CITY COMMISSION MEETING

OLD CITY HALL, 510 GREENE STREET

TUESDAY, JANUARY 4, 2011

A regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Key West, Florida was held in Commission Chambers, Old City Hall, on Tuesday, January 4, 2011.

Mayor Craig Cates called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Answering roll call were Commissioners Teri Johnston, Clayton Lopez, Mark Rossi, Billy Wardlow, Jimmy Weekley and Mayor Craig Cates.

Commissioner Barry Gibson was absent.

Also present were City Manager Jim Scholl, Assistant City Manager David Fernandez, Assistant City Manager Mark Finigan, City Attorney Shawn Smith, Interim City Planner Don Craig, Police Chief Donie Lee, Fire Chief David Fraga, Interim City Planner Donald Craig, Department of Transportation Manager Myra Wittenberg, Community Services Director Greg Veliz, Deputy Community Services Director Rodrigo Delostrinos, Code Compliance Manager Jim Young, Information Technology Director Patti McLauchlin, Utilities Manager Jay Gewin, Parking Manager John Wilkins, Port Operations Project Manager Doug Bradshaw, Senior Property Manager Marilyn Wilbarger, Senior Deputy City Clerk Sue Harrison and City Clerk Cheri Smith.

The pledge of allegiance to the flag of the United States of America was given by all present.

CHANGES TO THE AGENDA:

The City Manager requested Resolution Item #15, approving the agreement for ambulance services, be postponed to a date to be determined when all Commissioners would be present. Mr. Scholl stated the applicant had withdrawn Resolution Item #17 for a vacation of property located at 1100 Angela Street.

The Clerk announced there was a speaker for Resolution Items #4 and #5 and those items would need to be removed from the Consent Agenda.

Commissioner Johnston asked if they could hold a special meeting for the ambulance contract.

Mr. Scholl stated the next Thursday looked to be a good date for a Special Meeting and a Closed Session that would be introduced by the City Attorney.

Without opposition, the agenda was accepted as changed.

City Attorney's Report

City Attorney Shawn Smith updated the Commission regarding the BCCLT and the Housing Authority agreement. He said the City should be reimbursed approximately \$450,000.00 in prior payments and \$50,000.00 in outstanding utility bills. Mr. Smith asked for a Closed Session for Case 2010-CA-1092-K.

City Manager's Report

Mr. Scholl thanked the Key West Police Department, the Community Services, Public Works and Recreation Departments for public safety and clean-up after the New Year's Eve celebration.

Mr. Scholl stated they would have a financial analysis for the Assisted Care Facility by the end of the month.

Mr. Scholl stated there had been a meeting prior to Christmas with the School Board on Glynn Archer. He said they would have until the end of March to finish a workable agreement that would come before both boards.

Mr. Scholl said last year at this time they had discussed the City Manager's Contract and at that time the contract was modified by the Commission for a one year extension to run through July 2011. He said no decision would need to be made tonight but any work that needed to be done ahead of time should be started. He would make himself available to each Commissioner for discussions.

Commissioner Johnston asked for an update on the Pier House appraisal. Mr. Scholl had Marilyn Wilbarger, Senior Property Manager address the issue. Ms. Wilbarger stated they had been in the process of obtaining proposals to prepare the appraisals. They were very close to engaging the two appraisers needed.

Mayor Cates asked the City Manager if he had the figures for the Truman Waterfront. Mr. Scholl asked Assistant City Manager Mark Finigan to respond. Mr. Finigan said the infrastructure fund could handle \$8,500,000.00 over a three year period to fund projects and development. They would apply for TDC funding, State funding, Federal funding and any other kind of grant supported monies.

Commissioner Weekley asked about TDC Funding and their deadlines. Mr. Finigan said they had already met with Mr. Wheeler from the TDC and would get an application in for this cycle. Mr. Scholl stated there also were recreational fund out of Tallahassee they would pursue.

Commissioner Lopez requested Mr. Scholl schedule a meeting regarding the 6.6 acres at the Truman Waterfront. Mr. Scholl said they would get the folks together they need to have for that type of meeting and set it up.

Commissioner Wardlow asked regarding the City Manager's contract, if that would need a resolution to extend or renegotiate or to start a search for a new City Manager. Mr. Smith responded as the contact expires in July if a Commissioner wishes to renew the contract something would come before the Commission.

Commissioner Weekley reminded the Commission that this is an election year and to take that into consideration with regard to the City Manager's contract.

Mr. Smith reminded the Commission it was imperative they adopt a legislative platform for the year and that perhaps that could be part of a special meeting. The Commission agreed. They were asked to check their calendars for Thursday, January 13 at 6:00 p.m. for a Special Meeting and closed session.

Commissioner Johnston asked the City Manager to provide a list of current funding they are receiving at the Federal and State levels.

Commissioner Wardlow asked the City Manager for a follow-up regarding \$7,000,000.00 owed to the State and FEMA from 1999.

Commissioner Rossi welcomed Judge Tegan Slaton to the meeting.
