State coordinator was accomplished. FDEP has reached out to the Agency Term Contractor (ATC) for scheduling the work required for closure.
- Welcome Sign Conceptual Design was rejected by FDOT. Developing compliant design for resubmission in March.
