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## TIPS FOR CONCH-HEADS

Sunset dinner outside at the Westin on Mallory Square...watch all the acts and wait to see if you can see the 'green flash' as the sun goes down.

La Trotteria for Dinner (Duval & Southard St.)...you can eat at the bar and go to Virgilio's in back after for cocktails and live entertainment.

Louie's Backyard, 700 Waddell St. for cocktails at sunset overlooking the ocean...you will be on Key West time in no time.

Blue Heaven a hundred feet away on Petronia St...Lobster omelets with Bloody Mary's while roosters run around the yard...play ping pong while you wait.

Green Parrot Bar (Southard & Whitehead) live music with sound checks at 5:30 p.m. then full sets later at 10:00, oldest bar in town...authentic Key West characters.

Hog Fish Restaurant (6810 Front St., Stock Island) for fish right off the boat.

Schooner Wharf Bar & Grill, 202 William St... for lunch on Key West Bite... listen to Michael McCloud a Key West icon.

Lobos at the corner of Duval & Southard for good sandwiches.

NY Diner at Duval Square is a good bet for take-out or delivery of fish salads, pizzas or...great Stromboli too!

The Bottle Cap, 1128 Simonton St. is a Key West dive bar with good live bands.

Tennis Lessons...Paul Findlay & son Yann, 305-294-1346 run the city program...Paul's wife owns The Creperie on Petronia a block from the house a very popular breakfast and lunch spot.

Best beach...Fort Zachary Tayler Park...has concession stand and you can rent chaise lounges and beach umbrellas (about a 8 minute bike ride).

Extreme Adventure Shark Eco tours (near Westin Hotel) Capt. Dave and brother Ken chum up a bunch of sharks, and are a wealth of knowledge about marina biology in the Keys. You will see Dolphin, turtles etc. 305-508-1951

Sunset or Fury catamarans for adventure snorkeling...we especially like the trip to Sand Key.

Hurricane Hole, 5130 Overseas Highway on Stock Island has guided Kayak tours of the mangroves...and a super cheeseburger and beer at the outside deck.

Head boat for reef fishing...Greyhound out of City Pier/Charter Boat Row...2/3 day fishing trips...just show up with a cooler in the morning, or you can reserve a spot 305-296-5139.

Mel Fisher Maritime Heritage Museum...305-294-2655 Maritime history, shipwreck treasure and artifacts

Earnest Hemingway Home & Museum...906 Whitehead St. Wrote "For Whom the Bell Tolls" and "A Farewell to Arms" here.

Harry S. Truman Little White House Museum...111 Front St...walk in the footsteps of Truman, Eisenhower, Kennedy and Carter.
