Nicole Berger attends the annual USPTA Tennis World Conference to ensure she stays current with what is changing the tennis industry, how to improve as a professional, and ways to grow the sport. USPTA Certified member benefits include a \$9 million on-court liability insurance policy.
- 2. Nicole Berger and Paradise Tennis have successfully implemented two junior tennis Quickstart programs one on Big Pine Key and one at 1800 Atlantic Condominium Association. Both programs were funded by grants awarded by the United States Tennis Association (USTA), the governing body of tennis, to capture the interest of young players. The first grant funded a 2010 Quickstart Tennis Summer Camp on Big Pine Key and included new equipment. The program continued throughout the school year and over 35 children participated in the last year. In 2011, USTA supplied Paradise Tennis with a similar grant to start a Quickstart Tennis Summer Camp at 1800 Atlantic in Key West. In its first year, it attracted more than 25 children. The plan is to double or triple that number next summer.

 - iii. Adult program includes round robins, flex leagues, tournaments, drill and play, beginner tennis, cardio tennis and advanced drills.
 - iv. In addition, 1800 Atlantic Tennis also supplies a pro shop, which offers services to restring racquets, regrip racquets, demo racquets, sales balls, racquets, and tennis accessories.

The Proposal

Junior Tennis

Paradise Tennis proposes to run a program similar to that in Traverse City, Michigan, where 85 percent of all kids have been exposed to tennis by the 2nd grade. By combining the resources and efforts of school leaders, professional tennis players and parents, we hope that the City of Key West will soon have thriving Quickstart Tennis Programs and summer leagues — the latter to be run by the parents much like little league baseball, softball or AYSO soccer.

Paradise Tennis believes that the sport should be affordable and available to everyone. To that end, it will award scholarships to a certain number of children each year.

Paradise tennis believes that youth tennis is about having fun, learning eye-hand coordination and eye-foot coordination, and learning to love the sport. The youngest children of between the ages of three to ten will learn how to be a part of a team and the importance of sportsmanship when winning or losing. With older children, Paradise Tennis will focus on leadership, hard work, and what it takes to be a great tennis player. It is the mission of Paradise Tennis to introduce young players to a healthy sport, capable of engaging the player for a lifetime.

The Plan

Paradise Tennis plans to engage and reach junior tennis players by working closely with schools. To begin, tennis professionals will make presentations to local elementary private and public school principals and physical education teachers. Paradise Tennis will also make itself available for demonstrations in the local schools by invitation. It will bring the necessary equipment to expose the children to the sport and provide adults with information about instruction on the Bayview Park courts.

In 2012, after the AYSO soccer season and the holiday season have passed, Paradise Tennis proposes to hold a Saturday afternoon USTA Neighborhood Block Party with an event focused on family tennis. It would be free to the public and include food, live music, fun tennis games and information about the junior tennis programs available at Bayview Park courts. This would be an annual event.



Paradise Tennis plans to teach junior tennis, specifically USTA Quickstart Tennis, year round at Bayview Park courts. Quickstart Tennis is the USTA/USPTA's preferred curriculum for children ages 10 and under. Paradise Tennis employs two Quickstart Certified teachers — Nicole Berger and Joie Switzer. (Please see the enclosed brochure on Quickstart Tennis for more specifics about the program.)

Match play is a key component to children's success on the tennis cours, as they grow older. Match play will be run once a month for Kindergarten through 3rd grade students and once a month for 4th through 7th grade students. Paradise Tennis would provide the proper child-sized equipment for this endeavor.

Lower Prices for Junior Tennis

Currently, all Key West tennis pros teaching junior tennis are charging the same amount for lessons. Paradise Tennis plans to make lessons at Bayview Park more affordable for Key West families. In addition, Paradise Tennis would implement a scholarship program for a certain number of children, as stated above, so they could play free of charge.

Schedule for Jr. Tennis

This is Paradise Tennis' tentative plan, subject to changing needs or other variables:

During the school year:

- 3 to 5 year olds: Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 3:00 to 3:45 p.m.
- K through 3rd grade: Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 3:45 to 4:45 p.m.
- 4th to 7th grade: Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 4:45 to 6 p.m.
- 8th to 12th grade: Tuesday and Thursday from 4:00 to 5:30 p.m.
- High School Advanced Clinic: Tuesday and Thursday from 5:30 to 7 p.m.

During the summer:

- 3 to 5 year olds: Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8:00 to 8:45 a.m.
- K through 3rd grade: Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8:45 to 9:45 a.m.
- 4th to 7th grade: Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:45 to 11 a.m.
- 8th to 12th grade: Tuesday and Thursday from 8:00 to 9:30 a.m.
- High School Advanced Clinic: Tuesday and Thursday from 9:30 to 11:00 a.m.



Adults Tennis

Paradise Tennis recognizes that the existing adult players at Bayview Park courts are a large and loyal bunch of tennis devotees. It plans to continue this positive relationship by maintaining courts and fostering a positive attitude on the courts. This includes being sensitive to the unique prime-time preferences and court needs of adult players in Key West.

However, Paradise Tennis also plans to offer expanded programs to draw new players to the Bayview courts, both local and visiting, new and experienced. Cardio Tennis is fun fitness for an hour on the court with music. Round robin play is more social where players have the opportunity to play matches against new opponents. Flex league play involves competitive match play once a week. Advanced classes focus on teaching specific tennis skills or strategies. Drill and play classes are a combination of instruction on court and match play, open to everyone. Paradise Tennis will also offer private lessons.

Adult Tennis Schedule

This is Paradise Tennis' tentative plan, subject to changing needs or other variables:

- Beginner Classes: Thursday from 8:30 to 9:30 a.m. and Tuesday from 7 to 8 p.m.
- Cardio Tennis Classes: Tuesday from noon to 1 p.m. and Friday from noon to 1 p.m.
- Advanced Classes: Thursday from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m.

Tournaments

Paradise Tennis plans to schedule two to four tournaments annually. It will work closely with the USTA to insure that the tournaments are sanctioned events. Other

Paradise Tennis is aware of the two frequent complaints regarding the courts at Bayview Park — cleanliness and security. It promises to do its utmost to ensure that the courts and surrounding areas are thoroughly picked up, especially after special events, and to promote a pleasant atmosphere for visiting and local tennis players. If awarded the bid, it also plans to work closely with local law enforcement agencies to ensure that players feel safe and to minimize personal property crimes.
