NARRATIVE OF INCIDENT

See below arrest affidavit written by Officer Medina:

On August 16th, 2024, I Officer Gustavo Medina was patrolling on Whitehead Street coming to the intersection of Petronia Street when I observed a suspect from an earlier call (CAD#242290144) that Officer Thomas Stutz responded to in reference to a theft. Officer Stutz sent out a photograph via text to all patrol officers on the shift from the store's surveillance camera illustrating a white male with a black baseball cap, black shirt and shorts enter the store and steal a lighter and cigar from within the store. The male I observed at the intersection was clearly the individual in the photograph. I made contact with the suspect (later identified as Brent Douglas Gordon DOB 01/21/1979). I informed Officer Stutz that i had a visual of his suspect at the intersection and at Bahama Village Market 798 White head Street.

While approaching Gordon I was able to smell the odor of Marijuana coming from the lit "joint like" hand wrapped cigarette in his hand due to my experience and training. When I approached Gordon I informed him that I could tell that the item in his hands was Marijuana and he even acknowledged that it was Marijuana by asking if it was illegal to walk down in public with "Weed (Marijuana)." I had to inform Gordon that it was illegal and unlawful to smoke Marijuana in public. While gathering information from Gordon I requested Gordon to lawfully sit down; which he resisted. After several attempts to give lawful commands while being detained Gordon clenched his hands and placed them behind his back. He then began yelling and aggressively place his face right into my face and space. I then attempted to physically restrain Gordon which he continued to resist by bracing and pulling away from my grasp. Gordon then taunted me to reach for my non lethal device. I then reached for my nonlethal device (Taser) on my duty belt. Gordon then began to resist by walking away towards Thomas Street. I gave loud verbal commands to not walk away. I then activated the Taser device; which failed to cause NMI (neuromuscular incapacitation). Gordon then began to jog away. Officer Standerwick arrived on scene in his patrol vehicle; where he drove ahead of Gordon; which prompted Gordon to turn back towards me. I then activated the device a second time and again the device did not cause NMI to Gordon. Gordon then ran off a second time towards Thomas Street in the direction of Officer Standerwick who exited his vehicle up ahead. officer Standerwick was able to stop Gordon from fleeing by tackling him up ahead. I was then able to assist in restraining Gordon with Officer Stutz and Officer Standerwick. Gordon continue to resist during the handcuffing process by bracing his hands and arms underneath his person and head region; which he was reluctant to release upon lawful commands to place his hands behind his back.

Gordon was eventually placed into handcuffs. Gordon was behaving erratic and bizarre during our encounter with him. Gordon was saying nonsensical statements. I was able to pull the Taser probes from his back; which I was able to see struck him three times that I had to remove from his back. The cartridges and probes were later placed into property by Officer Stutz. Rescue responded to medical care and treat both Gordon and Officer Standerwick for injuries sustained in the detainment and arrest of Gordon. While searching Gordon's person we were able to recover the butane filled lighter that Gordon stole from the store` where he comitted the offense of retail theft. Unfortunately the butane lighter was not placed into evidence as evidence due to being hazardous; however, it was documented during Officer Stutz's and my body worn camera.

I then transported Gordon to Lower Keys Medical Center for further medical care and treatment. Gordon was medically cleared by Doctor Patrick from the Emergency Room. Gordon was then transported to Monroe County Jail without incident.

Gordon was charged with one count Resisting without violence. Gordon braced, tensed, walked and ran away after lawful commands and detainment from police. Gordon was also charged with one count retail theft by stealing a butane lighter from the store at 806 Duval Street. The store was willing to pursue charges for the retail theft committed by Gordon by the shop owner at Havanas Cigar House (Aiman Akhmetzhanova 305-395-2313).

The encounter was captured on my body worn camera and later placed into the Axon server as evidence.I had no further involvement.///END OF REPORT////CLEARED BY ARREST

On August 16, 2024 at approximately 1412 hours, Ofc. Medina advised he had located a subject from a previous retail theft and trespassing call that I (Ofc. Stutz) had responded to approximately one hour prior. (Reference KWPD CAD Number 242290144). Ofc. Medina stated he was stopping the subject near the intersection of Petronia St. and Whitehead St.

On arrival, I observed Ofc. Medina with the subject and returned to my vehicle to get the video from the store to confirm it was the subject they wanted trespass warned. I then heard Ofc. Medina yell into his radio.

Ofc. Standerwick was arriving on scene at that moment and passed me in his patrol vehicle. I observed Ofc. Medina chasing the male, with Taser drawn, and giving verbal commands for him to stop. I heard Ofc. Medina fire the Taser and the male continued to flee, flailing his arms as he ran. Ofc. Medina then fired the second cartridge as the first was ineffective. I observed the subject continued to flee.

I saw Ofc. Standerwick had passed the subject and exited his patrol vehicle blocking the subjects escape. I observed the subject ran into Ofc. Standerwick and Ofc. Standerwick tackled him to the ground. Ofc. Medina and I approached and assisted with handcuffing the subject. I placed the subject in a recovery position and the removed him from the roadway.

Key West Rescue arrived on scene and evaluated the subject, later identified as Brent Gordon.

Gordon was apologizing for his actions and for running from and resisting officers. Gordon was not complaining of any injuries and continued to apologize for his behavior.

While dealing with Gordon, I confirmed he was the person reported earlier for a petit theft from 806 Duval St. (CAD Number noted above.)

Gordon was taken into custody by Ofc. Medina and transported to Monroe County Jail.

On 8/16/2024 at 1410 hours I, Ofc Standerwick responded to the corner of Whitehead Street and Petronia Street as a backup officer for Ofc Medina and Stutz.

Officers were out with a Suspect, later identified as Brent Gordon (Defendant), who was wanted for retail theft. Suspect is described a tall white male wearing a black T-Shirt, black baseball hat and shorts. As I approached the area heading North on Whitehead Street, I saw Ofc Stutz approaching his parked patrol car on the corner of Whitehead Street and Petronia Street. I made the left on Petronia Street, and I saw Ofc Medina following the Defendant who was heading West on Petronia Street. The Defendant was wearing the descriptor clothing and was attempting to flee Ofc Medina. Ofc Medina had his TASER out and was deploying his TASER at the Defendant. I could hear the TASER being deployed and hear Ofc Medina call out to the Defendant that he was deploying the TASER. The Defendant continued heading West and I passed Ofc Medina and the Defendant with my marked KWPD patrol car. I parked my patrol car exited my car, and I approached the Defendant. The Defendant saw me and attempted to actively evade me by running around me. I grabbed the Defendant by his torso, and he immediately attempted to pull away from me by using his arms to push me off him. I pivoted my weight, and utilizing a hip toss take down maneuver to redirect the Defendant to the ground in a controlled manner as using the aforementioned technique. I took the Defendant to the ground in the middle of Petronia Street. While on the ground the Defendant continued to resist us by refusing to put his arms behind his back. Ofc Medina and Stutz were able to eventually handcuff the Defendant while he was on the ground. The Defendant was moved out of the street to the sidewalk. I did not see any visible injuries to the Defendant; however, rescue was called for the Defendant so he could be evaluated. During the course of the arrest, I felt pain in my upper right side rib area, and I was checked out by KWFD rescue and by Key West Urgent care. My BWC was knocked off immediately upon engaging with the Defendant. The video was uploaded into evidence under this case number.
