AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 30 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED "FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION" BY AMENDING SECTION 30-9, TO ADJUST THE SCHEDULE OF INSPECTION FEES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the fees for certain fire inspection services provided by the fire department have not been adjusted since 2019, and do not reflect the actual cost of providing such services to residents and businesses in the City of Key West; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to periodically adjust fees and amend the fee schedule to address the significant cost of providing life-safety protection services; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the fire inspection fees in sections 30-9 of the Code of Ordinances will promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens and visitors of the City of Key West.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That Section 30-9 of the Code of
Ordinances is hereby amended as follows*:

<u>Sec. 30-9.</u> - Schedule of inspection fees.

The office of the fire marshal shall charge and collect for the various permits required by the Florida Fire Prevention Code, as adopted by reference in section 30-57 and made part of the ordinances of the city, as follows:

- (1) All buildings (including balconies, porches, additions, and garages, and accessory buildings):
 - a. For each \$1,000.00 of value, or fractional part thereof, of enclosed space ... \$3.00

Section 3: If any section, provision, clause, phrase, or application of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable therefrom and shall be construed as reasonable and necessary to achieve the lawful purposes of this Ordinance.

Section 4: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances of said City in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby superseded to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5: This Ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the presiding officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
