AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 6 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES ENTITLED "AMUSEMENTS AND ENTERTAINMENT" BY AMENDING ARTICLE PERTAINING TO SPECIAL EVENTS; AMENDING SECTION 6-26 TO REQUIRE A DOWN PAYMENT ON THE COST OF CITY SERVICES, TO ALLOW FOR INTEREST ON LATE PAYMENTS, AND INCREASE THE COST WAIVER TO \$1,000.00; ADDING SECTION 6-27 TO RESTRICT PLACEMENT OF FOOD, BEVERAGE AND MERCHANDISE BOOTHS; AMENDING SECTION 6-56 TO REQUIRE THE APPLICATION TO LIST AN EMERGENCY CONTACT PERSON; AMENDING SECTION 6-57 ESTABLISH A MINIMUM NON-PROFIT SHARE FOR SPECIAL EVENTS IN WHICH A STREET CLOSED; AMENDING SECTION 6-58 TO PROVIDE MAJOR FESTIVAL SPONSORS APPLICATION SIX MONTHS IN ADVANCE AND APPROVE CERTAIN SALES OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; ADDING SECTION 6-61 PERTAINING HANDICAP-ACCESSIBLE FACILITIES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that a revision to the regulations governing special events and street closures would promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Key West.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA:



Section 1: That section 6-26 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows*:

Sec. 6-26. Payment for city services.

- (a) The organizer or sponsor of any festival, street fair, fair, carnival, athletic event, contest, competition, parade, fundraiser, rally, boat or car race or other special event which requires city authorization, whether by administrative permit or city commission approval, and which requires the provision of additional or extraordinary support services by police, fire, administrative, or other city departments in order to maintain order or safety or to escort participants shall pay to the city the cost of such services. A down payment of ten percent (10%) of the costs, as estimated by the city manager, shall be made to the city either by certified check or credit card at least ten (10) days prior to the event.
- (b) The city manager shall establish a cost schedule for additional or extraordinary support services for the events referred to in subsection (a) of this section, which schedule shall be subject to approval of the city commission. The city manager is authorized to provide reasonable terms for time and manner of payment. If the event sponsor fails to pay the full costs at the time determined by the city manager or, if no such deadline is

established, then within thirty (30) days after the event the city may impose an interest charge on the amount due at the rate of one and one half percent (1-1/2%) per month.

- (c) The city commission may grant special exceptions to this section for cause shown upon the public record.
- (d) The first \$500.00 \$1,000.00 of costs as specified in subsection (a) of this section may be waived for any organizer or sponsor which has qualified as a tax-exempt nonprofit organization according to state or federal law. Acceptance of this waiver by such sponsor shall render the event a public accommodation subject to the human rights provision of the section 38-225.
- (e) Any nonprofit organization accepting the waiver provided for by subsection (d) of this section shall, within 90 days following the special event, submit to the city commission an accounting of expenses and revenues incurred and generated during the event.

Section 2. That section 6-27 is hereby added to the Code of Ordinances as follows:

Sec. 6-27. Food, beverage and merchandise booths.

No booth or stall set up for a special event and serving any amount or type of food and/or beverage, or selling merchandise, shall be placed directly in front of, or within five(5) feet of the property line of, a restaurant or a bar or a retail store (selling

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primarily the same or similar merchandise), unless the owner of the restaurant, the bar or the store consents. This section shall not apply to major festivals as defined in section 6-58.

Section 3. That section 6-56 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 6-56. Application.

- prior to a proposed special event that will result in the closing of a public street, the sponsor shall submit an application to the city manager. An application may be made either by a tax-exempt nonprofit organization (nonprofit) or jointly by a nonprofit and a private person or business entity.
- (b) If the city manager approves the application, he shall then schedule it for consideration by the city commission. However, if the special event proposes to close only one block, is intended to end prior to 9:00 p.m. on any day of the year, and does not seek either a fee cost waiver or a noise exemption, the city manager may give final approval to the application.
- (c) Each application shall include the name of a sponsor's contact person and that person's 24-hour telephone number(s), in case of emergency.
- Section 4. That section 6-57 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:



Sec. 6-57. Donation of percentage of revenue to nonprofit organization.

A percentage of the revenues of a special event that causes the closing of a city street must be donated to the nonprofit organization and, at the sponsor's option, to additional charities. On the application form issued by the city manager, the nonprofit must state the amount or percentage of revenues it anticipates to receive from the special event. When a sponsor proposes a special event that will cause the closing of a city street or other public right-of-way, the sponsor must donate at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the sponsor's gross revenues or \$1,000.00, whichever is greater, to at least one nonprofit organization. The sponsor must designate the nonprofit organization(s) on the application for the event. Each named nonprofit organization must provide the city manager with a letter of assent.

Section 5. That section 6-58 of the Code Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 6-58. Major festival.

(a) A major festival is a special event of regional impact. Major festivals are: FancyFantasy Fest, Hemingway Days, Goombay Festival, Conch Republic Celebration, the Poker Run, the Valentine's Day event for Wesley House, the Red Ribbon event at Mango's Mangoes, and such other special events as may be added or subtracted by resolution of the city commission. Private persons

or business entities who sponsor major festivals are not required to provide funds to a non-profit organization per section 6-57. An application for a major festival must be received in the city manager's office at least six (6) months in advance of the scheduled event. have a non-profit coapplicant or to provide a percentage of revenues to a charitable-cause.

(b) A business that seeks to sell alcoholic beverages at a major festival pursuant to an APS state license, and which is not a bar or restaurant or other concern that sells alcoholic beverages in the ordinary course of its business, must obtain the written approval of the major festival sponsor and provide such approval to the city of Key West.

Section 6. That section 6-61 is hereby added to the Code of Ordinances as follows:

Sec. 6-61. Temporary bathroom facilities.

Whenever the sponsor of a special event provides temporary bathroom facilities on the public right-of-way, at least five percent (5%) of those facilities or one of those facilities, whichever is the greater number, shall be accessible to persons with physical disability.

Section 7. If any section, provision, clause, phrase, or application of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable

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therefrom and shall be construed as reasonable and necessary to achieve the lawful purposes of this Ordinance.

Section 8. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances of said City in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby superseded to the extent of such conflict.

<u>Section 9</u>. This Ordinance shall go into effect on January 1, 2003.

Second Reading

The following are the changes made to the Special Events Ordinance for second reading:

- Section 6-26. The requirement of certified check or credit card applies only to the down payment.
- Section 6-27. The requirement of payment for parking meters has been removed altogether. In its place is a new section concerning food and beverage booths, and a prohibition against their placement in front of or near restaurants and bars.
- Section 6-56. The contact person's telephone number is now required.
- Section 6-57. Each nonprofit organization named by a sponsor in the application must provide a letter of assent to the City Manager.
- The effective date of the ordinance is January 1, 2003.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USE OF CITY OF KEY WEST PROPERTY FOR SPECIAL EVENTS

- 1. All Applicant(s) must fill out a City of Key West (City) application form provided to you by the Office of the City Manager.
- 2. Application(s) for special event(s) must be in the Office of the City Manager 60 days prior to the event.
- 3. Application(s) must provide comprehensive liability insurance insuring itself and the City against all claims of damages or injury to persons or property arising for any reason as a result of the activities associated with the special event permitted by the City. The insurance policy shall be written by a solvent insurance company in good standing and shall provide a minimum of \$1 million general liability. The policy shall show the City of Key West as an additional named insured.

- 4. The applicant shall indemnify and hold the City harmless from all losses, claims, damages, liabilities, and expenses which may be incurred by the City or which may be claimed against the City by any person, firm to the person or property of any person, firm, corporation, or entity which are consequent or arise from the activities of the permit holder or its equipment, employees, agents, guests, licensees, or invitees for the permit holder activities or which damages/injuries are consequent or arise from permit holders failure to comply with all applicable laws, statutes, ordinances and regulations.

- Applicant(s) who are businesses or private persons who wish to close a City street must make an application jointly with a non-profit entity. When a sponsor proposes a special event that will cause the closing of a city street or other public right-of-way, the sponsor must donate at least 25% of the sponsor's gross revenues or \$1000.00, whichever is greater, to at least one nonprofit organization. The sponsor must designate the nonprofit organization(s) on the application for the event. Each named nonprofit organization must provide the city manger with a letter of assent. Applicant(s) must also hire an off-duty police officer(s) for crowd control and safety as determined by the Key West Police Department or the City Manager's Office. Applicant(s) must have neighboring businesses sign a petition of no objection to the street closure.

- 6. Within 30 days of the events completion the City Commission will receive a letter from the not for profit organization stating the amount of the monetary donation received from the event.

- Applicant(s) wishing to sell/consume alcoholic beverages on City property must have approval by the City Commission via Resolution and must hire an off-duty police officer(s) for crowd control and safety as determined by the Key West Police Department or City Manager's Office. Applicant must provide liquor liability insurance.

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8.	Applicant(s) wishing to have an exemption from the noise control ordinance must fill out an application thirty days before the event. Processing fee for the application is \$50.00.

9.	All applications are subject to approval at the discretion of the City Manager and/or City Commission. Sponsor's Signature
10	permit shall be mailed prior to the meeting at which the matter is to be considered to all property owners and occupants of property located within a 100-foot radius of the proposed special event. Notice of such proposed action also shall be published in a
	newspaper of general circulation in the city at least five days prior to the date of the city commission decision. The notice shall identify a contact person and phone number for complaints. The applicant shall pay for the newspaper advertisement. Sponsor's Signature
11.	The organizer or sponsor of any special event, which requires the provision of additional or extraordinary support services by police, fire, administration, or other city departments shall pay to the city the cost of such services. A down payment of 10 percent of the costs, as estimated by the city manager, shall be made to the city either by certified check or credit card at least ten days prior to the special event. Sponsor's Signature
12.	The first \$1000.00 of costs as specified in subsection (a) of the ordinance may be waived for any organizer or sponsor, which qualified as a tax-exempt nonprofit organization according to state or federal law. Acceptance of this waiver by such sponsor shall render the special event a public accommodation subject to the human rights provision of the section 38-225. Sponsor's Signature
13.	Any nonprofit organization accepting the waiver provided for by subsection (d) of the ordinance shall, within 90 days following the special event, submitted to the city commission an accounting of expenses and revenues incurred and generated during the special event. Sponsor's Signature Sponsor's Signature
14.	Whenever the sponsor of a special event provides temporary bathroom facilities on the public right-of-way, at least five percent of those facilities or one of those facilities, whichever is the greater number, shall be accessible to persons with physical disability. Sponsor's Signature
15.	Where a person has not applied for a special event permit and an event at it's location spills into a street, causing the police department to close all or a portion of the street, the person sponsoring the event shall pay all such extraordinary service costs incurred by the city. On each anniversary of this occurrence, if the person can reasonably anticipate an overflow of people into the street, a special event permit must be applied for consistent with this division. A violation of this section may be grounds for revocation of an occupation license. Sponsor's Signature

16. Special events may use fog, smoke and bubble machines or any device that emits a mist or spray contingent on Key West Fire Department approval. Approval must be obtained a minimum of 48 hours prior to the event. The use of confetti or confetti machines is strictly forbidden.

17. Special Events organizers must submit a adequate recycle plan for the size of the event being requested. Helpful hints and recycling requirements for special events can be found on the city's vebsite. This will help you develop your plan.

18. All special events are required to comply with the Federal Americans with Disability's Act which requires access to all areas and services provided by the special events. Organizers must insure that all aspects of their event meet the requirements.

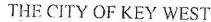

RECYCLE PLAN FOR ST. PATRICK'S DAY SPECIAL EVENT MARCH 17, 2013

This year, as every year in the recent past, Finnegans will hire Mike Basham from TRASHED in The Keys, as our Recycling Coordinator for our Irish Heritage St. Patrick's Day celebration. He will be on site during the event to monitor the recycling and clean up, thereby facilitating properly sorted Waste Management disposal the following day.

We will use recyclable plates, bowls, cups and cutlery made from sugar, corn, ecoplastic or co2 neutral plastic depending on the product. These items are purchased from TRASHED in The Keys.

Mike Basham provides recycling bins for these items as well as separate bins for glass, paper and aluminum which he labels appropriately. He provides the RECYCLE cart which has a large recycle sign displayed on top as well as large visible signs on each bin. Frequent rounds of the crowd are make throughout the day to assure all items are being discarded in the appropriate bins. Signs and recycle bins are placed at point of purchase location for food and beer as well as near the tables where the guest are eating and drinking.

During the event the smaller containers are emptied into the larger container for next day Waste Management removal. Liner bags are used as necessary in the smaller containers for easy, frequent removal and emptying.

We have a bottle crusher for the glass beer bottles which product is disposed of by Waste Management.

We will have a 6 yard front load dumpster and 55 gallon containers delivered the morning of the event which is arranged the week before. Our manager, Wayne Keller makes the arrangements with Waste Management for the dumpster.

We have provided photos in past years of the operation and those photos show what is referenced above.

Food Booth and Vendor Regulations

Vendor Booth Construction and Location

- 1. Each vendor booth shall have at least one exit way, minimum 3 feet wide by 6' height (booth frame shall not intersect exit path).
- 2. A 60-inch clearance shall be maintained between the cooking surface and any combustible canopy.
- 3. Each vendor shall stay within their assigned area, equipment and supplies shall not be staged outside their allotted space. ie: sidewalks, exit ways.

Butane or Propane equipment:

- 1. Shut-off valves must be provided at each fuel source.
- 2. Tanks must be protected from damage and <u>secured</u> in an <u>upright</u> position and must be located at least 5 feet apart from each other.
- 3. No storage of extra butane or propane tanks in booth.
- 4. Tanks not in use must be turned **OFF**.
- 5. Unused fuel cylinders shall be stored in a secured position. Unused cylinders must be located 50 feet away from all combustibles.

All compressed gas bottles, flammable or non-flammable shall be properly secured to prevent accidental tipping over.

Electrical Power:

- 1. Generators shall be placed in locations approved by the Fire Marshal's Office for "special events" use.
- 2. Refueling of generators is prohibited during event hours. No extra fuel shall be stored during event hours.
- 3. During approved refueling times, no smoking or open flames are allowed within 25 feet.
- 4. Extension cords shall be of grounded type and approved for exterior use. Extension cords shall be placed so as not to create a hazard.

Charcoal Cooking:

- 1. Charcoal cooking must be located in areas away from public access.
- 2. Charcoal cooking must be 10 feet away from combustible structures and parked vehicles.
- 3. Coals shall be disposed in metal containers

Deep Fat Frying/Flambé/Open Flame Cooking:

- 1. Deep fat frying is defined as any cooking operation or process whereby the product floats or is submerged in hot oil during the cooking process.
- 2. The cook area must not be accessible by the general public.
- 3. Deep fat frying equipment must be equipped with a temperature regulating device.
- 4. Separation must be maintained with a minimum of 3 feet clearance between deep fat frying and flambé or open flame cooking.

Fire Extinguishers:

- 1. Each cooking booth must be equipped with a fire extinguisher with a minimum rating of <u>3A:40B:C</u>. (dry chemical extinguisher)
- 2. For vendor booths, the maximum travel distance to a fire extinguisher with a minimum rating of **2A:10B:C** must not exceed 75 feet.
- 3. Fire extinguishers must be serviced annually and be tagged accordingly.
- 4. Each generator must be provided with a fire extinguisher with a minimum 40B:C rating. The extinguisher shall be located near the generator and accessible at all times.
- 5. Each cooking booth that is using deep fat fryers must have a <u>6 Liter Type K</u> (wet chemical fire extinguisher).

Miscellaneous:

Fire Hydrants – Fire Hydrants must not be obstructed at any time for any reason.

Streets – Parking is limited, therefore, do not leave your vehicle parked where it will block the street in such a manner as to prevent other vehicles from passing.

The above regulations are not inclusive of other general fire safety provisions that may be imposed upon inspection.

Any booth not in compliance will be immediately closed.

Fire Safety Tips

- 1. Know where the nearest fire extinguisher is located and how to use it.
- 2. **<u>DO NOT</u>** leave cooking operations unattended.
- 3. **DO NOT** wear loose fitting clothing while cooking.
- 4. Remove trash accumulation regularly.
- 5. Keep combustibles away from heat sources.
- 6. Do not spray lighter fluid on briquettes that have been previously ignited.
- 7. In case of emergency, DIAL 9-1-1.
