


Key West Greenhouse Gas Emissions Inventory Report












Yard waste represents 27% of our residential trash stream, but now all of it can be recycled! You can put out as many of your clearly labeled containers as you need full of separate, clean yard waste, (no trash, no food waste,) on your recycling, trash and yard waste collection day. We'll take it all! Yard waste will not be accepted in bags. You can clearly label

your containers yourself, or pick up free yard waste stickers in the lobby of the Building Department at City Hall or at various local businesses. But be careful your yard waste isn't contaminated by nonorganic matter! If it's deemed contaminal




