

RESOLUTION NO. 20-097

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE ROTARY CLUB OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, INC. TO CONDUCT A FUNDRAISER AND FIREWORKS ON THE EDWARD B. KNIGHT PIER (FORMERLY WHITE STREET PIER) ON JULY 4, 2020 (SET UP JULY 2, 2020 STARTING AT 7:00 A.M THROUGH JULY 5 , 7:00 A.M.); AUTHORIZING THE FUNDRAISER AND FIREWORKS DISPLAY OFF THE EDWARD B. KNIGHT PIER ON JULY 4, 2020 FROM 3:00 P.M. TO 11:00 P.M; AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AT MCCOY INDIGENOUS PARK; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission of the City of Key West, Florida;

SECTION 1. That in Resolution 19-174, the City Commission directed the City Manager to “develop language that restricts the use of polystyrene by individuals on public property, temporary vendors on public property, or entities engaged in a contractual relationship with the local government for the provision of good or services, unless such use is otherwise preempted by law.”

SECTION 2. “That the vendor/lessee/licensee acknowledges the City’s concern about the negative environmental impact of using disposable polystyrene products, which are neither readily recyclable nor biodegradable. Vendor/Lessee/licensee/contractor therefore commits to refrain from the use or distribution of single-use polystyrene/plastic items, including but not

limited to single-use polystyrene/ plastic straws, bags, plastic utensils and “to go” packages for food or products sold on any property leased from the City.”

SECTION 3. That the Rotary Club of Key West, Florida, Inc. is hereby granted permission to conduct the Fundraiser on the day and during the hours stated above; PROVIDED that all trash is adequately collected and contained; that a guarantee indemnifying the City is executed and authorizing up to the budget amount for the expenditure of the pyrotechnic; that the organization meet the terms and conditions set forth by the City Manager.

SECTION 4. That pursuant to Section 18-86 of the Key West Code of Ordinances the Rotary Club of Key West, Inc. is hereby granted permission allowing the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages.

SECTION 5. That the Rotary Club of Key West, Florida, Inc. must post the required notice regarding prohibition of purchase and sale of alcoholic beverages to persons under 21 years of age.

SECTION 6. That the Rotary Club of Key West, Florida, Inc. will adhere to the recycling plan of the City of Key West, that one (1) recycling container for every one (1) trash barrels will be used and that they will be placed side by side.

SECTION 7. That the applicant acknowledges this authorization may be revoked by this Commission, or the City Manager, due to exigent circumstances such as the resurgence of

COVID-19 in the community.


SECTION 8. That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signatures of the presiding officer and the Clerk of the Commission.

ORDINANCE NO. 02-09

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 6 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES ENTITLED "AMUSEMENTS AND ENTERTAINMENT" BY AMENDING ARTICLE II PERTAINING TO SPECIAL EVENTS; AMENDING SECTION 6-26 TO REQUIRE A DOWN PAYMENT ON THE COST OF CITY SERVICES, TO ALLOW FOR INTEREST ON LATE PAYMENTS, AND TO INCREASE THE COST WAIVER TO \$1,000.00; ADDING SECTION 6-27 TO RESTRICT PLACEMENT OF FOOD, BEVERAGE AND MERCHANDISE BOOTHS; AMENDING SECTION 6-56 TO REQUIRE THE APPLICATION TO LIST AN EMERGENCY CONTACT PERSON; AMENDING SECTION 6-57 TO ESTABLISH A MINIMUM NON-PROFIT SHARE FOR SPECIAL EVENTS IN WHICH A STREET IS CLOSED; AMENDING SECTION 6-58 TO PROVIDE THAT MAJOR FESTIVAL SPONSORS MAKE APPLICATION SIX MONTHS IN ADVANCE AND APPROVE CERTAIN SALES OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; ADDING SECTION 6-61 PERTAINING TO HANDICAP-ACCESSIBLE BATHROOM FACILITIES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, The City Commission finds that a revision to the regulations governing special events and street closures would promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Key West.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That section 6-26 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows*:

Sec. 6-26. Payment for city services.

- (a) The organizer or sponsor of any festival, street fair, fair, carnival, athletic event, contest, competition, parade, fundraiser, rally, boat or car race or other special event which requires city authorization, whether by administrative permit or city commission approval, and which requires the provisions of additional or extraordinary support services by police, fire, administrative, or other city departments in order to maintain order or safety or to escort participants shall pay to the city the cost of such services. A down payment of ten percent (10%) of the costs, as estimated by the city manager shall be made to the city either by certified check or credit card at least ten (10) days prior to the event.

(b) The city manager shall establish a cost schedule for additional or extraordinary support services for the events referred to in subsection (a) of this section, which schedule shall be subject to approval of the city commission. The city manager is authorized to provide reasonable terms for time and manner of payment. If the event sponsor fails to pay the full costs at the time determined by the city manager or, if no such deadline is established, then within thirty (30) days after the event the city may impose an interest charge on the amount due at the rate of one and one half percent (1½%) per month.

(c) The city commission may grant special exceptions to this section for cause shown upon the public record.

(d) The first \$500.00 \$1,000.00 of costs as specified in subsection (a) of this section may be waived for any organizer or sponsor which has qualified as a tax-exempt nonprofit organization according to state or federal law. Acceptance of this waiver by such sponsor shall render the event a public accommodation subject to the human rights provision of the section 38-225.

(e) Any nonprofit organization accepting the waiver provided for by subsection (d) of this section shall, within 90 days following the special event, submit to the city commission an accounting of expenses and revenues incurred and generated during the event.

* (Coding: Added language is underlined; deleted language is struck through.)

Section 2. That section 6-27 is hereby added to the Code of Ordinances as follows:
Sec. 6-27. Food, beverage and merchandise booths.

No booth or stall set up for a special event and serving any amount or type of food and/or beverage, or selling merchandise shall be placed directly in front of, or within five (5) feet of the property line of, a restaurant or a bar or a retail store (selling primarily the same or similar merchandise), unless the owner of the restaurant, the bar or the store consents. This section shall not apply to major festivals as defined in section 6-58.

Section 3. That section 6-56 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:
Sec. 6-56. Application.

(a) Except as provided in section 6-58. At least 60 days prior to a proposed special event that will result in the closing of a public street, the sponsor shall submit an application to the city manager. An application may be made either by a tax-exempt nonprofit organization (nonprofit) or jointly by a nonprofit and a private or business entity.

(b) If the city manager approves the application, he shall then schedule it for consideration by the city commission. However, if the special event proposes to close only one block, is intended to end prior to 9:00 p.m. on any day of the year, and does not seek either a fee cost waiver or a noise exemption, the city manager may give final approval to the application.

(c) Each application shall include the name of a sponsor's contact person and that person's 24-hour telephone number(s), in case of emergency.

Section 4. That section 6-57 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:
Sec. 6-57. Donation of percentage of revenue to nonprofit organization.

(a) A major festival is a special event of regional impact. Major festivals are: ~~Fancy Fantasy Fest~~, Hemingway Days, Goombay Festival, Conch Republic Celebration, the Poker Run, the Valentine's Day event for Wesley House, the Red Ribbon event at ~~Mango's Mangoes~~, and such other special events as may be added or subtracted by resolution of the city commission. Private persons or business entities who sponsor major festivals are not required to provide funds to a nonprofit organization per section 6-57. An application for a major festival must be received in the city manager's office at least six (6) months in advance of the scheduled event. ~~Have a non-profit coapplicant et to provide a percentage of revenues to a charitable cause.~~

(b) A business that seeks to sell alcoholic beverages at a major festival pursuant to an APS state license and which is not a bar or restaurant or other concern that sells alcoholic beverages in the ordinary course of its business, must obtain the written approval of the major festival sponsor and provide such approval to the city of Key West.

Section 6 That section 6-61 is hereby added to the Code of Ordinances as follows:
Sec. 6-61. Temporary bathroom facilities.

Whenever the sponsor of a special event provides temporary bathroom facilities on the public right-of-way at least five percent (5%) of those facilities or one of those facilities whichever is the greater number, shall be accessible to persons with physical disability.

Section 7. If any section, provision, clause, phrase, or application of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable therefore and shall be construed as reasonable and necessary to achieve the lawful purposes of this ordinance.

Section 8. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances of said City in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby superseded to the extent of such conflict.

Section 9. This Ordinance shall go into effect on January 1, 2003.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USE OF CITY OF KEY WEST PROPERTY FOR SPECIAL EVENTS

1. All Applicant(s) must fill out a City of Key West (City) application form provided to you by the Office of the City Manager.
2. Application(s) for special event(s) must be in the Office of the City Manager 60 days prior to the event.
3. The Permittee will be required to maintain the following types and amounts of insurance during the Special Event. All insurance coverages must be provided by insurance companies authorized to transact business within the State of Florida and must maintain an A.M. Best rating of A- or better.

Commercial General Liability with minimum limits of \$1,000.000
Business Automobile Liability with minimum limits of 1,000.000
Statutory Worker's Compensation Coverage
Employers Liability with minimum limits of \$1,000.000 injury by Accident
\$1,000.000 injury by Disease
Policy Limits and \$1,000.000 injury by Disease – Each Employee

If Alcohol beverages will be sold at the event or if the event's attendees will be required to pay an admittance fee and alcoholic beverages will be served, the Permittee will be required to maintain Full Liquor Liability coverage with minimum limits to \$1,000.000. Host Liquor Liability coverage will not be acceptable. If the Permittee will use the services of a caterer and the caterer will be providing and servicing the alcoholic beverages, the City will honor evidence from the caterer that this requirement is being met.

The City of Key West shall be named as an "Additional Insured" on the Permittees' Commercial General Liability policy.

4. The applicant shall indemnify and hold the City harmless from all losses, claims, damages, liabilities, and expenses which may be incurred by the City or which may be claimed against the City by any person, firm to the person or property of any person, firm, corporation, or entity which are consequent or arise from the activities of the permit holder or its equipment, employees, agents, guests, licensees, or invitees for the permit holder activities or which damages/injuries are consequent or arise from permit holders failure to comply with all applicable laws, statutes, ordinances and regulations.

5. Applicant(s) who are businesses or private persons who wish to close a City street must make an application jointly with a non-profit entity. When a sponsor proposes a special event that will cause the closing of a city street or other public right-of-way, the sponsor must donate at least 25% of the sponsor's gross revenues or \$1000.00, whichever is greater, to at least one nonprofit organization. The sponsor must designate the nonprofit organization(s) on the application for the event. Each named nonprofit organization must provide the city manger with a letter of assent. Applicant(s) must also hire an off-duty

police officer(s) for crowd control and safety as determined by the Key West Police Department or the City Manager's Office. Applicant(s) must have neighboring businesses sign a petition of no objection to the street closure.

6. ***Within 30 days of the events completion the City Commission will receive a letter from the not for profit organization stating the amount of the monetary donation received from the event.***

7. Applicant(s) wishing to sell/consume alcoholic beverages on City property must have approval by the City Commission via Resolution and must hire an off-duty police officer(s) for crowd control and safety as determined by the Key West Police Department or City Manager's Office. Applicant must provide liquor liability insurance.

8. Applicant(s) wishing to have an exemption from the noise control ordinance must fill out an application thirty days before the event. Processing fee for the application is \$50.00.

9. All applications are subject to approval at the discretion of the City Manager and/or City Commission.

10. Notice of the city commission's proposed action on an application for a special event permit shall be mailed prior to the meeting at which the matter is to be considered to all property owners and occupants of property located within a 100-foot radius of the proposed special event. Notice of such proposed action also shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the city at least five days prior to the date of the city commission decision. The notice shall identify a contact person and phone number for complaints. The applicant shall pay for the newspaper advertisement.

11. The organizer or sponsor of any special event, which requires the provision of additional or extraordinary support services by police, fire, administration, or other city departments shall pay to the city the cost of such services. A down payment of 10 percent of the costs, as estimated by the city manager, shall be made to the city either by certified check or credit card at least ten days prior to the special event.

12. The first \$1000.00 of costs as specified in subsection (a) of the ordinance may be waived for any organizer or sponsor, which qualified as a tax-exempt nonprofit organization according to state or federal law. Acceptance of this waiver by such sponsor shall render the special event a public accommodation subject to the human rights provision of the section 38-225.

13. Any nonprofit organization accepting the waiver provided for by subsection (d) of the ordinance shall, within 90 days following the special event, submitted to the city commission an accounting of expenses and revenues incurred and generated during

the special event.

14. Whenever the sponsor of a special event provides temporary bathroom facilities on the public right-of-way, at least five percent of those facilities or one of those facilities, whichever is the greater number, shall be accessible to persons with physical disability.

15. Where a person has not applied for a special event permit and an event at it's location spills into a street, causing the police department to close all or a portion of the street, the person sponsoring the event shall pay all such extraordinary service costs incurred by the city. On each anniversary of this occurrence, if the person can reasonably anticipate an overflow of people into the street, a special event permit must be applied for consistent with this division. A violation of this section may be grounds for revocation of an occupation license.

16. Special events may use fog, smoke and bubble machines or any device that emits a mist or spray contingent on Key West Fire Department approval. Approval must be obtained a minimum of 48 hours prior to the event. The use of confetti or confetti machines is strictly forbidden.

17. Special Events organizers must submit a adequate recycle plan for the size of the event being requested. Helpful hints and recycling requirements for special events can be found on the city's website. This will help you develop your plan.

18. All special events are required to comply with the Federal Americans with Disability's Act which requires access to all areas and services provided by the special events. Organizers must insure that all aspects of their event meet the requirements.

- Arrange for recycling containers for the grounds and a large container (roll-off or festival box) and coordinate delivery and removal arrangements. Recycling containers may be ordered from Waste Management. 305 296-2825.

- Order signs to inform customers of recycling. Signs are needed for point-of-purchase locations and recycling containers.
- Acquire liner bags for the recycling containers to be placed on the grounds. Ensure that the capacity of the bags is equal to or greater than that of the recycling containers on the grounds.
- Arrange for emptying of recycling containers during the event – from the containers on the grounds to the large container.
Arrangements made: Included in Waste Management Agreement
- Arrange for pick-up of the recyclables. The agency providing containers will often take the materials for recycling. In other cases, arrange for the materials to be taken to a recycling facility.
Arrangements made: Annual agreement with Waste Management
- Meet with vendors and tell them to ask customers to recycle the appropriate materials. Make sure vendors know what will be recycled. Inform them that signs will be posted in their areas.
- Oversee the delivery of containers and placement of signs.
- Place recycling containers next to trash cans on the grounds and insert liner bags. All recycling

- containers must be adjacent to trash barrels in order to reduce contamination problems.
- Monitor recycling containers for correct usage during the event and take actions to solve problems.
Problems:
Actions taken: Rotary Club Volunteers will monitor and empty as needed.
 - View trash barrels and note any recyclables in the trash. Take actions to solve problems.
Problems:
Actions taken: Rotary Club Volunteers will monitor and empty as needed.
 - Take photos of event recycling, record data on volumes of recyclables and trash, and ask vendors and event organizers for comments about the program
Comments: Rotary Club Volunteers will take photos.
 - Ensure that recyclables are removed and taken to the large container when bins are full and that liner bags are replaced.
 - At the end of the event, remove signs and arrange for their return to owners.
 - Place recycling containers in the pick-up location, as arranged with the providers of the containers.
 - Ask the recycling facility to appraise the amount of material collected for recycling by weight, volume, or counts and report on contamination levels.

Recycling Coordinator will:

- Educate and/or train recycling staff/volunteers, vendors, attendees and participants of event policies
- Coordinate recycle bins and the pick-up of recyclables
- Report the volume recycled to the City of Key West
- Ensure food waste containers are adjacent to recycle bins
- Stage volunteers to ensure no commingling of recyclables and trash
- Locate public recycle areas with trash receptacles near drink location
- Confirm delivery and placement of recycle bins by Waste Management
- Monitor recycle bins for overflow during event
- Confirm pickup of recycle bins and waste containers by Waste Management after the event

Minimum City Requirements

- **Recycle bins for cans and bottles within 50 feet of all drink/drink sales locations.** Rotary will have one drink sales location and a minimum of 2 recycle bins at the Sonny McCoy Indigenous Park area and 2 recycle bins for bottles and cans plus 1 large recycle bin for cardboard on White Street Pier.
- **Recycle bins for cans and bottles will be placed behind each drink/drink sales location.** Rotary will have 2 recycle bins and 2 waste bin located in the Sonny McCoy Indigenous Park parking area. Cans, bottles and food waste will be carried from the pier to the parking area bins as needed.
- **Delivery of recyclables to the recycle center shall be by the event, by Waste Management or by other licensed vendor.** Rotary has requested pick-up of all recyclables by Waste Management.
- **Place recycle bins throughout event area.** Rotary will place recycle bins around area of White Street and Atlantic Boulevard as needed.
