This is a follow-up to the conversation Mr. Mansfield and I had with the City's outside counsel Mr. Coxe and Mr. Lockamy, regarding the attorney-client privilege waiver issue we have spoken about in the past. It is our understanding from our conversations that in order for the Commission to discuss and vote whether to provide a limited waiver of the attorney-client privilege as it pertains to the SAO investigative subpoenas served on the city commissioners and city officials back in 2024, a resolution must be put on the agenda. Mr. Coxe and Mr. Lockamy indicated that there was still time for the matter to be placed on the upcoming April agenda.
