AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 22 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES ENTITLED "CEMETERIES" BY REPEALING SECTION 22-11 - "FIREARMS"; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Key West City Commission finds that section 790, Florida Statutes, which addresses ownership, possession, storage and transportation of firearms, preempts section 22-11 of the Key West Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Key West City Commission finds that amending Chapter 22, to repeal section 22-11 would serve to promote the welfare of the citizens of Key West;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That Section 22-11 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed.

22-11 Firearms.

No firearms shall be permitted within the cemetery except with permission from the management; provided, however, that a police officer on duty may carry a firearm into the cemetery. Honor guard rifle teams for military or law enforcement burials are exempt from this regulation

Section 2: If any section, provision, clause,
phrase, or application of this Ordinance is held invalid or
unconstitutional for any reason by any court of competent
jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance
shall be deemed severable therefrom and shall be construed
as reasonable and necessary to achieve the lawful purposes
of this Ordinance.
Section 3: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances
of said City in conflict with the provisions of this
Ordinance are hereby superseded to the extent of such
conflict.
Section 4: This Ordinance shall go into effect
immediately, upon its passage and adoption and
authentication by the signature of the presiding officer
and the Clerk of the Commission.
