SUBJECT: Resolution authorizing purchase of Fire Boat

On behalf of Chief Fraga and our department, I've prepared an executive summary and assembled the information necessary for the preparation of a resolution to authorize the purchase of a Safe Boat Brand Fire Boat for your consideration. We would ask that it be prepared for consideration by the City Commission at their November 19<sup>th</sup>, 2013 meeting to qualify for the pricing offer valid until January 28<sup>th</sup> 2014. Safe Boat LLC has also included a bonus of **\$3,000** worth of additional items such as marine equipment if order is made before December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013.

## <u>History</u>

The Present Key West Fire Boat is a 2003 25', fiberglass hull, Boston Whaler with twin 225 Mercury, T-Top and external Fire Pump. With age the Fire Boat requires extensive maintenance to keep it operational. The Fire Department requested and received funding in the 101-2201-522-64 budget for \$290,000 to purchase a metal hull replacement.

## **Evaluation**

The Key West Fire Department assembled a team of Fire Boat operators to evaluate brands and options to best fit our mission which includes not only firefighting but dive rescue and patient transport from Sunset Key and other sites offshore. The Team was made up of;

Division Chief/Team Leader Shift Commander/ Power Captain/Electronics Captain/Dive Rescue Firefighter Paramedic/Pump-Patient Care

We contacted and priced several brands with similar boat configurations and options;

The team compared the Total Cost of Ownership between a fiberglass hull like we presently operate and an aluminum hull we are seeking. The recommended life expectancy of a fiberglass hull is 6 years and aluminum hulls are expected to last 20 years with a full service life extension/SLEP/ Refurbishment at the10 year interval. The initial costs will be higher, but for the full life expectancy ownership costs are reduced using the aluminum hull in this design.
