A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, APPROVING THE ATTACHED "AMENDMENT NO. 3 TO AGREEMENT NO. LPA0246" BETWEEN THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (FDEP) AND THE CITY OF KEY WEST TO INCREASE FUNDING BY \$2,185,003.35 BRINGING THE TOTAL FUNDING AMOUNT TO \$5,844,202.01 AND EXTENDING THE TASK END DATE TO OCTOBER 31, 2026 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF KEY WEST TREATMENT PLANT SOLIDS DEWATERING UPGRADES PROJECT; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS UPON ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE CITY ATTORNEY; AUTHORIZING ANY NECESSARY BUDGET AMENDMENTS AND TRANSFERS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, in Resolutions 22-007, 23-335 AND 24-246, the City Commission approved an FDEP Agreement, Amendment No. 1 to Agreement, and Amendment No. 2 to Agreement to provide State funding for the Key West Treatment Plant Solids Dewatering Upgrades Project, using funds provided through the Florida Keys Stewardship Act; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the attached "Amendment No. 3 to

Agreement No. LPA0246" between FDEP and the City is hereby approved, to increase funding by \$2,185,003.35 bringing the total funding amount to \$5,844,202.01 and extending the Task End Date to October 31, 2026.

Section 2: That the City Manager is authorized to execute any necessary documents, upon advice and consent of the City Attorney.

Section 3: That project expenses are budgeted in 401-3504-535-6500/SE35042006 and grant funds will be budgeted in 401-0000-334-3900/SE35042006 for this project. Any necessary budget amendments or adjustments are hereby authorized.


Section 4: That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the Presiding Officer and the Clerk of the Commission.

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### **Introduction**

The City Manager's Office requests approval of the attached "Amendment No. 3 to Agreement No. LPA0246" between the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) and the City of Key West to increase funding by \$2,185,003.35 bringing the total funding amount to \$5,844,202.01 and extend the Task End Date to October 31, 2026 for the construction of the Key West Treatment Plant Solids Dewatering Upgrades Project. Authorizing the City Manager to execute the necessary documents and authorizing any necessary budget amendments and transfers.

### **Background**

To date, the Florida Keys Stewardship Act has provided \$3,659,198.66 for the Solids Dewatering Upgrades Project:

\*Amendment No. 1 (Resolution 23-335) extended the grant to April 30, 2025 and changed the Task End Date to October 31, 2024. Amendment No. 2 extended the grant to April 30, 2027.

City Staff applied for Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern Grant Program funding through the FDEP grant portal on August 31, 2024. This funding is Florida Keys Stewardship Act funding available on a competitive basis. The award amount is \$1,096,134.65. Amendment No. 3 also includes \$1,066,666.70 (the last installment of the agreed-upon \$12 million in Stewardship Act funding provided by the Amendment to the Interlocal Agreement for Years 2 – 4; Resolution 13-235) and \$22,202.00 of unused Stewardship Act funding from another City project (KG001 Ultraviolet Disinfection System).

**Procurement**

With the approval of Amendment No. 3, funding for the solids dewatering project will increase by \$2,185,003.35 to be budgeted in Revenue Account 4010000-3343900 / SE35042006. Construction costs are budgeted in Expense Account 4013504-5356500 / SE35042006.

**Recommendation**

The City Manager's Office recommends the City Commission approve the attached "Amendment No. 3 to Agreement No. LPA0246" between the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) and the City of Key West to increase funding by \$2,185,003.35 bringing the total funding amount to \$5,844,202.01 and extend the Task End Date to October 31, 2026 for the construction of Key West Treatment Plant Solids Dewatering Upgrades Project.

This Amendment to Agreement No. LPA0246 (Agreement), as previously amended, is made by and between the Department of Environmental Protection (Department), an agency of the State of Florida, and the City of Key West (Grantee), on the date last signed below.

WHEREAS, the Department entered into the Agreement with the Grantee for Key West Treatment Plant Solids Dewatering Upgrades (Project), effective January 13, 2022; and,

WHEREAS, \$22,202 in additional funding for this Project is provided under Line Item 1709 of the 2023-2024 General Appropriations Act; and,

WHEREAS, the reimbursement period for the additional funding provided under Line Item 1709 of the 2023-2024 General Appropriations Act begins on July 1, 2023; and,

WHEREAS, \$2,162,801.35 in additional funding for this Project is provided under Line Item 1736 of the 2024-2025 General Appropriations Act; and the total funding for this Agreement is now \$5,844,202.01; and,

WHEREAS, the reimbursement period for the additional funding provided under Line Item 1736 of the 2024-2025 General Appropriations Act begins on July 1, 2024; and,

WHEREAS, other changes to the Agreement are necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to amend the Agreement as set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

**ATTACHMENT 3-3  
REVISED GRANT WORK PLAN**

**PROJECT TITLE:** Key West Treatment Plant Solids Dewatering Upgrades

**PROJECT LOCATION:** The Project will be located in the City of Key West within Monroe County; Lat/Long (24.5694, -81.7972). See Figures 1 and 2 for a location map and site plan

**PROJECT BACKGROUND:** Biological activated sludge, composed of bacteria and protozoa, is utilized in the treatment of wastewater to consume organic matter in sewage, and oxidize carbonaceous and nitrogenaceous biological matter. On average 22,000 gallons of activated sludge must be removed from the City of Key West's (Grantee) Richard A. Heyman Environmental Protection Facility, on a daily basis. Dewatered activated sludge may be conveniently and economically transported in trailer truck, where liquid activated sludge must be tanker truck transported, increasing the cost for transportation and risk of spillage. Additionally, the use of a belt filter press is an efficient, low cost to operate and maintain, means of dewatering activated sludge and returning liquid to the treatment process, thereby preventing liquid wastewater from impacting nearshore waters, streams, and lakes.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The Grantee will purchase and install two (2) belt filter presses; sludge pumps; polymer feed injection and mixing systems; and electrical control panels for motor starters, belt drives, programmable logic controllers, speed and flow indicators. The Grantee will also upgrade the electrical distribution power supply and construct a sludge cake conveyance belt system.

The DEP Grant Funds associated with this Agreement were awarded based on local contributions pledged towards the total project costs: \$1,978,000.00 from the City of Key West. A summary of the local contributions will be required in the Final Quarterly Progress Report, and financial supporting documentation shall be provided upon request.

The Grantee does not anticipate that the funding under this Agreement will result in a fully completed project, so this Agreement will cover a portion of the work.

**TASKS:** All documentation should be submitted electronically unless otherwise indicated and should be submitted prior to the expiration of the grant agreement.

**Task 1: Construction**

**Deliverables:** The Grantee will construct the treatment plant solids dewatering upgrades in accordance with the construction contract documents.

**Documentation:** The Grantee will submit: 1) a copy of the final design; 2) a signed summary of activities completed for the period of work covered in the payment request, using the format provided by the Department's Grant Manager. Upon request by the Department's Grant Manager, the Grantee will provide additional supporting documentation relating to this task.

**Performance Standard:** The Department's Grant Manager will review the documentation to verify that the deliverables have been completed as described above. Upon review and written acceptance by the Department's Grant Manager, the Grantee may proceed with payment request submittal.

**Payment Request Schedule:** The Grantee may submit a payment request for cost reimbursement no more frequently than monthly.

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**PROJECT TIMELINE & BUDGET DETAIL:** The tasks must be completed by the corresponding task end date. Cost reimbursable grant funding must not exceed the budget amounts as indicated below.

For any Task with a Budget Category of Contractual Services, the Grantee shall submit a copy of the executed subcontract to the Department prior to submitting any invoices for subcontracted work.

Note that, per Section 8.h. of Attachment 1 in the Agreement, authorization for continuation and completion of work and any associated payments may be rescinded, with proper notice, at the discretion of the Department if the Legislature reduces or eliminates appropriations. Extending the contract end date carries the risk that funds for this project may become unavailable in the future. This should be a consideration for the Grantee with this and future requests for extension.

The administration of resources awarded by the Department of Environmental Protection (*which may be referred to as the "Department", "DEP", "FDEP" or "Grantor", or other name in the agreement*) to the recipient (*which may be referred to as the "Recipient", "Grantee" or other name in the agreement*) may be subject to audits and/or monitoring by the Department of Environmental Protection, as described in this attachment.

**MONITORING**

In addition to reviews of audits conducted in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F-Audit Requirements, and Section 215.97, F.S., as revised (see "AUDITS" below), monitoring procedures may include, but not be limited to, on-site visits by DEP Department staff, limited scope audits as defined by 2 CFR 200.425, or other procedures. In the event the Department of Environmental Protection determines that a limited scope audit of the recipient is appropriate, the recipient agrees to comply with any additional instructions provided by the Department to the recipient regarding such audit. The recipient further agrees to comply and cooperate with any inspections, reviews, investigations, or audits deemed necessary by the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) or Auditor General.

**AUDITS**

**PART I: FEDERALLY FUNDED**

This part is applicable if the recipient is a State or local government or a non-profit organization as defined in 2 CFR §200.330

1. A recipient that expends \$750,000 or more in Federal awards in its fiscal year, must have a single or program-specific audit conducted in accordance with the provisions of 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F.
