**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, SPONSORING A MARTIN LUTHER KING CELEBRATION ON MONDAY, JANUARY 17, 2022, BETWEEN THE HOURS OF NOON AND 4:00 P.M. AUTHORIZING THE CLOSURE OF CERTAIN STREETS FOR THE MARCH; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE**

**WHEREAS**, the City Commission desires to provide a Martin Luther King March on the date and times herein described.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Commission of the City of Key West, Florida, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** That in Resolution 19-174, the City Commission directed the City Manager to “develop language that restricts the use of polystyrene by individuals on public property, temporary vendors on public property, or entities engaged in a contractual relationship with the local government for the provision of good or services, unless such use is otherwise preempted by law”

**SECTION 2.** “That the vendor/lessee/licensee acknowledges the City’s concern about the negative environmental impact of using disposable polystyrene products, which are neither readily recyclable nor biodegradable. Vendor/Lessee/licensee/contractor therefore commits to refrain from the use or distribution of single-use polystyrene/plastic items, including but not limited to single use polystyrene/plastic straws, bags, plastic utensils and “to go” packages for food or products sold on any property leased from the City”

**SECTION 3.** That the City of Key West hereby sponsors a Martin Luther King Celebration on Monday, January 17, 2022, between 12:00 to 4:00 p.m.

**SECTION 4.** That all provisions of the Code of Ordinances with respect to a march on the City right-of-way shall be observed.

**SECTION 5.** That the celebration will begin at the Nelson English Park (Martin Luther King Community Center) Thomas and Catherine Streets followed by the march.

**SECTION 6.** That the applicant acknowledges this authorization may be revoked by the Commission or the City Manager, due to exigent circumstances such as the resurgence of COVID-19 in the community.

**SECTION 7.** That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the presiding officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
