On November 8, 2024, the Key West Police Department Special Investigations Unit (KWPD SIU) executed a search warrant at 1314 Flagler Avenue, Key West, Florida. The Honorable Judge Kelley signed the warrant authorizing the search.

At approximately 05:29 hours, Key West Police Special Response Team (SRT) members made entry into the residence and detained the occupants. While SRT was making entry, a white male, later identified as Tony Bethel, was in the front yard and noticed KWPD's arrival. He quickly ran inside the residence and was later detained by SRT. A male, later identified as Malcolm Scranton, was found and detained in Bethel's bedroom. There were two individuals in Bethel's Ford SUV (FL plate 12DWNN), which was parked in the driveway. The two occupants were later identified as Michael Hamel (front passenger seat) and Amber Walsh (rear passenger seat).

Before searching the residence, I (Detective Christian Bozzetti) used my BWC to video record the building's condition (entry video). Utilizing the same BWC, I (Detective Christian Bozzetti) read the Search Warrant aloud with all occupants present.

Detective Andrew Hudson utilized K9 Cayo to conduct a sniff of the premises. After the K9 sniff, Lieutenant Billy Vazquez, Detective Sergeant JT Conaty, Detective Andrew Hudson, Detective Henry del Valle, and I searched the premises. Detective Jorge Lopez processed and packaged all evidence.

Detective Sergeant Conaty found the following items in the Tony Bethel's bedroom:

- Numerous pieces of tin foil with burn marks on them and a residue, which field-tested positive (FTP) for fentanyl. One piece of foil was between the teeth of a pair pliers, on top of a bedroom dresser. The other pieces of foil were found in different compartments of the same dresser.
- A plastic baggie with a white powdery residue (FTP amphetamine) was found in a basket on a bookshelf.
- A small plastic baggie with a white powdery residue (FTP cocaine) was found on top of the bedside dresser. A wallet with Bethel's FL DL and numerous other cards belonging to him was right next to the baggie. The bedroom contained numerous other items that clearly belonged to Bethel.

Detective Andrew Hudson found the following items in Bethel's SUV (FL plate 12DWNN):

- A plastic baggie containing a white powdery substance (FTP cocaine) and weighed 1.2 grams. The FTP cocaine was found on the floorboard of the vehicle, in between the driver side and passenger side rear seats.
- There were numerous paraphernalia items on the floorboard in the same vicinity as the FTP cocaine, including a rolled up \$1 bill (FTP cocaine), a small straw (FTP Heroin), a small glass pipe (FTP amphetamine), and a small plastic baggie (FTP heroin).
- There was also a plastic cup in the backseat cupholder, which contained a cloudy liquid and had a powdery residue on it. The liquid and the residue FTP for amphetamine. The FTP amphetamine liquid mixture weighed 194.7 grams.
- In the center console between the driver and front passenger seat, was a cut foil cigarillo wrapper (FTP amphetamine).

- In the driver side door cup holder/compartament, was a plastic stick with a residue on the tip of it (FTP amphetamine).

There were also multiple unused NARCAN nasal sprays in the vehicle, and in Bethel's bedroom. All evidence was photographed and later uploaded to evidence.com. After the search, I used my BWC to record the building's condition (exit video).

Based on my training and experience, I know that the style of tin foil found in bethel's room and vehicle, is commonly used by opiate addicts to burn and inhale their drugs. I also know it is very common for people that the police catch in the process of using narcotics, to attempt to discard of any drugs in their possession. One of the most common ways they attempt to discard of their drugs, is to dump them into any liquid or drink they have near them, in hopes the drugs will dissolve in the liquid.

After the search of the residence was complete, I attempted to interview Scranton, Bethel, Hamel, and Walsh. I read each of them their Miranda Warning, however, only Scranton and Walsh agreed to speak with me.

Scranton stated he was living here because he was evicted from his old residence after a search warrant was executed there, which resulted in his arrest for drug violations. He said he was sleeping on the floor mattress and Bethel slept in the bed. He stated he knows Bethel has a drug problem and that anything illegal found in the room must be Bethel's.

I then interviewed Walsh, and she stated she was in the vehicle with Bethel and Hamel when KWPD arrived to execute the search warrant. She said the Bethel began to curse loudly and flail his arms. She said he opened the driver door and exited the vehicle and might have discarded drugs somewhere in the process. She could not give me an exact location where he might have discarded any drugs, but continuously suggested that any drugs found in the vehicle were Bethel's. She acknowledged knowing there were drugs in the vehicle many times and stated she believed there was a bag of "clean" in the vehicle. "Clean" is a common street term for cocaine. She also claimed she didn't dump any drugs in the cup in the backseat cup holder or see anyone else in the vehicle do it.

Ofc. Haynie and Ofc. Clark transported Walsh, Hamel, and Bethel to the MCDC without incident.

Since Walsh admitted post Miranda to having knowledge of there being drugs in the vehicle, and the drugs and paraphernalia were all right next to the seat she was sitting in, she was in violation of the following F.S.S.'s:

- Possession of a controlled substance, F.S.S. 893.13-6a
- Possession of drug paraphernalia, F.S.S. 893.147-1
- Trafficking in amphetamine 14g or more, F.S.S. 893.135-1(f)1

On November 8, 2024, the Key West Police Department Special Investigations Unit executed a search warrant at 1314 Flagler Ave. The Key West Police Special Response Team (SRT) made initial entry into the property. Before SRT was able to enter the property, they advised over the radio that they had been compromised and that occupants on the property were aware of their presence. SRT then began to detain three people that were in a vehicle in the driveway.

I (Detective Sergeant Jay Conaty) parked my unmarked police vehicle in front of the residence with my emergency lights and siren on. SRT then entered the residence to clear it for additional occupants. After all occupants were detained, Detective Christian Bozzetti recorded an introduction video to document the state of the residence prior to searching. After he recorded that video, Detective Bozzetti then read the search warrant aloud for all occupants.

I assisted in searching the bedroom belonging to Tony Bethel. I found numerous pieces of foil with burn marks on them along with burned residue. I found these pieces on the bedroom dresser and inside the drawers of the dresser.

Inside a basket on a bookshelf, I found a small, plastic baggie with a white, powdery residue inside. I also found a wallet with Tony Bethel's identification inside and numerous cards belonging to him.

The homeowner, Harry Bethel, told me he was concerned that his door was broken. There was an interior door inside the home that was locked when SRT made entry. While clearing the residence for occupants, SRT forced the door open, causing damage to the door frame. I photographed the damage and forwarded the information to Risk Management through my chain of command.

I was not made aware of any other damage on the property.

Bozzetti was the lead case agent. I, Det. J. Lopez was the property custodian and processed the evidence retrieved from the residence.

The following items were collected.

- (1) Pieces of tin foil with dark substance. I used a field test kit on the dark substance, and it field tested positive presumptively for Fentanyl.
- (2) One clear plastic bag with white residue. I used a field test kit on the residue, and it field tested positive presumptively for cocaine.
- (3) One clear bag contained a white powdery substance. I used a field test kit on the substance, and it field tested positive presumptively for cocaine. The final weight on the F.T.P. cocaine was 1.2 grams.
- (4) One clear bag that contained/concealed item number 3 was separately bagged as evidence.
- (5) One small baggie contained white residue. I used a field test kit on the substance, and it field tested positive presumptively for cocaine.
- (6) One straw with a brown substance on it. I used a field test kit on the substance, and it tested positive presumptively for heroin.
- (7) One clear bag with a dark residue. I used a field test kit on the substance, and it tested positive for heroin.
- (8) One piece of tin foil with a dark substance. I used a field test kit on the substance, and it tested positive presumptively for methamphetamine.
- (9) One red/white piece of plastic with white residue. I used a field test kit on the substance, and it tested positive for amphetamine.
- (10) One transparent pick with white residue. I used a field test kit on the substance, and it tested positive presumptively for methamphetamine.
- (11) One clear pipe contained Chore Boy inside. The Chore Boy contained a dark substance. I used a field test kit on the substance, and it field tested positive presumptively for methamphetamine.
- (12) One Dollar Bill, (U.S. currency), contained a white powdery substance on it. I used a field test kit on the substance, and it tested positive presumptively for cocaine.
- (13) Cloudy liquid inside green cup. Det. A. Hudson used a field test kit on the liquid, and it tested positive presumptively for amphetamine. The final weight on the F.T.P. amphetamine was 194.7 grams.
- (14) One green cup that contained item 13 was individually bagged as evidence.
- (15) One small black gun, (S/N:1820511), High Standard 22, Model DM101.
- (16) Two gold-colored bullets.

Items 3 & 13 were logged in a separate P&E to have the items sent to the FDLE lab for further analysis.

I used my Axon Capture App to photograph the field test kit results. I later uploaded all the photographs to the Axon Evidence Server.

On 08NOV24 at approximately 0529, I (Ofc. T. ANGLIN) assisted the KWPD Special Investigations Unit Detectives in the execution of a search warrant at 1314 Flagler Avenue. After arriving in the area as a member of the KWPD Special Response Team, my assignment was the first man in the "Bravo" team stack and my primary area of responsibility was to be the driveway/carport area.

As we, (KWPD SRT) made our approach to the grounds, (1314 Flagler Avenue), team members observed a white male standing in the front yard of the residence. As we approached closer, the white male abruptly ran into the house. We rapidly entered the property, via the front gate, (Unlocked) and as the, "Alpha" stack approached the front door to the residence, I moved the, "Bravo" stack towards the carport.

As I approached the carport, I observed several parked vehicles in the driveway, both underneath the carport and in the uncovered driveway itself. As the distraction device was deployed into the yard by another member of the KWPD SRT, I observed the flicker of a flame, (lighter) coming from the front passenger`s seat of a dark colored vehicle, which was backed into the driveway.

I approached the front passenger`s door of the vehicle and observed a white male in the front passenger`s seat and what appeared to be a white female sitting directly behind the male, (Tinted window). I observed the white male was holding something in his left hand and was looking directly at me, (Eye contact). I shouted, "Police search warrant" and, "Get out of the car". The male gave me a blank stare and began shifting around in the vehicle. I opened the unlocked door and took hold of the male`s right wrist while continuing to repeat my commands for him to exit the vehicle. The male refused to comply and shouted, "Fuck you".

I was able to pull the male out of the vehicle and gave loud verbal commands for him to lay on the ground. The male`s body tensed up as he was attempting to defeat my attempts to guide him to the ground by his right wrist. The male continued to shout obscenities towards me during as I was able to guide him towards the ground, (Male on all fours).

The male maintained a tensed body position as I shifted my body weight towards his lower back, (Right side). The male layed flat, began flailing his body while on the ground while I maintained control of his right wrist. As I prepared to handcuff the male, Lt. B. VAZQUEZ arrived, (Male`s left side) and assisted in handcuffing the subject. As we handcuffed the male, he began screaming that I broke his ribs as he continued flailing. Lt. B. VAZQUEZ took control of the male as I resumed my duties in clearing the grounds. We completed our sweep of the residence and property without incident. I returned to the KWPD SRT vehicle and departed the scene.
