for the design-build of Sidewalk Enhancements Phase IV

ACTION STATEMENT:

This resolution will approve the low bid of \$165,550 (Virginia Street); \$31,530 (Applerouth Lane) from Charley Toppino and Sons, Inc. upon notice of concurrence of Intent to Award by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to design and build new Federal ADA compliant sidewalks and curb ramps as part of the design-build project for Sidewalk Enhancements Phase IV.

The design and construction for each project location will be reimbursed 100% through an FDOT Local Area Program (LAP) grant not to exceed the following grant constraints for design/construction: \$204,000 (Virginia Street); \$26,520 (Applerouth Lane). These grants are funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, commonly referred to as stimulus funding.

BACKGROUND:

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 was signed by President Obama on February 17, 2009. The ARRA is an unprecedented effort to jumpstart our economy, create or save millions of jobs, and put a down payment on addressing long-neglected challenges so that our country can thrive in the 21st century. This legislation will pay for needed transportation improvements while providing jobs and other economic benefits. The City has been actively seeking these funds to assist our local economy and to improve local infrastructure. We were able to obtain funding for thirteen Sidewalk Enhancement projects through this federal legislation.

For this Contract, the City has established alternate scopes of work, shown as the list of bid items under each of the Scope Alternates listed in the Request Key to the Caribbean – Average yearly temperature 77° F.



for Proposal. These alternates have been established in consideration of budget constraints. The City has assigned Contract award priority for the Scope Alternates as follows:

First PriorityAlternate A Second PriorityAlternate B

The City intends to award the Contract to the responsible bidder with the lowest bid for the highest priority Scope Alternate for which the City determines funds are available. For the purpose of bidding, the City has established a maximum budget as follows:

Virginia Street Sidewalks \$204,000.00 Applerouth Lane \$26,520.00

Although many firms attended the mandatory pre-bid meeting, only one bid was received at bid opening.

PURPOSE AND JUSTIFICATION:

Many areas throughout the City are in need of sidewalk and ADA improvements. Stimulus funding is making the following improvements possible:

For Phase IV, Applerouth Lane Alternate A is recommended although the cost exceeds the grant constraint by \$5,010. Staff has determined the additional cost to the City is beneficial since an extra 105 LF of sidewalks will be constructed. The cost of constructing sidewalks is estimated at \$120/LF. The cost of Applerouth Lane Alternate A (\$31,530) divided by the 325 LF that will be constructed results in a cost of \$97.02/LF, representing a cost savings of \$22.98/LF or \$2,412.90. It is important to note that the \$120/LF estimate is strictly construction. The \$97.02/LF includes design, surveying & construction.

Virginia Street Alternate B is recommended. 1700 LF of sidewalks will be constructed with this alternate. Alternate B is under the grant constraint of \$204,000.

Additional information regarding bid prices on other alternates for each project location in Phase IV can be found in the table above.

OPTIONS / ADVANTAGES / DISADVANTAGES:

- 1. The City Commission can approve the contract authorizing the low bid to design and build the Sidewalk Enhancements Phase IV project choosing Applerouth Lane Alternate A and Virginia Street Alternate B. Applerouth Lane Alternate A is \$5,010 in excess of the grant constraint of \$26,520. The City must expend Sidewalk Fund money to cover the \$5,010 excess resulting in an additional 105 LF of sidewalks that will be constructed (325 LF total). Virginia Street Alternate B is under the grant constraint of \$204,000.
- 2. The City Commission can approve the contract authorizing the low bid to design and build the Sidewalk Enhancements Phase IV project choosing Applerouth Lane Alternate B and Virginia Street Alternate B. Both of these alternates are within the grant constraint of \$26,520 (Applerouth) and \$204,000 (Virginia). This will allow the City to provide new Federal ADA compliant sidewalks and curb ramps at each of the project locations using stimulus funding at no additional cost to the City.
- 3. The City Commission can decline the bids received and reissue the Design-Build Request for Proposals. The grant funding received for these projects have deadlines associated with them and delays could jeopardize the funding. Work on this project must begin in time to meet a December 2009 deadline to invoice the grant for the first time.
- 4. The City Commission can decline the bids received and forego sidewalk improvements.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

General Services staff analyzed the lump sum bids and found a mathematical error with the total for Virginia Street Alternate A. The bid submitted was for \$309,560. The correct total is \$309,050 (a \$510 difference). FDOT will reimburse the City 100% up to the grant constraint of \$26,520 (Applerouth) and \$204,000 (Virginia) through Federal stimulus funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. However, the proposal price for Applerouth Lane Alternate A of the low bid is \$5,010 in excess of the grant constraint. The fees up to the grant constraint of \$26,520 (Applerouth) and \$204,000 (Virginia) will be funded through budget line item 102-4104-541-63-00 (Project EN0908 Applerouth, EN0907 Virginia). The additional fees of \$5,010 for Applerouth Lane Alternate A will be funded through the City Sidewalk Fund, budget line item 102-4104-541-46-00. The grants funds are budgeted in Revenue Account 102-0000-334-49-01.



Immokalee Road 6-Lane Widening:

Collier County selected Hole Montes, Inc., to provide design, surveying and project management services for the existing four-lane immobales Road. This project was separated into two phases:


Phase I is the sh lane design from U.S 41 to just wost of the 1.75 interchange. The Phase I project corridor is essentially a fully developed corridor with a mix of commercial and residential properties adjacent to the roadway. To reduce the cost of storm-water treatment for the Phase I project by eliminating the need to purchase significant land area outside of the immediate roadway right of way, the use of storm-ceptor type treatment structures to remove suspended solids and exfiltration trenches for water quality has been proposed in the design. This concept has been accepted in principal by the South Florida Water Management District. The design of this phase was completed in the Fall of 2004, with construction beginning in the early Spring of 2005.

Phase II is the continuation of Phase I through the I-75 interchange and includes significant lengthening of the westbound turn lane from Immokalee Road to I-75 south and the creation of long eastbound, dual left turn lanes from Immokalee Road to I-75 north. Phase II of this project also includes the widening of the northbound and southbound on-ramps and the south bound off-ramp to I-75. The design of Phase II was completed in the Summer of 2002 and the construction element of Phase II was completed in early 2003. Storm water treatment for the Phase II project is obtained by conventional means using treatment swales and outlet control structures.










Livingston Road & Imperial Street Corridor: Collier and Lee Counties, Florida

Hole Montes was selected by the Collier County officials to provide design, engineering, surveying, permitting and project management services for the portion of Livingston Road from the Lee County line south to immokates Road. The Hole Montes team conducted design and alternate location studies to arrive at an alignment that would reduce environmental and right-of-way impacts to existing wetlands and adjacent parcels. These studies required extensive vegetative mapping to determine the location and quality of wetland resources. Design plans were then prepared for 6.1 miles of 16-inch and 12-inch water mains, traffic signalization, signs and pavement marking, lighting and right-of-way plans for two lanes of an ultimate four-lens roadway including a bridge structure over the Cocohatchee Canal.


A major and complex element of the engineering services was the preparation of permit applications required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (CDE), the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) and the Big Cypress Basin. Extensive agency coordination along with the planning and preliminary design of mittigation features was undertaken to offset the loss of jurisdictional wetlands.

Lee County selected Hole Montes, Inc. to design the four-laning of Imperial Street in Bonita Springs, Florida, from Bonita Beach Road to East Terry Street. These two segments of Imperial Street both dead-end at the Imperial River. A new four-lane bridge spans 328' across the Imperial River and its floodplain to complete the Livingston Road/Imperial Street/Three Oaks Parkway connection from Collier to Lee Counties. The roadway design incorporates an urban cross-section with concrete walks, Bicycle lanes, and landscape buffer areas.

Additional services with this project include corridor planning, development and evaluation a new floodplain model for the imperial fliver, and cooperative corridor drainage planning.












Carrell Road/Winkler Avenue Utility & Drainage Improvements

Older acctions of the City of Fort Myers exhibited an eging utility system which required extensive annual maintenance and taxed the wastewater treatment facility during peak rainfall events due to widespread infiltration of the underground wastewater system. Hole Montes, Inc. completed the design to revamp the utility system to provide an updated water system for service and fire protection, and a more economical and efficient wastewater system. During this project the City also renovated the roadway drainage system and provided additional sidewalks and traffic calming measures. The final scope of the project was for the design of approximately 108,000 linear feet of sanitary sewer, 81,000 linear feet of water mains, 24,000 linear feet of force main, 12 lift stations, and an extensive drainage analysis and design for the one-square mile community. The project was designed in multiple phases to afford the flexibility to the City to bid portions as funding was in place, and renovation needs dictated.


Hole Montes also provided a vital role in coordinating with the affected City residents – providing updates as to the progress of the design, neighborhood meetings during construction, a website for public information, continuing field communication with the residents on nearly a daily basis, and coordination with emergency services. We also provided cost and time savings for the project by utilizing HM inspection force for material testing.

As a sub-product of the Carrell-Winkler Utility project, the City had obtained HMGP (Hazard Mitigation Grant Program) funding eligibility to review recurrent flooding within a section of the project. HM provided a detailed ICPR analysis of the sub-watershed, and predicted flooding extents. HM also provided concepts for abating flooding and benefit/cost data for City review. The project is still under review and evaluation.















Dearborn Street Widening:


Dearborn Street is an arterial connector roadway which is the gateway for the downtown Englewood retail-tourism center in Sarasota County, it also provides a essential route for evacuation. Prosped with those two vital needs to the economy and citizens, Hole Montes was tasked with the design, permitting and construction administration for the revitalization of rural two-lane road into a scenic four-lane divided roadway with sidewalks, bikeways and streetscape accents. All of these elements were needed, but additional right-of-way was not available; and therefore these elements were required within the extents of only the existing 100 foot wide right-of-way. In addition to the roadway improvements — the project required a new bridge crossing of Gottfried Creek, and an extensive drainage system analysis to abate recurring flooding within the adjacent residential neighborhood.

The project utilized ICPR storm system modeling to predict existing flooding and used also to evaluate the proposed improvements. The Dearborn Street dislinage improvements were then linked with the existing FDOT SR 776 system, and supplemented with on-site surface water treatment areas proposed within the project. The final project provided a drainage system to alleviate neighborhood flooding, provide for roadway excess runoff storm water treatment, and provide environmental mitigation vegetated areas. The project required environmental resource permitting through Southwest Florida Water Management District and Army Corp of Engineers, as well as bridge review by the US Coast Guard.

Project funding was made available by Sarasota County and supplemented through a LAP grant by FDOT: Additionally, decorative lighting costs was subsidized by the Englewood CRA. As such, the project required close coordination with all of the team members, as well as the many utilities affected by the development, such as COMCAST, TECO, FPL, Sprint and Englewood Water District. The project was completed in August 2008, and was completed within budget.












Via Coconut Point - Sandy Lane Extension: Fort Myers, Lee County, Florida

This project is a new four-lane road that is a total of 3.8 miles in length and connects existing Sandy Lane at Corkscrew Road to Pelican Colony Boulevard at U.S. 41 to provide a segment of the north-south corridor from the City of Bonita Springs to Alico Road. It was designed within a 100 foot right of way corridor and required a "fast track" approach due to a new regional shopping malk which accelerated the need for the new roadway corridor.

Some of the elements of the project included establishing multiple turn lane locations for present and future usage, defining right of way, buffering with landscape elements, designing water and sewer needs, conveying drainage to joint use ponds, incorporating roundabouts at two intersections, and working with the Seminole Guif Railway for Roadway crossing and drainage improvements. The roadway characteristics of these phases include new sidewalk, fighting, a sound wall, three new signals; one at US41 at Village Shops Way and two on Sandy tane for Coccinut Road and for Corkscrew Road. A new railroad crossing and an open cut installation of storm drains under Seminole Guif Railway (SGRW) required critical coordination with the Dispatcher, Engineers and Construction managers at SGRW.

The permits obtaining included SFWMD ERP permits and development orders for each of the three phases, ACOE permits, and FDOT drainage and roadway connection permits. The project added significant surface water treatment areas; these lakes, swales and detention areas were constructed during high ground water levels and posed an unusual challenge to the Contractor. Both temporary and permanent storm water collection systems gathered surface water during construction and discharged into a sensitive wetland area causing rigorous attention by Lee County and the Department of Environmental Protection. Hole Montes monitored the runoff and assisted the contractor to attain special dewatering permits and the services of a local environmental firm to keep construction on schedule.






