COURTHOUSE PARKING OPTIONS



HOW WE GOT HERE:

History:

- 2015 the city attempts to meter the courthouse lot at night when it is not used by the courthouse
- More than 250 people sign petition and many contact their commissioners in opposition and the attempt fails
- 2018 Parking and Alternative Transportation committee unanimously recommends this parking be reserved for workforce
- 2019 July City staff puts a revenue line in the budget for metering this lot and declines to reserve this for workforce parking
- 2019 August Sustainability recommends again this parking be reserved for workforce
- 2019 August City commission votes against metering this lot and asks for other options

OPTION I

Do Nothing

Pros:

 What most city and county residents, business owners, tourists and hotels and guest houses probably want

Cons:

• City loses between 224k and 75k a year revenue. Probably 100K

OPTION II

Meter Lot

Pros:

 City receives somewhere between 224K and 75K a year in added revenue.
 Probably 100K

- Eliminates existing city and county workforce parking
- County residents have no free parking options to visit downtown businesses
- Downtown businesses lose county clients
- Significant impact on surrounding neighborhoods

OPTION III

Meter Lot and Allow Residential Permit Holders Free Parking with 4 hour time limit

Pros:

- City receives somewhere between 224K and 75K a year in added revenue.
 Probably 100K
- KW Residents retain this as a free parking option for patronage of downtown businesses

- Eliminates existing county and city workforce parking
- County residents have no free parking options to visit downtown businesses
- Downtown businesses lose county clients
- Significant impact on surrounding neighborhoods

OPTION IV

Meter Lot and Allow Residential Permit Holders Free Parking with no time limit

Pros:

- City receives somewhere between 224K and 75K a year in added revenue. Probably 100K
- KW Residents retain this as a free parking option for work or patronage of downtown businesses
- Reduces waste and simplifies enforcement at courthouse

- Eliminates existing county workforce parking
- County residents have no free parking options to visit downtown businesses
- Downtown businesses loose county clients
- Significant impact on surrounding neighborhoods
- Muddies the waters on what lots you can park in for four hours with a residential permit vs this one which has no time limit

OPTION V

Meter Lot

Allow Residential Permit Holders Free Parking with a four hour limit

Include this lot in the approved list of the Basic Workforce Parking Permit

Pros:

- City receives somewhere between 224K and 75K a year in added revenue. Probably 100K
- KW Residents retain this as a free parking option for patronage of downtown businesses
- County workers can park here for \$25 a month

- County workers now have to pay for parking
- KW City workers would have to pay for parking
- County residents have no free parking options to visit downtown businesses
- Downtown businesses lose county clients
- Still an impact on surrounding neighborhoods

OPTION VI

Meter Lot

Allow Residential Permit Holders Free Parking with no time limit

Include this in the approved lot list of the Basic Workforce Parking Permit

Pros:

- City receives somewhere between 224K and 75K a year in added revenue. Probably 100K
- KW Residents retain this as a free parking option for work or patronage of downtown businesses
- County workers can park here for \$25 a month

- County workers now have to pay for parking
- County residents have no free parking options to visit downtown businesses
- Downtown businesses lose county clients
- Still an impact on surrounding neighborhoods

OPTION VII

Meter Lot

Allow Residential Permit Holders Free Parking with no time limit

Allow any personal vehicle registered in Monroe County free parking while displaying an adhered Hurricane Re-entry sticker

Pros:

- City receives somewhere between 224K and 75K a year in added revenue. Probably 100K
- KW Residents retain this as a free parking option for work or patronage of downtown businesses
- Any county resident can still park here for free
- Downtown businesses are not impacted
- Neighborhoods are not impacted

Cons:

Possible enforcement issues

OPTION VIII

Meter Lot

Allow Residential Permit Holders Free Parking with no time limit

Allow any Truman Waterfront Park Permit holder Free Parking with no time limit

Pros:

- City receives somewhere between 224K and 75K a year in added revenue. Probably 100K
- KW Residents retain this as a free parking option for work or patronage of downtown businesses
- Any county resident can still park here for free if they get yearly sticker for \$25 – \$5 more than a residential permit

- Not really what Truman Waterfront Park Permit was intended for but pass does verify county residence
- Possibly would necessitate renaming/altering of the Truman Waterfront Park Permit
- Minor impact on surrounding neighborhoods
