





NARRATIVE OF INCIDENT

Investigation (continued)

Investigation Details

On 1/4/2026, at approximately 0044 hours, I (Sergeant Waite) received notification from Ofc. Andrade that he was on a traffic stop and a passenger (later identified as Megan Holloway) was requesting to speak with a supervisor.

Sgt. Miller and I arrived at the traffic stop at approximately 0052 hours. Ofc. Andrade and Ofc. Osborne provided the following summary:

Ofc. Osborne explained he stopped a black Toyota pickup truck for failure to signal. Ofc. Osborne advised he made contact with the driver (Dontrell Holloway) and the front seat passenger, Dontrell's wife (Megan Holloway). Ofc. Osborne stated Dontrell became confrontational as he explained the reason for the stop, arguing that he did not have to signal to change lanes. Ofc. Osborne then advised Megan became confrontational when he asked for her ID because she was not wearing a seatbelt. Ofc. Osborne stated Megan called him a "dick," at which point Dontrell asked Megan to calm down.

Ofc. Andrade explained to me that he had stopped Dontrell one evening prior and Dontrell was also confrontational during that encounter. Ofc. Andrade stated he and Dontrell eventually had a positive conversation during that stop regarding his demeanor, and Dontrell had responded well to the advice. Ofc. Andrade advised that when he arrived as backup for Ofc. Osborne, he recognized the vehicle and was surprised to learn Dontrell had again become confrontational.

Ofc. Andrade and Ofc. Osborne stated they approached the driver's side of the vehicle and Ofc. Osborne asked Dontrell to step outside. Both officers stated Dontrell became argumentative and had to be instructed to exit the vehicle multiple times before complying.

Ofc. Andrade said he asked Dontrell if he remembered him; Dontrell initially stated he did not. Both officers stated that when Dontrell stepped out of the vehicle, he stepped within inches of Ofc. Andrade's face in a confrontational manner and stated he did, in fact, remember him. Based upon this aggressive demeanor, Ofc. Osborne grabbed Dontrell and intentionally grounded him to limit his movement and prevent him from getting any closer to Ofc. Andrade.

Both officers advised Dontrell was placed in handcuffs, at which point Megan informed them Dontrell was a Type 1 diabetic and his blood sugar was critically low. Ofc. Andrade stated he asked Dontrell if he needed medical attention, and Dontrell stated he does not answer questions from the police.

[INTERVIEW OF DONTRELL HOLLOWAY]

Below is a summary of the interviews. It is not intended to be a verbatim account and does not memorialize all statements made. Communications were electronically recorded; the recording captures the actual words spoken.

After speaking with the officers, I spoke with Dontrell and Megan.

I first spoke with Dontrell. It should be noted that Dontrell and I have known each other personally since we were approximately six years old; we played youth baseball and attended school together. Because of this, I was already aware that he is a Type 1 diabetic. Dontrell is also aware that my daughter is a Type 1 diabetic. Based on Megan's statement that his blood sugar was critically low, I immediately asked Dontrell what his current level was. He stated that prior to the stop it was 60 and dropping, so he and Megan left their home to purchase food.

Dontrell claimed Ofc. Osborne approached the vehicle in a confrontational manner. Dontrell also stated Ofc. Osborne asked him, "What are you on?" in an accusatory tone.

Dontrell stated that when Ofc. Osborne returned to the vehicle and asked him to exit, he did not immediately comply due to concerns for his safety. Dontrell said when he did exit the vehicle, he was immediately taken to the ground and handcuffed. I asked Dontrell if this was in response to his actions; he stated he stepped out of the vehicle as requested and may have stared into Ofc. Andrade's eyes, but maintained he was not confrontational.

Dontrell did not have, or complain of injuries. Photographs of Dontrell have been uploaded to evidence.com.

[INTERVIEW OF MEGAN HOLLOWAY]

After speaking with Dontrell, I spoke to Megan. Megan stated Ofc. Osborne approached the vehicle in a confrontational manner. Megan emphasized the fact that Ofc. Osborne asked Dontrell to exit the vehicle and the officers immediately took him to the ground. Throughout our conversation, Megan repeatedly stated Dontrell was experiencing a medical emergency due to low blood sugar and advised his behavior changes when his sugar is low—despite also stating that Dontrell remained compliant with the officers. Megan also stated she told officers several times that Dontrell was diabetic before they called for rescue.

[BWC REVIEW]

Contrary to Dontrell and Megan's recollection, Body Worn Camera (BWC) footage shows Dontrell immediately becoming confrontational with Ofc. Osborne during the initial explanation of the stop. After Ofc. Osborne asked for Megan's ID (regarding a seatbelt violation), she stated something to the effect of, "You don't have to be a dick." Dontrell then turned toward Megan and appeared to tell her to calm down.

Based on my observations, Ofc. Osborne remained professional while gathering documentation and returning to his patrol vehicle. While running the subjects' information, K9 Ofc. Anglin and Ofc. Andrade arrived.

Investigation (continued)

Investigation Details

The BWC footage shows Ofc. Osborne approaching the vehicle and asking both occupants to exit. Dontrell refused or questioned numerous lawful commands before complying. The footage from both Ofc. Andrade and Ofc. Osborne shows Dontrell exiting the vehicle in a confrontational manner and stepping within inches of Ofc. Andrade's face while stating he remembered him.

Based on the escalation of aggression, Ofc. Osborne grabbed Dontrell's upper torso and took him to the ground in a controlled manner. Dontrell was subsequently handcuffed. After being handcuffed, Megan informed officers of Dontrell's diabetes. Officers immediately asked Dontrell if he wanted to be evaluated by rescue; Dontrell responded by stating he does not answer questions from law enforcement.

Despite his response, officers requested EMS at 0107 hours. EMS arrived at 0110 hours and cleared the call at 0118 hours, citing "no medical need."

[DISPOSITION]

Ofc. Osborne ultimately issued Dontrell a traffic citation and released him, rather than arresting him for resisting without violence, for which there was clear probable cause. Megan expressed dissatisfaction with this resolution before she and Dontrell left the scene.
