WHEREAS, Glenwood Lopez, Civil Service Board for the City of Key West, member of the American Legion Post 168, beginning in 1971; and

WHEREAS, Glenwood Lopez, has been a Monroe County Athletic Official for over 40 years in various youth sports beginning in 1979, and was a College tour sponsor for FAMU & Bethune-Cookman University for 30 years,; and

WHEREAS, Glenwood Lopez, has devoted decades of service to the citizens of Key West, that service focused primarily on the development of the youth and all of the citizens of Key West.


