-- Derrick L Wilson Arrest Narrative:

On 08-18-23, I K-9 Ofc. Matthew Hansell of the Key West Police Department, was conducting traffic enforcement inbound from the Cow Key Channel Bridge.

I was positioned on US1 along the North curb observing inbound traffic for infractions. I was in contact with Deputy Ketchum, who works with the Monroe County Sheriff Department. Deputy Ketchum advised me of a vehicle coming into the city from Key Haven Blvd. in which she had an in-car radar estimate of 59mph in a marked 45mph. zone. Deputy Ketchum was unable to catch up to the vehicle due to traffic and asked for assistance.

The vehicle, described as a grey in color Volks Wagon bearing Florida tag LPJD83 came over the Cow Key Channel Bridge inside lane, heading toward South Roosevelt Blvd.

I pulled behind the vehicle and observed an additional infraction consisting of a plastic plate cover surrounding the boarder of the plate covering the State of Florida Logo.

As the light cycled green for South Roosevelt Blvd, I activated my emergency lights and siren to conduct a traffic stop. I watched as the passenger, later identified as Derrick Wilson, turned around to look back at me while putting his hand down between the center console and back seat.

As Wilson did this, I observed a person's head pop up then back down from the back seat. That person was later identified as Jessica Leatherwood.

The driver Maikol Morales, did not initially stop and I had to cycle through several emergency horns for approximately one block until the vehicle stopped.

I made contact with Morales at the driver door. Morales and Wilson are known to me through a prior traffic stop with Monroe County Sheriff Department in July. During that investigation narcotics were located on both Morales and Wilson.

As I stood by the driver side door, I could see Wilson looking straight ahead and not wanting to make any eye contact with me. Morales was equally as nervous as he barely made eye contact. Leatherwood, who I saw moving around prior to the stop, was acting as though she was fast asleep.

There was a slight odor of burnt marijuana coming from within the vehicle. Deputy Ketchum, Sgt. Malsheimer quickly arrived on scene along with a second deputy and I had everyone exit the vehicle and stand near the bus stop in order to conduct a K-9 sniff of the vehicle.

I brought K-9 Dexter out of our K-9 patrol vehicle and connected him to his six-foot lead and flat collar. I brought K-9 Dexter to the front passenger bumper area and gave him the command to sniff for narcotics. K-9 Dexter worked counter-clockwise around the vehicle and gave a positive alert to the presence and or odor of narcotics coming from within the vehicle.

I put K-9 Dexter back in our K-9 patrol vehicle and conducted a search of the vehicle, initially starting in the back seat. I utilized a narcotics cocaine wipe and swiped Leatherwood's cell phone that was placed on the trunk of the car with the side of the phone swiping positive for cocaine.

It should be noted this was the second time I have swiped cocaine off the side of Leatherwood's phone. As I continued with my search, I located several white specs of what looked to be powder cocaine off the front passenger seat Wilson was sitting in.

I had Deputy Ketchum conduct search of Leatherwood as I continued searching the vehicle. I eventually stopped searching and had Deputy Ketchum assist with the vehicle search and she was later joined by Ofc. Torrecillas.

I had Morales walk over to me so that I could speak with him further. I read Morales his Miranda Warning and asked if he understood his rights and wished to speak with me which he did.

Morales said he picked up Leatherwood and Wilson in Marathon. Morales also said he left Key West around 9-10pm.

I told Morales that I know he was not telling the truth and again asked where he met up with his passengers.

Morales eventually told me he picked up Wilson and Leatherwood at a gas station in Homestead and was heading back to Key West.

I conducted a search of Morales and did not locate any narcotics on him at that time. After speaking with Morales, I had Ofc. Clark conducted a search of Wilson, who was sitting on a bench at the bus stop and looking nervous and what can be explained as someone who looks defeated.

During the search of Wilson, Ofc. Clark pulled out a clear plastic bag from the inside of Wilson's pants and placed it on the ground near him so that he could still maintain control of Wilson.

I picked up the clear bag and saw several small clear bags containing a brown substance as well an off- white chalky substance I knew to be Heroin and possibly Cocaine base on my training and experience.

As Ofc. Clark grabbed Wilson's wrist to put him into hand cuffs, Wilson pushed away and attempted to run from Officers only to be taken to the ground by Ofc Ramos-Martinez. I unholstered my department issued taser and placed it on Wilsons lower back telling him he would be tased if he kept resisting.

Wilson was eventually placed into hand cuffs and put in the back of a Key West Patrol vehicle. Leatherwood and Morales were both hand cuffed and sat back down on the bus stop bench.

I took the suspected narcotics and eventually placed them in the back of my K-9 patrol vehicle. I spoke to Morales again and informed him of making poor decisions for `` friends``. Morales was given a warning for the traffic infractions. Leatherwood was found to not have any noticeable narcotics on her person and was allowed to leave with Morales.

Wilson was already in route to the Monroe County Jail on his resisting charge and suspected narcotics charges once I took the narcotics to the police station to be tested and identified.

Once at the station I opened the clear bag which contained several small clear bags containing narcotics. The first narcotics I tested was a brown hard rock like and powdery substance. I used a Multi-Use -Drug Test- pouch with a positive for heroin. The heroin was packaged in small clear bags for individual sales. There was another bag containing a larger amount in a rock like form. The heroine had a total weight of 19.5 grams.

I tested the off-white hard rock like substance contained in multiple smaller bags commonly used for narcotics sales. These narcotics tested positive for Methamphetamine. There were up to 20 individual bags with a total weight of 29.5 grams.

I tested another bag containing several small individual bags of an off-white substance that tested positive for crack cocaine. The crack being packaged for individual sales as well. The crack had a combined weight of 10.4 grams. The last small bag contained .2 grams of Fentanyl.

All narcotics as well as Wilsons phone were placed into an evidence locker.

Wilson was charged with following.

Florida Statute 893.135-1C2B Trafficking in Heroin. Any person who knowingly sells, manufactures or delivers and

is in constructive possession of a controlled substance in excess of 14 grams. Wilson was found to be in possession of 19.5 grams of Heroin, which is a minimum mandatory sentence of 15 years in prison.

Florida Statute: 893.135-1F1 Trafficking of MDMA. Wilson was in possession custody control of approximately 29.5 grams of MDMA packaged in individual bags for re-sale, which carries a minimum sentence of 3 years in prison.

Florida Statute: 893-13-1A1 Possession of Cocaine with intent to sell. Wilson was in possession custody control of 16 individual bags of suspected crack cocaine commonly packaged for re-sale. Combined weight of 10.4 grams.

Florida Statute: 893.13-1A2 Possession of Opium or Derivative (Fentanyl) with intent to sell. Wilson was found in possession of .2grams one bag of Fentanyl that is commonly mixed with other narcotics. This was found in the same bag as the other items that were packaged for re-sale.

Florida Statute: 843.02 Resisting Obstruction without violence. Wilson was charged with resisting / obstruction after he attempted to run from Ofc. Clark and after being taken to the ground continued to resist by pulling his hands under him and squirming to get back up.

Wilson was transported to the Monroe County Jail by Ofc. Ramos-Martinez. I placed all narcotics and cell phone into an evidence locker. My Axon BWC was used for this case.

On 08/18/2023, at approximately 04:28 hours, I (Officer Josue Ramos) was dispatched to 4100 Overseas Highway to assist K9 Officer Mathew Hansel who was on a traffic stop with Monroe County Sheriffs deputies.

I arrived to assist Officer Mathew Hansell and observed two Monroe County Deputies standing with 3 suspects. I assisted them by providing security of the individuals.

Officer Thomas Clark arrived to assist.

Officer T. Clark asked one of the suspects, a black male, identified by his Florida's Driver's License as Derrick Lesley Wilson (05/28/1982) over to him so that he could conduct an officer safety search. Officer T. Clark located a large white plastic bag containing unknown substances.

Officer T. Clark asked the Wilson to put his hands behind his back, and that is when Wilson attempted to flee from Officer T. Clark. I was standing approximately 5 feet from Wilson and Officer T. Clark, and when Wilson began to run, I conducted a front take down, grabbing onto Wilson's upper torso, and redirected him to the ground. Once on the ground I maintained a wrist lock (joint manipulation) on Wilson, and bagan to issue Wilson orders to stop resisting. When Wilson began to comply with our orders all force ceased and I placed him under arrest.

Officer T. Clark and I escorted Wilson to my marked Key West patrol vehicle. I searched Wilson incident to arrest and found nothing of note.

Seargent Karl Malsheimer took images of Wilson for documentation.

I transported Wilson to the Monroe County Detention Center without incident.

I did not have my AXON BWC activated for the incident because it was uploading videos at the Key West Police Department.

My COBAN In-Car camera was activated for the incident and later uploaded.

I had no further involvement with the incident.

On Friday, 08/18/23, at approximately 0444hrs I (Ofc. Thomas Clark 3484), responded to 4100 Overseas Hwy (Key West Entrance), to back Ofc. M. Hansell who was conducting a traffic stop.

All Officer's on scene in marked patrol vehicles in uniform with badge displayed.

BWC activated

On arrival, I saw a silver Volkswagon sedan, bearing FL tag LPJD83, pulled over. MCSO Deputies and KWPD Officers were on scene.

The vehicle was being searched by D/S J. Ketchum and Ofc. J. Torrecillas. I saw three subjects seated away from the car. Jessica Leatherwood (known to me), Derrick Wilson and Maikol Gonzalez.

I approached the vehicle to help search it. I saw a small digital scale had already been removed from the vehicle and was on the top of the car.

Ofc. M. Hansell asked me to search Derricks person. I walked over to Derrick and had him step over to me. I tried to keep the conversation light and friendly, as Derrick appeared nervous (breathing heavily and sweating profusely).

I began to search Derricks pants. Derrick had a shoe string holding his pants in the front. This is a tactic known to me from experience, where subjects tie narcotics to it, to hang near their groin.

I noticed how Derrick leaned forward, in my experience in over 11 years, this is a tactic to free the groin area from search. I had him correct his stance. I immediately felt a large bulge with plastic packaging to the left of his groin. I knew this from numerous illegal narcotics investigations to be immediately identifiable as packaged narcotics.

Derrick began to move as I grabbed the string to pull it free from the narcotics. I saw in his pants, outside his boxers, to the left of his groin a large plastic package, with a brown, powdery substance, immediately recognizable to me as Heroin. I seized the item and put it on the ground behind me (I later learned it held FTP Heroin, FTP Methamphetamine, FTP Cocaine, FTP Fentanyl, sales/trafficking amounts).

I grabbed Derrick's wrists to move to the small of his back to place him under arrest. Derrick then actively/physically resisted arrest. Derrick pulled away from my grasp and attempted to run. As I was holding onto his shirt, I removed my Taser from it's holster. Ofc. J. Ramos-Martinez, grabbed Derrick by the waist, bringing him to the ground. We placed Derrick under arrest.
