Key West Water Quality Improvement Plan Progress Update January 2025

Background:

One of the goals of the Key West Forward Strategic Plan is to improve the cleanliness of our near shore waters. To that end, the then Sustainability Coordinator convened a working group of water quality experts from five entities (Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary, University of Florida / Monroe County Extension Service, Monroe County Marine Resources and College of the Florida Keys). The Team reviewed related priorities and goals across 3 Plans and 8 Programs and helped the City identify our final priorities, resulting in the Key West Water Quality Improvement Plan (KW-WQIP)

The KW-WQIP contains 11 Goals, and 38 actions ranked by benefit, effort, cost and ultimate effectiveness on nearshore water quality. The draft plan was presented to City Commission on August 16, 2003, and the Year 1 implementation plan budget was presented during a Commission Budget Workshop on July 16 2024. The FY25 budget included \$127,125 for Water Quality Monitoring, \$100,000 for Coral Reef Restoration, and 125,000 for KW-WQIP implementation (25K in supplies, 75L in professional services).

FY25 Implementation:

The operational planning effort added Mote Marine and Reef Relief to the Team and prioritized a list of year 1 actions, summarized below:

- #4) Better trash cans near ocean
 - Partner with Monroe County in identifying bulk buy of new cans.
- #5) Upload marina/landfill data to public database
 - Continue partnership with FDEP to upload historical data
- #8) Create Keyswide team to create CEC gameplan:
 - Convene Sanctuary Water Quality Protection Program and Technical Advisory Committee to weigh in on which CEC's we should be most concerned with.
- #9) Work with FDEP to ensure all new WQ data can be utilized in the State public database
