Original Narrative By Michael Jakubowski, 03/09/26 00:21

On March 8, 2026, at approximately 2050 hours, Officer Lopez (FTO) and I, Officer Michael Jakubowski, were dispatched to the liquor store located at Publix Plaza, 3312 North Roosevelt Blvd, in reference to an intoxicated subject harassing customers.

Upon arrival, I observed the Publix store manager waving me down. The manager stated that a male subject was at the liquor store causing a disturbance. I asked the manager if she wanted the subject removed and trespassed from the Publix property. The manager stated yes and said she did not want him on the property.

I then approached the subject near the entrance of the liquor store. The subject was later identified by a Florida identification card as Peter Maples (DOB: 03/13/1987). I had previous contact with Peter during a separate incident a few days earlier.

While speaking with Peter, I noticed he appeared restless and could not remain still. He continued walking toward me, entering my personal space. I had to tell him several times to stop and stand still. Peter handed me his ID card but continued pacing. I informed Peter that he was being trespassed from the Publix property located at 3312 North Roosevelt Blvd. I returned his ID and told him he was free to leave the property.

When I attempted to return the rest of Peter's belongings so he could leave, Peter began using his phone and asked an AI assistant if he could be trespassed from the property. Peter still refused to leave the Publix area. I again informed Peter that he needed to leave immediately or further action would be taken.

I instructed Peter to grab his sandwich and leave the area. Officer Lopez also identified himself as an officer with the Key West Police Department. At this point, Peter became very agitated. He began pacing aggressively and making angry facial expressions. Peter stated that he wanted to take a different route and continued to challenge my lawful order to leave the property.

Peter became increasingly agitated to the point that Officer Lopez stepped in and grabbed Peter's right arm. I immediately grabbed Peter's left arm

Peter responded by tensing his arms and pulling away. Due to Peter's active resistance we escorted Peter to the ground. Peter initially refused to give me his other arm. I advised Peter that if he did not give me his arm, I would deploy my Taser. Peter then complied. I placed Peter in handcuffs and placed him under arrest. Peter had no visible injuries after being placed under arrest.

While in handcuffs, Peter continued attempting to roll onto his side and tried to stand up.

Officer Lopez requested supervisors to respond to our location. Due to the fact Maples refused to follow instructions and demeanor while attempting placing him into custody. Maples was escorted to the ground. Sergeant Stutz

responded shortly after to document the response to resistance. It should be noted Officer Lopez sustained injuries on his fingers which were documented by Sergeant Stutz.

Officers Katy Hansell and Christina arrived on scene and assisted in securing Peter in the back of Officer Hansell's patrol vehicle. During a search incident to arrest, I located a vape battery and cartridge in Peter's pockets. Because the Monroe County Detention Center considers these items contraband, I discarded them. While searching Peter's bag, I located a prescription container for a medical marijuana vape cartridge. I recovered the discarded items and placed them into Key West Police Department property for safekeeping.

Peter was transported to the Monroe County Detention Center. While being escorted from the jail sally port to the intake area, Peter began to tense up and pull away from Officer Hansel and me. He became aggressive and resisted our attempts to escort him. We had to physically restrain Peter and forcefully move him into the elevator.

It should be noted that Peter has a history of aggressive behavior toward law enforcement officers. Peter was found Guilty/Admit 2/6/2020 (Def Sent/Adj Guilty) KWPD#19-3936. Reference charge Aggravated Asslt-Weapon-W-Deadly Weapon without intent to kill

Peter has a extensive history of previous offenses in City of Key West

My Axon 4567 BWC was activated

Based on my observations of the scene, and Peter Maples' refusal to leave the property after being given a lawful trespass warning, I determined there was probable cause to believe that Peter Maples knowingly and willfully remained in a structure or conveyance after being authorized to leave by a person in lawful control of the property, in violation of F.S.S. 810.08

Based on Peter Maples' actions of knowingly resisting, obstructing, and opposing officers while they were performing their lawful duties, when officers attempted to detain Peter, he physically resisted by pulling his arms away and refusing to provide his hands so he could be placed in handcuffs. Peter continued to tense his body and resist officers' attempts to control him. Inside Monroe County Detention Center, Peter again resisted officers by tensing his body, pulling away from officers, and refusing to walk as directed. Officers had to physically restrain Peter and guide him into the elevator to complete the intake process. I determined there was probable cause to believe Peter Maples violated F.S.S 843.02
