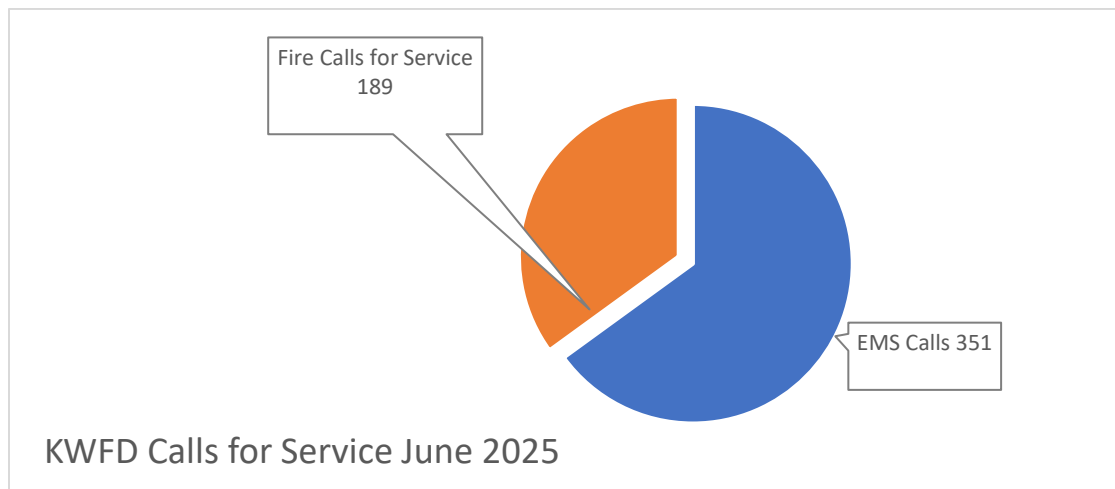

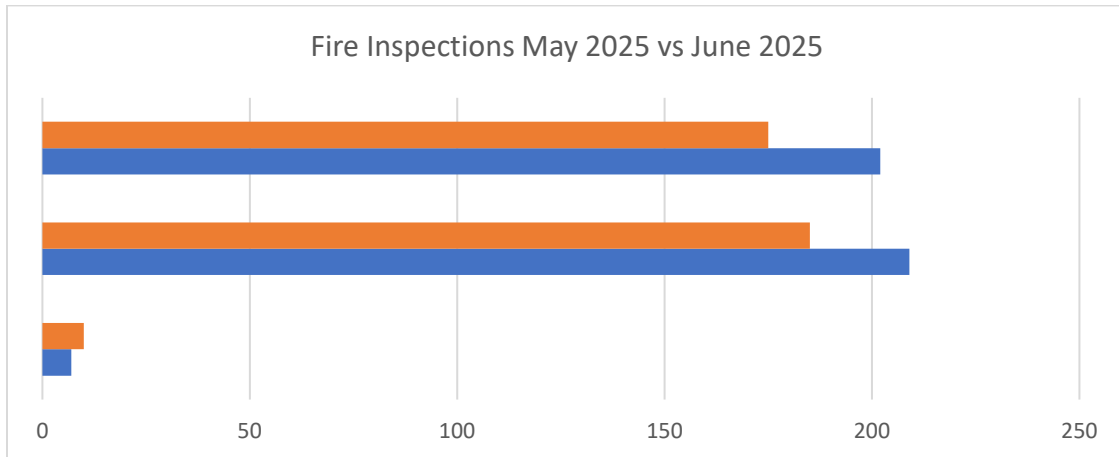
Key West Fire Report for June 1, 2025, through June 30, 2025

Total Calls 540

- 189 Fire calls for service



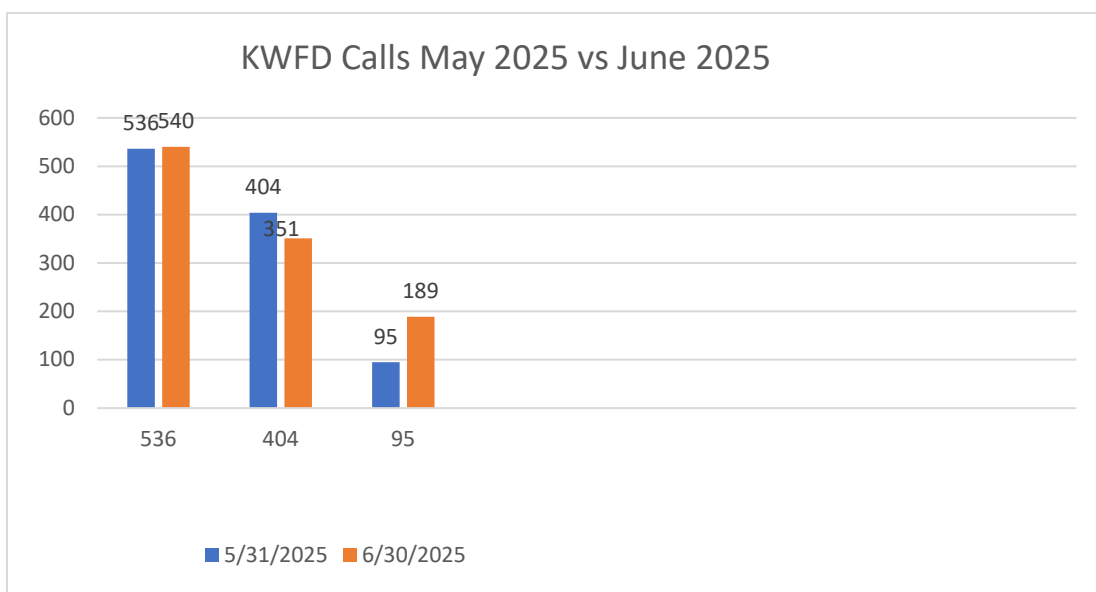
- **185 total Fire Inspections conducted by the Fire Marshal's office for the month of June 2025.**

Training

- Firefighter night operation training is designed to help firefighters develop and refine skills needed to operate effectively and safely in limited visibility conditions.
- Division Chief Gregory Barroso, Captain Timothy Anson, and Lt. Michael Anderson attended the Fire Safety Officer Training which prepares individuals for responsibilities in health and safety within fire departments, focusing on roles like Incident Safety Officer and Health and Safety Officer, with programs based on the NFPA 1521 Standard.
- Division Chief Gregory Barroso and Captain Karl Wagner participated in the Annual MCEM Hurricane Drill. This training is a critical component of preparing emergency management personnel for hurricane season, designed to help individuals, organizations, and communities effectively respond to and recover from these natural disasters.
- KWFD participated in the Annual LKMC Hurricane Evacuation Drill to test preparedness in the event of a hurricane. This was a coordinated drill with the LKMC staff, emergency management, ground and air transportation, fire rescue, law enforcement, multiple military branches, meteorologists, and community health organizations.
- EMS Chief Keith Hernandez, EMS Captain Jason Bogoeff, Lt. Brian Rose, and Lt. Carlos Barba attended the Annual Fire There, First Care Conference in Ft. Lauderdale. Also in attendance was the Key West Fire Department's Medical Directors, Dr. Antonio Gandia, and Dr. Aldo Manresa
