A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF ONE (1) FORD F550 CREW CAB 4X2 W5H CRANE TRUCK FROM BACRODT FT, LLC dba PALMETTO FORD OF MIAMI IN THE AMOUNT OF \$197,910.00 FOR WASTEWATER AND STORMWATER INFRASTRUCTURE MAINTENANCE, PURSUANT TO SEC. 2-797(3) (a) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR DESIGNEE, TO EXECUTE NECESSARY RELATED DOCUMENTS AND BUDGET TRANSFERS/ADJUSTMENTS, UPON CONSENT OF THE CITY ATTORNEY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 2-797(3) (a) of the City's Code of Ordinances provides for an exemption, when the terms and conditions of the original contract by the federal, state or local government, other than the city, are satisfactory to the city and such terms and conditions are expressly extended to other municipalities pursuant to the bid documents or by the original successful bidder, and requiring approval of the exemption by resolution of the City Commission; and

WHEREAS, the crane truck currently available to Wastewater Treatment Plant ("WTTP") staff is antiquated and needs to be replaced to provide enhanced reliability to access pump & lift stations and assist in the maintenance of the sanitary and storm sewer systems, repair grates and catch basins; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Sheriffs Association and the Florida Association of Counties published a memorandum stating they have successfully conducted its statewide competitive bid for vehicles

which includes Heavy Trucks. The contract term offered is effective beginning October 1, 2025 and running through September 30, 2027; and

WHEREAS, Fund 4013503-5356400/Machinery & Equipment currently holds a balance of \$265,000.00, of which \$225,000.00 is earmarked and budgeted for the purchase of a needed crane truck to replace the current 2006 crane truck; and

WHEREAS, the quote provided by the Florida Sheriff's Association and the Florida Association of Counties is \$197,910.00 which is under the \$225,000.00 amount budgeted and available for the purchase of a crane truck for the Wastewater Treatment Plant; and

WHEREAS, the 2006 Ford F-650 Crane Truck will be disposed of by a method prescribed by City Ordinance and managed by the City's Procurement Manager upon arrival of the new truck; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the City Commission, pursuant to Section 2-797(3)(a), finds the terms and conditions of the original contract issued by another federal, state, or local government to be satisfactory and expressly extended to other municipalities through the bid documents or by the original successful bidder.

The City of Key West, Florida, hereby authorizes a purchase exemption for the acquisition of a crane truck for the Wastewater Treatment Plant from Bachrodt FT, LLC d/b/a Palmetto Ford of Miami, the vendor whose bid matches the Florida Sheriffs Association and Florida Association of Counties Bid No. FSA25-VEH23.0: Heavy Trucks and Buses, in the amount of \$197,910.00, to be paid from budgeted funds available in Fund 4013503-5356400 (Machinery & Equipment).

Section 2: That the City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to execute any necessary related documents and budget transfers/adjustments, upon consent of the City Attorney.

Section 3: That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the Presiding Officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
