






FEMA Recovery Continuum






Long-Term Disaster Recovery: Monroe County Timeline









\$405,000


Funded Home Repairs:

- Elderly Twin Sisters Residing in a Family Home in Bahama Village.
- Parcel was Willed to Them by Their Deceased Mother.
- Home Incurred Damages from Previous Disaster FEMA Assistance Provided at that Time.
- Uninsured at Time of Current Disaster (Hurricane Ian).
- Fixed Income.
- Home Incurred Significant Damage Because of Water Intrusion from Hurricane Ian.
- Requests for FEMA Assistance was Denied NFIP ineligible*









A Snapshot Into Their Case...

- •Captured through Immediate MCCOAD Outreach, which Provided Urgent Support: Refrigerator, Stove, Home repairs, Food, and Sanitation. Turned Over to UWCK for Long-Term Case Management.
- •Completed Multiple FEMA Appeals for Personal Property Losses (DENIED), Home Repairs (DENIED), ONA (APPROVED), and Rental Assistance (APPROVED). FEMA Provided \$4,706.
- •Referred Survivor to ARC Event. Assisted through Application. Awarded \$2,500.
- Secured General Contractor to Provide Estimate for Repairs.
- •Completed HHRP Application to Submit to Monroe County. Survivor Withdrew Application Due to Deed Requirement/Lien Placed on Home.
- •Presented Funding Request to MCCOAD, the Salvation Army, UWCK, City of Key West, and Habitat for Humanity.
- •Project Managed Home Repairs and Coordination Between Agencies.
- •Currently Assisting Survivors in Acquiring New Windows through the County's Weatherization Program.





The End Result...

UWCK Long-Term Recovery Led a Multi-Agency Funding Effort to Provide:

- 1. Home Rehabilitation Repair/Replace Flooring, Drywall, and Painted
- 2. New Handicap Accessible-Bathroom
- 3. New Appliances Washer/Dryer, Air Conditioner, Deep Freezer
- New Furniture
- 5. Gift Cards to Replace Food and Personal Property
- Financial Relief from the American Red Cross
- 7. Assisting with Weatherization Program to Replace Windows

Looking to the Future: Lessons Learned

These are Things we as a Community Can Improve to Make us Better for Future Disasters:

Understand FEMA's Individual Assistance Program:


- -FEMA Implemented New Funding Guidelines in March 2024
- -Previously Awarded Parcel that Does Not Meet the Federal Insurance Requirements will be **ineligible** for FEMA Assistance in Perpetuity Unless Parcel Becomes Insured

Damage Assessment is CRITICAL

- -Damage Assessment Methodology should be Based on the Type of Incident
- -Report Disaster-Impacted Population Profile, Number of Uninsured Households, Impact to Infrastructure
- -Efficient, Objective, and Unified Report of Damage Assessment and Need

Blue Sky Coordination:

- -County/City Disaster Recovery Plan
- -Understand Timeframe for Local, State, and Federal Assistance (Days/Weeks/Years)
- -Identify Local Organizations/Private Sectors that can "Fill the Gaps" of Essential Needs Until Additional Resources are Available
- -Consider MOU










Looking to the Future:

- Develop/Implement a Disaster Recovery Plan:
 - -Goal = Minimize Impact and Recovery Time for Residents
 - -Critical for Local Government to Identify Entity to Lead a Coordinated Recovery Effort
 - -Establish and Maintain Contacts and Networks for Disaster Recovery Resources and Support Systems FEMA, SHIP, ARC
 - -How to Build Community Capacity in Disaster Long-Term Recovery
