- **Sustainable Transportation Coordinator update**

- Position reclassified in April to Growth Management and Transportation Planning Coordinator
- Position reports to Growth Management Division Director

- **Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grants**

- SS4A Demonstration Grant: Awarded \$502,400 (total project cost is \$628,000) for Key West AI-Powered Traffic Safety Technology and On-The-Ground Safety Improvements Project
 - Award will be used to enhance Safety Action Plan by acquiring AI-powered near-miss technology and an AI-powered crash dashboard and by installing on-the-ground safety countermeasures.
 - University of Florida applied for \$300,000 from FDOT to do a 2-year research study on the AI-powered near-miss technology. Funding should be awarded in 2026.
- SS4A Implementation Grant
 - Last cycle of SS4A grants unless Congress and the White House approve an extension. Since Congress has proposed to extend SS4A, more SS4A grants should be available in the future. One of the bills wants to prioritize funding for implementation grants over planning grants.
- Regional: Partnering with City of Marathon and Village of Islamorada on SS4A
 - Presented with Marathon at Florida Keys Scenic Corridor Alliance's Annual Meeting on June 11.

- **Exemplary E-Bike Program**

- Bike Share: Working with Engineering and Planning Departments to evaluate what policies and regulations are needed to permit a bikeshare program
- Florida Legislation:
 - Florida SB 700 preempts local jurisdictions from regulating EV charging stations and supporting equipment
 - Florida Legislature unanimously approved SB 382. Governor DeSantis vetoed this bill on June 25. Subsection (10)(b) in Section 1 of SB 382 would have been added to section 316.20655 as of July 1, 2026.
 - (b) A person operating an electric bicycle on a sidewalk or any other area designated for pedestrian use may not operate the electric bicycle at a speed greater than 10mph if a pedestrian is within 50 feet of the electric bicycle.

COMPARE REPORT WITH DIFFERENT TIMEFRAMES

• Transit

- **Key West Rides:** Due to a spike in ride requests, reviewing with Via staff whether to reduce or eliminate pre-booking option for Key West Rides
- **Island Hopper:** Proposed transit service changes
 - Due to budget cuts and not enough vehicles to handle extreme Key West Rides ridership demand, Key West Rides and the Workforce route will likely be replaced by the new Island Hopper route in January 2027
 - Public open houses being scheduled for late August or September
 - Using Via's Remix software to improve transit planning and scheduling

- Team Mobile Bus Shelter Grant: Received \$50k grant from T-Mobile to purchase and install four artistic hurricane-rated bus shelters in Old Town
 - Local artists will be hired to design the artwork for the bus shelters
 - High school students will create video to promote the new Island Hopper route and the new 3-position bus bike racks and Velolink technology
 - \$143,500 total funding
 - \$50k from grant
 - \$46k from Art in Public Places (AIPP)
 - \$46k from Transportation Alternative Fund (TAF)
 - \$1,500 from Transit

- Long Term Transit funding: Researching short- and long-term innovative transit funding ideas
 - Implementing ads on existing free WiFi and TV screens on buses
 - Exploring possibility to add EV charging to lampposts with WiFi ads
