-- Paul Andrew Rowe Arrest Narrative:

On July 31, 2023, at approximately 2151 hours, K9 Ofc. T. Anglin, and I, Ofc. Lopez were dispatched to 3347 Donald Avenue. The caller told Key West Dispatch a male that lives a few houses down is out of control. The caller told Key West Dispatch the male started punching windows and possibly started as a domestic disturbance.

On arrival, I saw two males assisting one male that appeared to be injured. I made contact with the males and one of them told me that his friend got injured and he was going to take him to the Hospital. The male was later identified with his Florida driver's license as Donald Hinckley, (dob:11/19/1959). Donald said his friend Paul has a cut on his arm and he will take him to the Hospital. Donald's friend was later identified with his Florida driver's license as Paul Rowe, (dob:06/03/1978). Paul had a white rag on his forearm area. While I was speaking with Donald, Ofc. Hesse arrived on scene, and he began speaking with Paul.

K9 Ofc. T. Anglin was speaking with a male down the street. The male was later identified with his Florida driver's license as William Roletter, (dob:02/26/1983).

Paul was sitting on the rear passenger side of Donald's vehicle and Ofc. Hesse instructed him to step out of the vehicle. I heard a male yelling from a distance, and I began walking towards K9 Ofc. T. Anglin to check on him. K9 Ofc. Anglin was having a conversation with William. An unknown male was trying to involve himself and interrupting the conversation K9 Ofc. T. Anglin was having with William.

I returned back to where Ofc. Hesse and Paul were standing. Ofc. Hesse instructed Paul to sit down several times and Paul refused to follow Ofc. Hesse's instructions. I requested Key West Communications to have Key West Fire Rescue to respond on scene to assess Paul's injuries.

Paul exhibited an antagonistic demeanor towards Ofc. Hesse. Paul kept telling Ofc. Hesse that he served in the Military as a Marine. Ofc. Hesse told Paul that the paramedics will assess him, and he needed to wait for the paramedics. Paul said he does not want help and he needed to go.

Ofc. Hesse advised Paul that he will be placed in handcuffs if he does not comply. Paul refused to comply with Ofc. Hesse's instructions. Ofc. Hesse placed Paul's left hand behind his back while I was placing Paul's right hand behind his back. Paul began tensing up and pulling his wrists away from both of us. I escorted Paul to the ground, and I pulled Paul's right wrist towards the center area of his lower back. I placed Paul's right wrist close to his left wrist. However, Paul was pulling his wrists away from me and Ofc. Hesse. I told Paul several times to stop resisting and to stop tensing up. Paul refused to follow my verbal commands. Ofc. Hesse was holding Paul's left wrist close to the center area of Paul's lower back and Paul continuously kept pulling his wrists away from me. I pulled Paul's right wrist close to his left wrist and Ofc. Hesse was able to place handcuffs on him.

Once Paul was laying down on the ground on his stomach, Paul constantly continued moving his body as he was trying to get up.

K9 Ofc. T. Anglin took Ofc. Hesse's place, while Ofc. Hesse relocated his patrol closer to the area. K9 Ofc. K. Anglin and I continued holding Paul to the ground to prevent him from pulling away. I smelled a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from Paul's breath.

The Key West Paramedics arrived on scene, and they began assessing Paul. Paul sustained a deep laceration on his right forearm area. The laceration appeared to be approximately three inches long. The paramedic advised the laceration was deep and his artery appeared not to be compromised. K9 Ofc. T. Anglin and I assisted Paul get back on his feet. Once Paul was seated on the stretcher, he was being cooperative. Paul was transported to The Lower

Keys Medical Center for further medical treatment by Key West Fire Rescue.

I walked back towards the residence to gather more information, (3347 Donald Avenue). The front porch of this residence had numerous broken appliances, broken glass, and many items that were laying down on the front deck. It appeared as if all the objects were thrown down to the ground.

I made contact with William, who is currently married to Paul. Ofc. Hesse checked William for injuries, and he did not appear to have any visible injuries. Ofc. Hesse asked William what led to this incident and William said his husband, (Paul) was intoxicated and became belligerent.

While I was looking around the kitchen area, and living room area, I was listening to what William was telling Ofc. Hesse. William stated that a close friend passed away last week and him and Paul went out to celebrate his life. William said when him and Paul returned home, Pual called him a "Nigger". William said Paul began calling him, "Nigger" for no reason. William said he told Paul to stop disrespecting him in their own house like this. William said has a room filled with religious items of the religion he practices. William mentioned that Paul was referring to him as a "Nigger" due to his religion. William said after he told Paul that he was not going to allow him to treat him like this, Paul became aggressive. William said Paul charged at him as he was going to hit him with his hand. William said he evaded the hit from Paul by grabbing his hands and then immediately redirected him to the ground. William said Paul continued yelling at him while he was on the ground. William said he placed his foot on Paul's chest area to prevent him from attempting attacking him again. William said Paul continued showing his aggressive demeanor as if he wanted to fight. William said he had no choice then picking him up and dragging him through the front door. William said once he dragged Paul outside near the front deck, he closed the front door and locked the door.

William said Paul then broke the first window adjacent to the front door. William said Paul then broke the second window located near the kitchen area. William said Paul told him that he was going to destroy everything inside the house. William said Paul began destroying a lot of appliances by throwing items down to the ground and breaking them.

I observed an excessive amount of broken glass on the ground in numerous areas inside the house.

This incident was recorded with my body worn camera, 3722.

Key West Communications advised that Key West Fire Rescue are requesting an Officer at the Hospital. The paramedics advised the Paul was refusing to get out of the ambulance.

I went back to my patrol vehicle, and I responded to the Hospital. Once I was at the Hospital, Paul was seated on a bed inside a room. I told Paul, I will remove the handcuffs for him to get comfortable. Once I removed the handcuffs, the Doctor and the nurse were trying to assess Paul. Paul refused to cooperate with the Doctor and the nurse. I reminded Paul that the medical staff in this Hospital does not have any involvement with his arrest. I advised Paul to cooperate with the medical staff. A second nurse walked inside the room and the nurse began assessing him. Paul refused to cooperate.

K9 Ofc. T. Anglin arrived on scene, and he began talking to Paul. Paul continued denying medical care and he only received a few staples on his laceration. Paul was medically cleared by the Hospital shortly after. K9 Ofc. T. Anglin and Ofc. Hesse walked Paul outside to my patrol vehicle. Ofc. Hesse placed Paul in the rear passenger side seat of my patrol vehicle.

I later transported Paul to the Monroe County Detention Center. My In-car Axon camera was activated during the transportation, 3722.

I walked Paul upstairs to intake area. The on-duty Sergeant Correction Deputy was present while I was walking Paul upstairs. Once we were upstairs, the on-duty Sergeant Correction Deputy requested Paul to sign his property voucher. Paul refused to sign it. Paul was instructed by the Correction Deputy to see the nurse. Paul began giving the nurse issues and not following her instructions. The on-duty Sergeant Correction Deputy and one more Deputy stepped inside the nurse's room. The Deputy walked Paul towards the intake area and then Paul began pulling away from the Deputy. The Deputy redirected Paul against a counter while he was trying to gain control of his hands. The Correctio Deputy had to hold Paul against the counter to prevent Paul from getting away from him.

Paul pulled his arms away from the Deputy, and then he grabbed a wooden object that was on top of the counter. Paul picked up the wooden object and he threw it on the ground. The on-Duty Sergeant and I immediately were trying to gain control of Paul as he constantly was moving his body trying to get away from us.

Paul was placed in a cell shortly after.

The wooden object that Paul picked up from the counter, is an inmate identification holder used to hold inmate's identifications. This wooden object/display is property of The Monroe County Sherrif's Department, and it was broken after Paul violently threw it to the Ground.

I used my Axon Capture app to photograph the damaged wooden object/display. I later uploaded the photographs to Evidence.com.

Ofc. Hesse later informed me that a neighbor approached him and informed him of his damaged vehicle. Ofc. Hesse identified the neighbor with his Florida driver's license as Gregory Cieslik, (dob:10/12/1983). Gregory resides at 3351 Donald Avenue. Gregory is the registered owner of a red 2020 Cadilac four-door bearing Florida registration RQZ7U. Gregory informed and pointed at the damage his vehicle sustained. Gregory's vehicle sustained a large dent and scratch marks on the front passenger pillar. The front passenger mirror sustained several scratch marks as well. There was a piece of bed frame located on the front passenger area of Gregory's vehicle. The piece of bed frame was white in color, consistent with the white paint transferred onto the vehicle. There were other miscellaneous items laying down on the ground area that appeared that were thrown on the road close to Gregory's vehicle. Gregory's vehicle was parked in Gregory's driveway located adjacent to the driveway next door where Paul and William reside. Gregory requested Ofc. Hesse to have the damages on his vehicle documented. Gregory stated he would like to press charges against Paul for the damages on his vehicle. I estimated the damage on Gregory's vehicle to be approximately \$600.00.

Ofc. Hesse used his Axon Capture app to photograph the damage on Gregory's vehicle. Ofc. Hesse later uploaded the photographs to Evidence.com.

Ofc. Hesse informed me that Paul admitted throwing objects outside and damaging the neighbor's vehicle. Paul admitted to throwing objects out of their residence when he was inside the Hospital waiting to get medically cleared.

Based on the facts and evidence, Paul Rowe did resist and oppose to follow Ofc. Hesse's verbal commands. Ofc. Hesse instructed Paul to sit down and to wait for Key West Fire Rescue to assess his injuries. However, Paul refused to follow Ofc. Hesse's instructions while conducting his duties as a Police Officer. Ofc. Hesse and I attempted to placed Paul's hands behind his back and Paul began tensing up and pulling his arms away from us. I told Paul several times to stop resisting and to stop tensing up and Paul refused to follow my verbal commands. Ofc. Hesse and I were wearing our class B uniform with the Key West Police insignia on our sleeves. Ofc. Hesse and I were recognizable as Police Officers. Contrary to F.S.S. 843.02

Based on the facts and evidence, Paul Rowe, did willfully and maliciously damage his neighbor's vehicle. Paul threw several items outside his residence consistent with the numerous items he destroyed inside the residence. Paul had no regards with damaging the property of others, (Gregory's vehicle) while he was destroying his own belongings/items from his residence. Gregory's actions caused the damages on Gregory's vehicle. Gregory's vehicle sustained a large dent and scratch marks on the front passenger pillar. The front passenger mirror sustained several scratch marks as well. I estimated the damages on Gregory's vehicle to be approximately \$600.00. The Deputy redirected Paul against a counter while he was trying to gain control of his hands. At this point Paul picked up a wooden object from the counter and threw it to the ground. The On-Duty Sergeant Correction Deputy and I immediately began assisting the Correction Deputy to gain control of Paul. Paul actively continued resisting the Correction Deputy to the extend the Deputy had to hold Paul against the counter to prevent Paul from getting away. Once the On-Duty Sergeant and I began assisting, Pual stopped resisting. Paul was placed inside a cell. The Correction Deputy and the On-Duty Sergeant were performing their legal duties as Correction Deputies. The Correction Deputies told Paul to stop fighting and to stop moving. However, Paul disregarded the Deputy's instructions. The Correction Deputies were wearing their Class B uniform with the Monroe County Sherrif's Office insignia on their sleeves. Contrary to F.S.S. 843.02.

Based on the facts and evidence, Paul Rowe, did willfully and maliciously pick up the wooden object to throw it to the ground. Paul picked up the wooden object with his hand and violently threw it to the ground. Paul broke the wooden object that is used for the inmates to hold their inmate identifications in the booking area. This wooden object/display is property that belongs to The Monroe County Sherrif's Department. I estimated the damage on this wooden object/display to be approximately \$100.00. Contrary to F.S.S. 806.13.1(A)(B)1.

On Monday, July 31st, 2023 at approximately 2155 hours I, Ofc. J. Hesse, was dispatched to 3347 Donald Ave for the report of a male at the location out of control and breaking things. The R/P additionally stated the incident was possibly a domestic violence issue.

Upon my arrival, Ofcs Lopez and T. Anglin had already arrived on scene. I activated by BWC and observed a male subject sitting in the rear seat of a vehicle, with his right arm wrapped in a towel that clearly had blood on it. The male subject, later identified as Paul Rowe, stated indicated he had been in an argument with his husband and said he had struck him several times during the argument.

While speaking with Rowe I noted his knuckles on his right hand to be abraded and bleeding from punching something. He additionally removed the towel to reveal a laceration to the anterior aspect of his forearm, approximately three inches in length, gapped approximately ½ inch, with muscle and subcutaneous tissue visible. It was additionally noted his speech was slow, slurred, and thick, his eyes watery, glassy, and he had the strong smell of an alcoholic beverage on his breath.

At that time, I did not know the condition or involvement of any other party to the incident. I asked Rowe to step out of the vehicle and sit on the curb while the incident was being investigated and he complied. While I spoke to Rowe about his injury, he became very verbally belligerent, and then quickly stood up from his seated position, nearly falling backwards into the landscaping.

After attempts to verbally deescalate Rowe's aggression failed with Rowe refusing lawful commands, I placed Rowes left hand behind his back and indicated he would be placed in handcuffs. As I moved Rowe's left hand behind his back, he began to pull his arm forward towards his chest and I told him to stop pulling away from me while Ofc. Lopez controlled his right arm.

Rowe then attempted to forcefully pull his arm from my grasp with a sharp, jerking motion while moving forward and turning to the right. Rowe continued to try and pull away from officers to prevent being placed in handcuffs at which time he was guided to the ground in a slow and controlled fashion, into a prone position. Rowe continued to struggle to free his arms from officers with force but was secured into handcuffs that were checked for proper fit and double locked a short time later after being assisted to a standing position.

I later spoke with Rowe's husband, William, who stated no battery had occurred between the two and Rowe's statements of striking William were unfounded.

I also spoke with an adjoining neighbor, Gregory Cieslik who reported damage to his vehicle from items thrown out of

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the residence by Rowe. I observed an approximately 6-inch area of scratches and a dent on the passenger side A-pillar of Cieslik's vehicle, which also contained several small drops of blood around the area. Cieslik reported the damage was not there prior to the incident, he also indicated a large piece of a wooden headboard was found immediately next to the vehicle just prior to officers' arrival at the location.

I later asked Rowe about the damage to the vehicle, and he indicated the items he threw towards the vehicle likely caused the damage that was reported by Cieslik. While Rowe stated he did not remember much about the incident, including the struggle with officers, he did remember destroying several items inside and outside the residence.
