

 - Pervious Waterbodies The text amendment seeks to allow for a revised definition and limitations for the term "impervious surface".
 - Building Coverage & Accessory Structures The text amendment seeks to change the definitions of "building coverage" and "accessory structures", by changing elevated deck setback requirements and creating regulations for covered patios, gazebos, and similar structures.

- Reconstruction The proposed text amendments involve the adoption of new definitions for the terms "reconstruction", "replacement", and "repairs and maintenance".








HARC Revenue

- Attended the City Commission Budget Meetings on July 16-17th.
- Attended the City Commission Bond Meeting on July 18th.
- Attended eight (8) project site visits.
- Attended ten (10) consultant/staff meetings.
- Attended the kickoff meeting for Key West working groups for Climate Adaptation Plan
- Processed \$1,074,000 in pay applications.

Urban Forestry Work

- July TC Presented reports and processed permits
- Wrote and finalized one (1) settlement agreement (Tree Commission enforcement case)
- Attended budget hearings and wrote update as to Tree Commission budget priorities.

- Adaptation and Energy Coordinator organized and hosted Green Drinks event to promote educational awareness on "Green Building".
- Adaptation and Energy Coordinator attended the Key West Adaptation Plan Progress meeting.
- Adaptation and Energy Coordinator attended the Key West Working Group Planning meeting.

Adaptation Plan:

- Sustainability Coordinator hosted the Kickoff of the Adaptation Plan 7 Working Group chapters.
- Sustainability Coordinator assisted the Utilities Department with developing a \$750,000 application to the EPA South Florida grant for research and create a plan to reduce the seawater intrusion into our sewer pipelines.
- Sustainability Coordinator assisted HARC with developing a \$235,000, application to the FEMA Hazard Loss Mitigation Program grant for the stabilization /hardening Tiff Icehouse / Welcome Center at Mallory Square.
- Sustainability Coordinator received permission to assist the HARC Inspector with developing applications to the Florida Dept of Environmental Protection Resilient Florida Program for the Tide Valves project (\$440,600); Douglass Gym Drainage Modifications (\$750,000); and Dennis Street, Phase 2 (\$560,000).
- **EV Charger:** Sustainability Coordinator is proud to announce that the EV charger at City Hall is finally working!
- Transportation: Sustainability Coordinator hosted the monthly meeting of the Transportation Coordination Team. Primary discussions revolved around the suggested free/reduced parking idea from the Budget Workshop.

Water Quality:

 Sustainability Coordinator attended the quarterly meeting of the Sanctuary's Water Quality Protection Program.

- The Army Corps will be working with Monroe County to kickoff the next decade of Water Resources Development Act – <u>Florida Keys Water Quality Improvements</u>
 <u>Program</u> allocations for all Keys local governments. Total shared allocation is \$2M.
- **Environmental Protection:** Sustainability Coordinator received a letter from FDEP about a potential clean up at Fire Station 2. The Interim Assistant City Manager pledged to look into it.

• Other:

- Sustainability Coordinator processed ~20 procurement items, related to both Adaptation and City Planner funds.
- Sustainability Coordinator and CRA Manager spoke at Green Drinks for Green Building Month.
