-- Eddie Woods Arrest Narrative:

On 7/22/23, at approximately 1600 hours, I (Sgt. M. Siracuse) was on patrol in my marked KWPD patrol vehicle equipped with emergency lights and a siren. I was parked in the parking lot of Advanced Auto (1st and Flagler), facing the Limetree food store.

I was watching Limetree in an attempt to identify subjects who are wanted in connection to several recent burglaries. While sitting stationary. I observed a white female on her cell phone walking around in the parking lot of the laundromat adjacent to the Limetree (1834 Flagler Ave). A black male, later identified as Eddie Woods (9/28/87), arrived traveling northbound on a black bicycle. Woods and the unknown female met, and began looking at my patrol vehicle over and over as if nervous. The female then mounted Woods' bicycle and began riding on the crossbar of its frame, in violation of F.S.S. 316.2065(3)(a).

I pulled out of the parking lot and began traveling southbound on George Street, as this was the last direction I saw them riding. Once on George Street, I continued south as the bicycle was moving at a high rate of speed with both occupants. Woods turned eastbound on Atlantic Blvd. and I caught up to him at the intersection of George and Atlantic. At that intersection, Woods had already dismounted the bicycle and now the female was beginning to ride it northbound on George Street. I activated my emergency lights in an attempt to initiate a traffic stop on Woods for his unsafe operation and violation of Florida bicycle law. At this point the couple had just separated.

As I began to exit my patrol vehicle, Woods was already backing up and taking off his "slides" or sandals, indicating he was about to run. Woods turned and began running westbound on Atlantic Blvd. I got back into my vehicle and began pursuing Woods as he ran Westbound. At the intersection of Ashby and Atlantic I exited my patrol vehicle and began chasing Woods on foot. I gave Woods several clear, loud, verbal commands to stop running. Woods ignored my commands and ran another 1/2 block, jumping a fence into the yard of 1615 Atlantic Blvd. This is a single family home with a concrete fence and iron gates. I deployed my taser and discharged two cartridges as Woods proceeded through the back yard of the residence.

Only one prong successfully struck Woods in his right buttocks. Woods continued through the back yard and over the westbound gate toward the driveway of the residence. Woods fell over the gate and landed on his stomach, then turned on his side. I jumped the gate and delivered drive stuns to Woods' back and side to complete the taser cycle and accomplish NMI. Woods finally complied with my orders and laid on his stomach. I placed Woods in handcuffs and additional officers arrived on scene to assist.

Ofc. Medina removed items from Woods' person, including a small bag of white (FTP by Ofc. Leahy) crack cocaine. Ofc. L. Hernandez later placed Woods' property and the cocaine (1.1grams) into the KWPD Property and Evidence section. Ofc. Agleev removed the one taser probe from Woods' buttocks.

Officers Medina and Agleev assisted in transporting Woods` via ambulance to the LKMC for medical clearance due to a high heart rate. Once medically cleared, Woods was transported to the Monroe County Detention Center. (See supplemental reports).

Woods also had an active arrest warrant reference fleeing and eluding (KWPD Case # 23-4027), signed on 7/14/23 by Judge M. Wilson with a \$100,000 dollar bond. I completed an additional arrest affidavit under that case number and provided it to intake at the jail for processing.

Once at the jail I met with Woods again and informed him I had to "switch hats" for a bit to discuss the use of force incident report as an administrative matter. This was due to me being the only supervisor on duty. Woods` understood and told me his side hurt. I took photographs of Woods, who sustained minor injuries (scrapes and abrasions) to his extremities. Woods had already been cleared by KW Fire Rescue, the LKMC, and the intake nurse. I was unable to locate a prong entry site or signature marks from the use of the TASER, however I photographed those areas anyway. Woods appeared to me emotionally/mentally disturbed and possibly under the influence of narcotics. Woods repetitively told me I had "shot" him numerous times and he was "done". Woods had an elevated heart rate consistent with narcotics use throughout the incident.

On July 22nd, 2023, I Officer Gustavo Medina was on patrol driving. I heard a radio traffic from my on duty Supervisor Sergeant M. Siracuse. He stated on radio that a black male wearing a tank top and black shorts began running from him. Shortly afterwards Sergeant Siracuse indicated he was across the condominiums on Atlantic Blvd by the nature preserve.

I immediately drove down Atlantic Blvd and observed Sergeant M. Siracuse detaining a black male (later identified as Eddie Woods) on the residential property at 1615 Atlantic Blvd. Woods was on his stomach being handcuffed. While Sergeant SIracuse was placing Woods in handcuffs. I then crossed Woods legs, to refrain Woods from further resisting Sergeant SIracuse's lawful orders and handcuffing. I noticed Tazer probes and string in the area of Woods being detained.

Officer Agleev arrived on scene and I requested that Officer Agleev go into my patrol vehicle and retrieve my BWC (device was charging inside my vehicle), before I began searching Woods person. Officer Agleev handed me my BWC. While searching Woods I discovered in his right bottom (cargo pocket-cargo shorts) pocket a credit card, a few dollar bills, and a clear plastic "baggie" containing a white powdery substance consistent with my training and experience as narcotics.

Additional Officers arrive on scene (Officer Leo Hernandez and Officer Leahy). I provided Officer Hernandez with the clear plastic baggie containing white powdery substance to be field tested for narcotics. It was later determined by the test to be positive for Cocaine.

During my time watching Woods I provided him with water given to me by Officer Leahy. I also radioed in for rescue to come to check on Woods well-being and vitals due to him being tazed. During my observation it was spontaneously uttered and implied by Woods that he was aware of the warrant he had and that he ran, because of the warrant and not for the narcotics on his person. Please view body camera footage in its entirety for full statements and response from Woods. Woods was eventually placed on a stretcher and placed into the Ambulance after being treated on scene by Paramedics. I rode with Paramedics in the Ambulance to Lower Keys Medical Center where Woods received further care and treatment.

I was then later picked up by an Officer at the ER to be brought back to my patrol vehicle on Atlantic Blvd. Officer Agleev stayed and relieved my position with Woods at the ER.

I had no further involvement. Woods was arrested for his original warrant charges and additional charges he violated with his encounter with Sergeant M. Siracuse.///END OF REPORT///

On July 22, 2023, at approximately 1600 hours I, Officer Agleev, responded to 1600 block of Atlantic Boulevard, to assist with the apprehension of a fleeing subject.

Upon arrival I observed Sergeant Siracuse and Officer Medina holding down a black male, later identified as Eddie Woods (DOB 09/28/1987, Arrestee). They were in the yard of a house at 1615 Atlantic Boulevard, where Woods ran into. Woods had been tazed during foot pursuit, and was already handcuffed behind his back, prior to my arrival.

During the search of Woods' person, Officer Medina found a clear baggy, containing rocky white substance (FTP cocaine).

Rescue responded to scene and had to transport Woods to the Lower Keys Medical Center, reference elevated heart rate. Officer Medina rode with Rescue, I followed Rescue in my patrol vehicle.

After Woods was medically cleared, I transported him to the Monroe County Detention Center. Sergeant Siracuse delivered the Arrest Affidavit shortly after.

My BWC and Fleet in Car were activated and uploaded to Axon Evidence.

On Saturday July 22, 2023, at about 1606 hours, I, (Ofc. L. Hernandez), was dispatched to the 1600 Block of Atlantic Boulevard, to assist Sgt. Mark Siracuse who was on a foot pursuit of a fleeing wanted male subject.

On arrival, Sgt. M. Siracuse, Ofc. Brian Leahy, Ofc. Gustavo Medina and Ofc. Dennis Agleev had the male in custody. The male was later identified as Eddie Woods (DOB 09/28/1987). Woods had the following items in his possession during his arrest:

- " 1.1 grams of white, chunky substance FTP for crack cocaine (Labeled sent to lab)
- " \$ 104.00 US Dollars in the denomination of four \$1.00 and one \$100 bill (Labeled return to owner)
- " 4 credit cards (Labeled return to owner)
- " Key West baseball cap white / red in color (Labeled returned to owner)

I collected these items and packaged them. The items were placed into our Evidence and Property Division. The white, chunky substance that FTP for crack cocaine was processed to be sent to the FDL lab for testing and labeled as such with the required FDL Request for Examination of Physical Evidence Form.

I also packaged the taser cartridges that were deployed from Sgt. M. Siracuse's agency issued taser when he tased Woods due to his active resistance. Cartridges were placed into our Evidence and Property Division as evidence.

This concludes my involvement with this case.

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
