Summary of Proposed Ordinance and Statement of Public Purpose to be Served

Since May 2024, Code Enforcement has received complaints about unlicensed taxi drivers and non-functioning meters leading to overcharging. Enforcement has been challenging due to outdated Vehicles for Hire Ordinance regulations. Research revealed that taxi meter calibration is now the responsibility of local governments rather than the State Department of Weights and Measures. Proposed amendments aim to modernize the ordinance, improve meter compliance, and encourage voluntary adherence.

One key amendment is to increase the regulatory license fee from \$125 to \$225, the first update since its implementation in 2005. The fee increase reflects the rising costs of staff time for inspections and the city's seal of approval decals. It would take effect for the 2026-2027 renewal period, generating an estimated \$9,300 in additional revenue.
