Management Practices

Fiscal Responsibility

DECO has refined its operational planning, staffing logistics, and cost-control strategies to ensure efficient contract execution. Our dedicated project management team monitors schedules, resource allocation, and expenditures in real time to avoid delays and control costs. We utilize a scalable service model and local personnel to minimize overhead and maximize responsiveness, which will allow us to meet the City of Key West's service expectations without compromising quality or fiscal responsibility.

The following table provides an overview of DECO management practices that are designed to consistently meet contract time and budget requirements.

Contract Support	This contract will be managed by our designated Contract Manager (CM) and supported by the entire DECO operations infrastructure, which provides access to additional resources, if needed, for contract administration and support. The essential functions of the CM are management and oversight of: Quality control, business management, communications, reporting, contract processing, risk management, technical support, and proactive communication with the Contract Administrator for the City of Key West, as well as project finance and administration. The CM has complete responsibility and authority to full-fill the requirements of the contract and has technical control of the project; and is empowered to commit the company's resources on all matters within the scope of the contract with the exception of formal contractual issues involving signature authority of the senior officers of DECO.
Contract Administration	Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) will be developed based in part on contract deliverables. Deficiencies will be identified reported and corrected. The Contract Administrator will be kept abreast of all changes prior to implementation.
Data Management	Receive all client-source documentation and site specific data and information from the Contract Administrator, as well as all the documentation being produced by the CM. These materials will be catalogued and controlled as they are reviewed, revised, appended, and approved. Statistical data will be collected and reported on security officer activities each day, or as requested by the Contract Administrator.
Daily Meetings	Our approach to reviewing and reporting on contract activities is to have regularly scheduled internal reviews that examine all the programmatic, contractual, and financial aspects of the contract. These reviews, that are scheduled daily, are led by the CM, and attended by all the members of the management team – Daily Briefing.
Risk Management	Through Risk Management, the possibilities of contract delivery deficiencies are minimized. Risk Management includes the analysis of technical, performance, schedule, and cost activities, and the development of plans to identify variations, or potential variations from the intended project plan or activity. Risk management supports every aspect of contract support.
Financial Management	DECO maintains a modern, efficient, fully automated billing and collections system (decogenesis). Our processes are designed to ensure accuracy and timeliness when managing contract orders. The system accounts for information needed for contract deliverables and contract modifications. Its functions include accounting, order processing, purchasing, asset management, and financial management. This system enables DECO to administer contracts efficiently and to resolve issues expeditiously.
Weekly Status Reports	The CM prepares a weekly status report. The report identifies significant issues, problems, or concerns related to the performance or administration of the contract. It includes statistical data on the suitability and stability of the security team (e.g., absenteeism, turnover rates, and behavior infractions, training accomplished during the previous week, summary of incidents, injuries reported, etc.).
Technology Deployments	GPS tracking of our security teams, provides accountability and safety. Our proprietary software "decogenesis" is used for scheduling and attendance. Two-way radios and/or cellular/satellite devices will be used for redundant communication capabilities. Upon the client's request and additional expense, autonomous or piloted drones can be deployed to surveil protected areas - SkyGuard .



 transition teams to new contracts, allowing our core operations staff to continue focusing on
