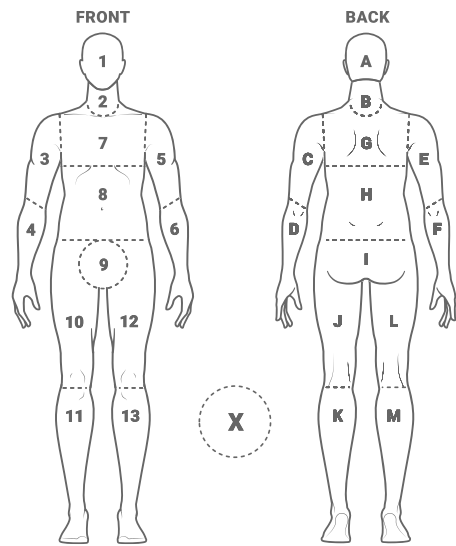

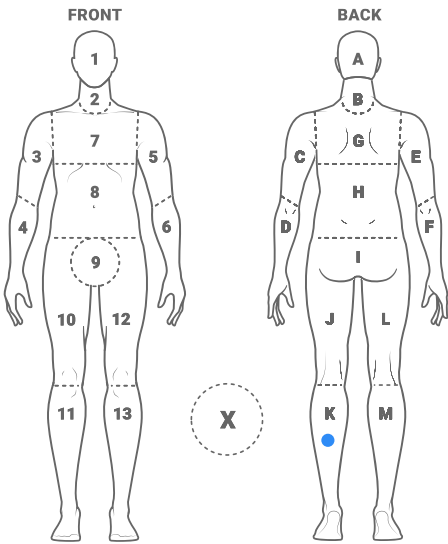

NARRATIVE OF INCIDENT

Investigation Details

On Monday, August 25, 2025 at approximately 0830 hours, I (SRO Ane, of HOB School, 1105 Leon St.), was assisting HOB staff members with the morning drop off of students. I was wearing my department issued Class B uniform, which clearly identifies me as a Police Officer for the City of Key West.

In the front parking lot, I saw a gentleman, later identified as Johnley Jean, standing on the sidewalk. Approximately 10ft to the left of Jean was a gray 2019 Nissan Altima, bearing FL Tag FKVB14. I saw the vehicle was egregiously parked on top of a yellow line and taking up two parking spaces in the visitors parking lot. As this greatly hinders all HOB parents/guardians dropping off their children in the morning, I asked Jean if that was his vehicle that was illegally parked. He confirmed it was his vehicle. I informed Jean that he needed to park his vehicle correctly. He immediately became confrontational as he yelled "Why? I'm already parked! You are just yelling at everybody". I asked him to follow me over to his car, that was clearly taking two spaces. I told him again he needed to park his vehicle correctly. He refused, so I told him I would be issuing him a citation for improper parking.

Jean continued to yell at me, when a female, later identified as Tiana Mitchell, walked over. Mitchell explained she was dropping her son (Dakari Sears), off to Pre-K and Jean gave her a ride. As Jean was still yelling, she tried to calm him down. She told him several times to stop being confrontational and just park the vehicle properly. I walked over to my marked Key West Police patrol vehicle, which was parked next to where Jean was initially standing. I retrieved my parking citation book, when Jean sat inside of his vehicle. I told Jean to exit the vehicle, which he refused to do and said he was "Calling the police". I told him I am a police officer and he needed to exit his vehicle. Jean refused again, then said he was calling the police. I told Jean if he called 911, I would arrest him for Misuse of 911, as he did not have an emergency.

Jean exited his vehicle and began walking toward the other vehicles waiting to drop their children off at school. Jean was yelling into his phone, demanding for "Police to come, because the police were yelling at him". Vehicles in the waiting line and children walking into school appeared to be uncomfortable watching Jean's behavior escalate. I confirmed with KWPD Dispatch via my department issued radio that Jean was in fact calling the emergency 911 line.

Jean was continuing to escalate his behavior by pacing and yelling louder into his phone and waving his arms around. As this created even more uncertainty in parents and students during morning drop off hours, I grabbed Jean right arm and told him to place his hands behind his back. He yelled "No!" and immediately tensed his body. He began to pull his arms away from me, when I performed a modified leg sweep which redirected him to the ground. I placed Jean in handcuffs and rolled him into a seated position.

I notified Sgt. A. Rodriguez to document my response to resistance (RRI) see RRI report for further.

Jean was issued a parking citation and his vehicle was towed from HOB property via Arnold's Towing.

Ofc. R. Perez transported Jean to the Monroe County Detention Center without incident.

I am charging Johnley Jean with one count of Misuse of 911, contrary to FSS. 365.172(14), as he did falsely use the emergency 911 system after being educated and instructed not to. I am also charging Johnley Jean with one count of resisting arrest without violence contrary to FSS. 843.02, as he did tense, pull away and attempted to impede my ability to place him in custody.

This investigation was recorded via my department issued body worn camera, which I later uploaded to evidence.com.
