-- Brittany Leighanna Smith Arrest Narrative:

On 05/07/2025, I (Det. C. Bozzetti) was on routine patrol in the city of Key West, FL. At approximately 19:01 hours, I observed a white Kia sedan, bearing FL plate RVXX81, fail to come to a complete stop behind the clearly visible, solid white stop bar, at the intersection of Staples Avenue and 10th Street. MCSO K-9 Det. Aaron Roddy was also on duty and advised me that he saw the same vehicle illegally parked on 12th Street near Staples Avenue just moments before I witnessed the stop bar violation.

After the vehicle's second traffic infraction, it made a left turn onto 10th Street and began traveling towards Flagler Avenue. I got behind the vehicle and activated my vehicle's emergency lights and siren, initiating a traffic stop. The vehicle slowly approached Flagler Avenue but would not pull over. I continued following directly behind the vehicle with my lights and siren activated. The vehicle made a right onto Flagler Avenue and eventually came to a complete stop in the parking lot of "Grace Lutheran School" (2713 Flagler Avenue).

I approached the driver of the vehicle and immediately recognized her as Brittany Smith (DOB 05/229/91) from multiple prior law enforcement interactions. I asked Smith for her Driver License, vehicle registration, and proof of insurance. Smith appeared extremely nervous and stated that she did not have her DL because the vehicle belonged to her friend. I asked for the other two documents again, but she was also unable to provide those.

MCSO K-9 Det. Roddy and Det. C. Curry arrived as backup moments later. I instructed Smith to turn off and exit the vehicle. She verbally acknowledged my instructions; however, she continued fumbling around with miscellaneous items in the vehicle, failing to follow my direction. I advised her a second time to turn off and exit the vehicle. Smith continued to filibuster inside the vehicle, ignoring my instruction once more. Moments later she quickly put the vehicle in drive, peeled out of the parking lot at a high rate of speed onto Flagler Avenue, and fled West toward 5th Street. I got into my vehicle and attempted to follow Smith in a routine manner, but did not engage in a pursuit. I was advised by anonymous citizens that Smith turned right onto 5th Street. I canvassed the area around 5th Street and Flagler Avenue but was unable not locate Smith or the vehicle at that time.

A short time later, KWPD Dispatch advised over the radio that a vehicle matching the description of Smith's was seen striking multiple parked cars near the 2400 block of Seidenberg Avenue. KWPD Dispatch then advised that a white female was seen abandoning the now damaged vehicle and fleeing on foot. I responded to the area along with numerous other patrol officers. A perimeter was formed around the area that Smith was last seen by the reporting party. Officers and Detectives on scene canvassed the area, but Smith was not located. Dispatch also advised that Smith had multiple active arrest warrants.

I then responded to the location of the abandoned and damaged vehicle, which was in the grass on the corner of 6th Street and Seidenberg Avenue. Det. Sgt. Conaty and Lt. Stockton were also out with the vehicle. Det. Sgt. Conaty and I completed an inventory search of the vehicle, prior to it being towed from the scene. During the inventory search I found a small blue metal container located on the center console of the vehicle. It was in plain view and would have been very visible for the driver of the vehicle. Inside the container were numerous pink circular pills with the marking "e 344" on one side, and two perpendicular lines on the other side which divided the pill into quarters. I took possession of the pills and returned to my vehicle, which was located at 7th Street and Harris Avenue. The pills were later packaged and processed by Det. Sgt. Conaty at a secure location. He advised me that the pills were identified as 20 mg Amphetamine and Dextroamphetamine (Adderall) by Poison Control (Operator: Carolina, #: M3719377) and weighed 5.7 grams.

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Ofc. Lopez completed traffic crash reports for all known vehicles that were hit and damaged by Smith's vehicle during her high speed, reckless, attempt to flee from law enforcement.

I got into my vehicle and began driving west on Harris Avenue toward 6th Street. While traveling west on Harris Avenue I noticed a pink Taxicab SUV traveling towards me. MCSO K-9 Det. Roddy and Det. Curry were directly behind it in their unmarked vehicle. The Taxi stopped in the middle of the 2400 block of Harris Avenue. Det. Roddy and Det. Curry quickly exited their vehicle and advised me that they just saw two suspicious people get into the Taxi. I approached the vehicle which with my department issued taser drawn and saw Smith in the rear passenger area of the vehicle, crouched down on the floorboard, attempting to hide. I advised Det. Curry that Smith was in the vehicle, and he quickly removed her and placed her under arrest without further incident.

I then turned my attention to the rear driver side passenger and immediately recognized him as Thomas "TED" Dixon. Dixon has an extensive criminal history to include robbery, and numerous narcotic trafficking charges, amongst other felonies. I ordered him out of the vehicle and instructed him to lay down on the ground and place his hands behind his back. He complied and I placed him in handcuffs pending further investigation. The front passenger, Russel Boscamp, was also known to me from previous law enforcement interaction and was also detained. The driver of the Taxi, later identified as Steven Mellette, was removed from the vehicle as well.

After I detained Dixon, I helped him to his feet and escorted him to the side of the road. While escorting him to the side of the road he began spontaneously telling me that he was just trying to help Smith, and that she called him saying she just fled from the police and was hiding and needed help getting out of the area. He said he called his friend Steve to pick her up in his taxi and get her out of the area. Shortly after Dixon's impulsive admission of trying to assist Smith in her effort to flee from law enforcement, I read him his Miranda Warning. Dixon advised that he understood his rights and was willing to talk to me. He then explained the entire situation to me in depth and detailed everyone's role in the incident. Dixon's account of the entire incident is as follows:

Dixon stated he received a phone call from his girlfriend Smith. Smith told him she was in trouble and needed help. She told him that she got stopped by the police while driving and fled from the traffic stop. She told him she abandoned the car and was hiding behind a church (Fifth St Baptist Church, 1311 Fifth St) and needed him to help here get out of the area. He said he agreed to help her and called his friend Steven who is a taxicab driver. He stated Steven agreed to pick her up. He said that Steven went to Smith's location, but we still had the perimeter set up, and he was unable to get her due to our presence in the area. Dixon said that Steven left the area and picked him up so that he could go to Smith's location and see for himself. Dixon got in the cab and Steve began driving back to Smith. On the way Dixon said that Boscamp called him and told him Smith could hide out at his house a few blocks away if she could make it there. Dixon told him that wasn't a possibility. Dixon said they picked up Boscamp on the way back to Smith, so that he could help them get her out of the area. Dixon said that once they got back to the church Smith was hiding behind, Boscamp got out and retrieved Smith. Boscamp and Smith returned to the cab and got inside. They attempted to leave the area but were spotted moments later by us, he stated. He also stated that Smith told him about ditching the vehicle and about the cars that she crashed into while fleeing. He also allowed me to look at the recent calls on his phone so that I could document the phone calls between all 4 parties involved. My entire conversation with Dixon was captured on my BWC.

Dixon is also out on probation for his most recent narcotics sale conviction. He talked to me about his plan after first appearance for the charges in this case. He stated once he gets a bond he is going to bond out before his violation of probation warrant is issued and try to make some money. He stated he plans to be on the run for a while

until he makes enough money and then he would turn himself in. He also stated that he sells drugs and has been doing so for years. He also appeared very proud of how he can sell drugs without being caught or having any encounters with law enforcement. Dixon made it clear to me that he plans to bond out quickly on these new charges and then continue selling drugs to make money. Only after he was content with the amount of money he has made, would he turn himself in and deal with his probation violation.

After my conversation with Dixon, I briefly spoke with Smith. Det. Sgt. Conaty advised that he already read her Miranda and spoke with her. He told me that Smith stated the following to him:

Smith said that she takes Adderall but does not have a prescription for it. She said she knew about the pink pills in the blue container which were in the vehicle she was driving. She also stated that she believed she struck about 6 or 7 cars before abandoning the vehicle. Smith also had a small wallet in her possession which was searched incident to arrest and contained 0.5 grams of a green leafy substance, which later field-tested positive (FTP) for marijuana.

Boscamp was uncooperative for most of the incident. While I was speaking with Dixon, Boscamp became very loud and was screaming at Ofc. Howell. I was later advised that Boscamp was escorted to the ground by Ofc. Howell for failing to comply with his lawful orders to remain seated.

All three subjects were eventually transported to the MCDC without incident.

Based on the facts and evidence gathered, I believe probable cause exists for the following charges:

- Fleeing and Eluding, F.S.S. 316.1935-3a
- Possession of Controlled Substance, F.S.S. 893.13-6a
- Unlawful use of two-way device, F.S.S. 934.215
- Resisting w/o Violence, F.S.S. 843.02
- Under 20 grams marijuana, F.S.S. 893.13-6b
- Possession of paraphernalia, F.S.S. 893.147-2

Since Dixon knew Smith committed a felony and was wanted on multiple felony warrants, and willfully attempted to assist her in evading capture by law enforcement, and used his cell phone to communicate and coordinate the execution of aiding Smith in her attempt to flee from law enforcement, he violated the following F.S.S.'s:

- Unlawful use of two-way device, F.S.S. 934.215
- Accessory after the fact, F.S.S. 777.03

Bozzetti conducted a traffic stop near 2713 Flagler Avenue and the driver, identified by her Florida driver's license as Brittany L. Smith (DOB: 05/29/1991, Arrestee), fled the scene, driving away.

I was returning to the city, as I had just left Monroe County Detention Center, and staged at the Triangle in an attempt to prohibit Smith from leaving the city. Shortly after, Key West Communications Channel One notified us that a subject matching Smith's description had possibly been involved in a crash and ran, on foot, from that scene.

As I approached the scene, I noticed a white Kia four door sedan, with the engine still running, sitting on the side of street near the intersection of Sixth Street and Seidenberg Avenue. I Kia sedan had extensive damage to the front and both sides as though it was involved in several crashes.

At this point, witnesses explained that a subject matching Smith's description fled from the crash scene, heading west bound on Seidenberg Avenue. I and several other officers, setup a perimeter, and searched the immediate neighborhood but were unable to locate Smith.

Shortly after we received the order to shut down the perimeter, Det. Bozzetti notified Key West Communications Channel One that Smith, and two other subjects later identified as Thomas E. Dixon (DOB: 12/22/1973, Arrestee) and Russell W. Boscamp (DOB: 06/19/1996, Arrestee), had just been taken into custody on Harris Avenue between Sixth Street and Seventh Street. As arrived to the scene, two unidentified Monroe County Sheriff Deputies and Det. Bozzetti had all three subjects handcuffed and separated. Shortly after my arrival, we had all three subjects sit down, straighten their legs, and cross their ankles to prohibit any further fleeing. I assisted with observation of the subjects as they were separated further and interviewed individually. As Det. Bozzetti and Sgt. Conaty were conducting an interview of Dixon and Smith, Boscamp asked if he could stand up several times. I instructed Boscamp to stay seated and not to stand. I clearly and concisely explained to Boscamp that he could not stand. Boscamp ignored me, becoming frustrated, and yelled "fuck you" while quickly standing to his feet. Due to Boscamp's actions and rising level of resistance and taking into consideration the totality of circumstances in which Boscamp's acquaintance had just fled from law enforcement; to prohibit Boscamp from attempting to flee on foot, I performed a modified leg sweep and guided Boscamp back to the ground in a controlled manner. Boscamp landed in a seated position and immediately became more agitated, yelling and screaming obscenities toward me and the other officers on scene. Boscamp had no apparent and/or visible injuries due to his actions. Boscamp initially screamed that I "kicked" him but could not explain if he was injured. Boscamp eventually apologized for his actions, admitted he was mistaken, and stated he was not injured several times.

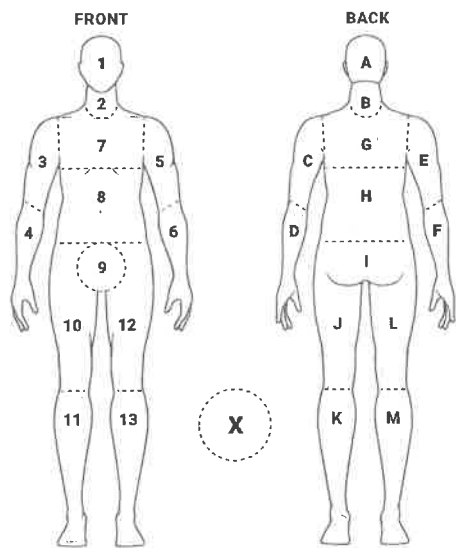

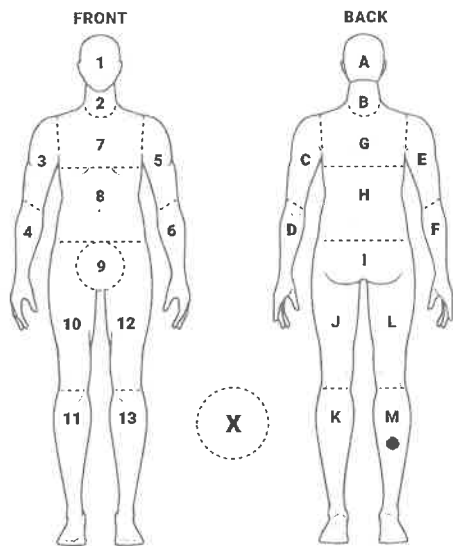

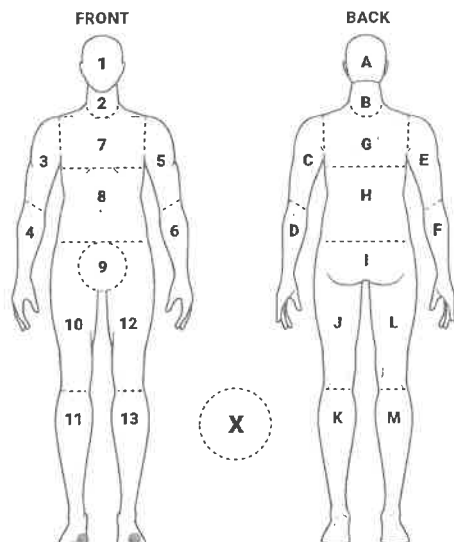
