-- Danny Gabriel Aguilar Vasquez Arrest Narrative:

On May 5, 2024, at approximately 1757 hours, I, Ofc. Bernatova, was dispatched to a traffic crash, that occurred on Howard England Way, short distance East of the entrance/exit gate to Fort Zachary State Park.

\*\*\*BWC activated\*\*\*

Upon arrival, I was flagged down by one of the park rangers, who pointed out a white male sitting on a curb and told me the male was the driver of the vehicle involved in the crash. I exited my marked patrol car, and initiated the contact with the driver, identified by his Learner's Florida driver's license as Danny Aguilar Vasquez, DOB 12/09/2002. I directed Ofc. Davis who arrived on scene right after me to go assess the crash scene and talk to the witnesses while I talked to Danny.

I asked Danny what happened, and he told me the left tire on his truck blew up and he drove off the road. There was a slight language barrier, so I requested Ofc. Ramos to respond for translation to Spanish Language. I asked Danny if he was in the truck by himself and he said his uncle was the passenger. Danny told me his uncle left the scene before the police arrived, because he was an illegal immigrant and was scared. I asked Danny for his uncle's name and he refused to give it to me. I explained to Danny I needed his uncle's information for the traffic crash report but he refused to give me any information about him. I explained to Danny that he only had a learner's permit that requires him to always have the licensed driver in the passenger seat, and Danny told me his uncle did not have the valid driver's license anyway.

While talking to Danny, I could smell the strong odor of alcoholic beverage coming from his breath, and his eyes were glassy watery and bloodshot.

Key West Rescue responded and confirmed with Danny he was not injured in any way.

Ofc. Ramos arrived at the scene, and I asked him to stand by Danny while I looked at the crash scene.

I walked over to where Danny's truck came to a final rest and photographed the damage. Danny's Nissan truck (bearing Florida license plate 86EDEN) was off the road, in the grass area, and there was a substantial damage to the front passenger side and front bumper. None of the tires were flat or damaged. Ofc. Davis and I walked approximately 500 feet East away from the front gate and found the area of initial impact. The truck hit and broke wooden fence separating the road from the grassy park area. The back portion of the passenger side mirror was found next to the broken fence.

Ofc. Davis relayed the information he gathered from the witnesses to me. From the witness statements and the damage, it was clear that the truck was traveling West on Howard England Way in a high rate of speed, hit the fence with its front passenger side, continued to negotiate a curve on the road and pass the golf cart and another vehicle in front of the golf cart on the right side, and ran off the road into the soft dirt/grass area next to the road. According to the witnesses, the truck tried to back out of the dirt, but the wheels were just digging deeper into the dirt. Danny then exited the driver's seat and got into an altercation with the passengers of the golf cart and the vehicle in front of the golf cart. An unidentified male exited the passenger seat and left the scene on foot. One of the rangers (Brooke Foley, DOB 06/01/2001) stepped in when Danny pushed one of the witnesses, and made Danny sit down on a curb, and stayed with him, unit I arrived.

Ofc. Davis said the witness that was pushed (Tas Adem, DOB 07/14/1987) did not wish to press charges and just wanted to leave.

I was making my way back to Danny and Ofc. Ramos, when I stopped to talk to Tas, before he leaves. While talking to Tas, one of the rangers yelled at me and pointed at the area where Danny was sitting. All I could see was the bush shaking, so I ran over there, and saw Ofc. Ramos struggling with Danny under the bush. Ofc. Ramos had hold of Danny's lower body and asked me to take control of his upper body. I tried to grab Danny's wrists, but he was fighting and punching at Ofc. Ramos and me. I was not able to get ahold of Danny's arms right away, and he kept inching his way from under us to the road. While on his back, Danny was preventing us from securing his hands by swatting our hands away and actively punching at us. Danny managed to punch me with his closed fist to my left eye. I was able to place my left knee on Danny's chest and Ofc. Ramos took hold of his right arm - keeping it pressed under his neck, I took hold of Danny's left wrist but because he was still actively resisting and trying to get out from under us, I took out my department issued taser in attempt to drive stun Danny into compliance. Danny was not listening to our verbal commands to stop fighting and kept freeing his hands from our hold. I drive-stunned Danny to his left arm for approximately 5 seconds, but then he was able to get hold of my taser with his right hand pinned under his neck by Ofc. Ramos. Danny managed to turn my taser against my right leg I was using for support, and drive stun my left shin. At some point in this struggle, both taser cartridges were deployed and hit no person (one of them I later collected from the nearby tree branch). Ofc. Davis eventually joined our efforts to subdue Danny, and we were able to turn him into a prone position and place him in handcuffs behind his back. When Danny was being searched prior to being placed at the back of my patrol car, Danny was still actively resisting and trying to escape, while making the death threats to all of us in Spanish.

Ofc. Ramos received a punch to his left eye orbital from Danny that immediately swelled to the size of a tennis ball. Ofc. Ramos later told me that while he was talking to Danny who was seated on a curb, Danny started to act fidgety, stood up, and refused to obey verbal commands from Ofc. Ramos to sit back down. Ofc. Ramos swiped Danny's feet and assisted him down on the ground in a controlled manner. Danny started immediately fighting and punching at Ofc. Ramos and managed to hit him with his right closed fist, causing a serious swelling in the area of Ofc. Ramos's left eyebrow and temple.

Key West Rescue responded back to the scene and transported Ofc. Ramos to Lower Keys Medical Center for further evaluation and treatment.

I later asked Ofc. Davis if he was injured by Danny, and he said he was not but Danny spit in his direction while he was holding him down in a prone position. I witnessed this as well.

I placed a spit mask on Danny, and we placed him at the back of my patrol vehicle (Axon rear camera activated). While at the back of my patrol car, Danny continued with death threats towards me and Sgt. Williams who arrived at the scene to talk to Danny. Danny managed to slide his lower body through the arms handcuffed behind his back and rip off the spit mask. K9 Ofc. M. Hansell arrived at the scene and helped to re-handcuff Danny behind his back, apply an additional set of handcuffs and a hobble device.

Danny's truck was towed from the scene by Arnold's Towing Company.

I transported Danny to Lower Keys Medical Center for medical clearance. Danny fell asleep during transport and vomited at the back of my car. After Danny was medically cleared, I transported him to Monroe County Detention

Center DUI Room. Ofc. Davis assisted me in case Danny wanted to fight again. Ofc. Davis called MCSO Deputy Reyes to help us translate the rest of the contact with Danny over the phone.

I advised Danny that the traffic crash investigation was completed, and I was now starting a criminal investigation for DUI. Deputy Reyes recited Danny Miranda Warnings and Danny said he did not wish to speak to us without a lawyer.

I asked Danny if he would submit to the voluntary field sobriety exercises to dispel my belief he was driving under the influence, and he said he would.

Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN)

Danny had equal pupil size, no resting nystagmus, and was able to track the stimulus equally with both eyes. Danny had a lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes.

Danny exhibited distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation and onset of nystagmus prior to 45-degree angle in both eyes (at approximately 30-degree angle).

Danny was swaying during this exercise.

Walk and Turn (WAT)

I explained the exercise to Danny and provided an example/demonstration on the fixed line.

During the instruction phase, Danny was not able to stay in the position.

Danny said she understood the instructions.

Danny did not touch heel to toe on most steps, stepped off the line - virtually walking next to the line for part of the exercise, stopped walking to steady himself, took wrong number of steps, and performed an improper turn. Danny did not count his steps out loud.

One Leg Stand (OLS)

I explained the exercise to Danny and provided a demonstration. Danny said he understood the instructions. Danny was swaying while balancing, used his arms for balance, put his foot down twice, did not keep his legs straight and did not count out loud. I stopped the exercise a few seconds early because Danny was at risk of falling. This exercise was timed using my stopwatch.

I informed Danny I will be charging him with DUI as well and asked him if he will provide the breath sample. Danny said he would.

I initiated a twenty-minute observation period on Danny at 2040 hours.

When the observation period was over, I entered the BTO room at MCDC with Danny and entered all the necessary information into Intoxilyzer 8000.

My Breath Test Operator license number is 386437.

Danny provided two (2) valid breath samples: 0.178 g/210L at 2104 hours and 0.170 g/210L at 2107 hours.

Intoxilyzer 8000 printed Breath Alcohol Test Affidavit with results and I signed it, had it notarized and provided Danny with the copy. I explained the results to Danny at 2110 hours.

It should be noted that the samples of Danny's breath were collected more than 3 hours after the crash. The average breath/blood alcohol level concentration drops approximately 0.015 every hour.

I issued Danny following citations:

AJQSUEE for DUI and damage property

AJQSUFE for Violation of learner's permit restrictions.

I explained both citations to Danny, he signed the criminal citation, and I provided him with the copies.

Danny is to appear in front of the Honorable Judge Wilson on 05/17/2024 at 0900 at 500 Whitehead Street.

After I passed Danny to correction deputies and handed over the bag with his belongings, I was notified by MCSO Sgt. C. Rodriguez that there was a baggie hidden under Danny's smartphone cover. I photographed the baggie and took it down to Sally Port to my patrol vehicle. K9 Ofc. Hansell responded to Sally Port and field tested the small amount of white and pink crystal-like substance (positive for MDMA). K9 Ofc. Hansell transported the baggie and submitted it to KWPD Property/Evidence Section to be send to FLDE Lab for analysis.

Based on all the facts and circumstances I found probable cause Danny was operating a vehicle under influence, with unlawful breath alcohol level over 0.15 g/210 L, when he caused a crash with property damage, violating FSS 316.193(3)(c)(1).

Based on all the facts and circumstances I found probable cause Danny was obstructing the crash investigation by refusing to provide the passenger's information, violating 843.02 Resisting officer without violence.

Based on all the facts and circumstances I found probable cause Danny was resisting the officers with violence by knowingly and intentionally punching at Ofc. Ramos and I, violating FSS 843.01 Resisting officer with violence.

Based on all the facts and circumstances I found probable cause Danny knowingly and intentionally struck Ofc. Ramos and I, turned my activated taser against my leg, and attempted to spit on Ofc. Davis, violating FSS 784.07(2)(b) Battery on LEO (3 counts).

Based on all the facts and circumstances I found probable cause Danny made verbal threats towards Ofc. Ramos, Ofc. Davis, Sgt. Williams and - I to find us after the incident and kill us, violating FSS 838.021(3)(b) Corruption by threats against public (4 counts).

At the time of this incident, Ofc. Ramos, Ofc. Davis, Sgt. Williams and I were on duty, executing our legal duties in full Key West Police Department uniform, clearly identifiable as a Police Officer; based on a badge emblem that reads "Officer Key West Police FLA", above our left breasts, and "Key West Police" patches on each shoulder. There were also several marked patrol police vehicles at the scene, and I personally introduced myself to Danny as a police officer at the beginning of our interaction.

On 05/05/2024, at approximately 18:06 hours, I (Officer Josue Ramos) was dispatched to assist Officer Andrea Bernatova for Spanish translation as she conducted a traffic crash investigation at 601 Howard England Way (Fort Zachary Taylor).

I arrived and met with Officer Sean Davis and Officer Andrea Bernatova who was speaking to Hispanic male, who was believed to be the driver of the vehicle involved in the traffic crash. The male was identified as Danny Gabriel Aguilar Vasquez (D.O.B-12/09/2002).

I spoke to Vasquez, and he appeared to be in an upset mood. I asked Vasquez what had occurred, and he stated that he had blown a tire, and lost control of his vehicle. Vasquez stated he then got stuck in the wooded area the vehicle was located at. I asked Vasquez if he had another passenger in the vehicle and he stated he did have another passenger. Vasquez stated the passenger left because of his immigration status. I asked Vasquez if he could identify the man. Vasquez stated he knew the man but would not identify him.

As I spoke to Vasquez, I observed him become fidgety. Vasquez began asked me what we were waiting for. I advised Vasquez that Officer A. Bernatova and Officer S. Davis were conducting an investigation and once they were done, they would advise him of the next steps in the process. Vasquez stated he understood.

While I stood with Vasquez he abruptly stood up, placing his cell phone and hands in his pocket. I asked Vasquez to remove his hands from his pockets, and to sit back down on the curb. Vasquez removed his hands from his pocket but ignored my request to sit back down on the curb. I then ordered Vasquez to sit back down. Vasquez crossed his arms and laughed at my request. I advised Vasquez that if he did not comply, I would sit him on the ground. Vasquez laughed again and turned away from me. I then initiated a successful leg sweep on Vasquez. Vasquez was redirected to the ground. In my attempts to gain compliance of Vasquez I tripped over the curb he was seated at and began to stumble to the ground as well. I momentarily lost control of Vasquez when I impacted the ground. In that moment Vasquez became combative. I attempted multiple compliance techniques on Vazquez, but he continued to be combative. Vasquez kicked and punched at me. Officer A. Bernatova came over to assist. Vasquez began to deliver closed fist punches to Officer A. Bernatova and I. Vasquez struck Officer A. Bernatova in the left side of her face. Vasquez punched me multiple times to the left side of my face above my left eye, causing it to swell.

Officer A. Bernatova and I continued to try and gain compliance from Vasquez. Officer A. Bernatova drive stunned Vasquez to gain compliance and it had no effect.

While I gained control of Vasquez's upper body using pain compliance techniques, I heard two discharges from Officer

Officer A. Bernatova, Officer S. Davis and I escorted Vasquez to the rear of Officer A. Bernatova's marked Key West Patrol Vehicle.

Vasquez continued to be combative, and attempted to spit, kick, and hit us with his head. Officer A. Bernatova placed a spit shield over Vasquez. Officer A. Bernatova, Officer S. Davis and I searched Vasquez for Officer Safety.

Officer S. Davis and I placed Vasquez in the rear of Officer A. Bernatova's vehicle.

I was advised by Officer A. Bernatova and Officer S. Davis that my left eye was starting to swell.

Key West Fire Rescue was called to further evaluate my injuries.

Due to the swelling of my eye, I was transported to Lower Keys Medical Center for further evaluation by Key West Fire Rescue.

On May 05, 2024, at approximately 1757hrs, I (Ofc. Davis) and Ofc. Bernatova responded to 601 Howard England Way (Fort Zachary) regarding a crash with unknown injuries.

Upon arrival, I observed a Hispanic male, later identified as Danny Vasquez, sitting on the ground with a Park Ranger. While Ofc. Bernatova went to speak with Vasquez, I was escorted to Vasquez's truck, which was offroad in a ditch.

Ofc. Ramos arrived shortly after to translate because Vasquez only speaks Spanish.

Ofc. Bernatova and I were informed by park rangers that the property had damage, which was also the first point of impact. We walked to the damaged property to collect evidence and take photos while Ofc. Ramos stayed with Vasquez.

Upon my return to the scene, I interviewed several witnesses, including Adem Tas, who I later discovered was a victim.

According to the main witness, Greg Schmidt, the following events occurred. Schmidt stated that while exiting the park, he was driving behind Tas. Vasquez was driving behind him but then sped up and overtook them on the right-hand side. Once Vasquez overtook them, he lost control of the vehicle and ended up in a ditch. Immediately, an unidentified male sitting in the passenger seat exited the car and ran away. Vasquez then went over to Tas, started yelling at him, and pushed him. At this point, the Park Rangers intervened and called 911.

After talking to Schmidt, I spoke with Tas. Tas' account was consistent with Schmidt's except for his belief that his vehicle was hit by Vasquez's car.

I didn't notice any damage to Tas' vehicle.

After gathering information from witnesses and victims, I returned to Vasquez's vehicle to initiate the towing process. Suddenly, I heard Officer Ramos shouting for assistance. I immediately ran towards the commotion and witnessed Vasquez violently resisting Officer Ramos and Bernatova. After a brief struggle, Vasquez was eventually subdued. While Vasquez was taken into custody, he continuously made threats, which included killing Ofc. Bernatova, Ramos, and I. Vasquez also attempted to spit in my face but missed it. During the search of Vasquez's person, he continued to threaten us and bang his head on the patrol vehicle.

Vasquez was transported by Ofc. Bernatova to Lower Keys Medical Center, followed by the Monroe County Detention Center, where I met her to assist with Vasquez.

On May 5th 2024, I K-9 Ofc. Matthew Hansell of the Key West Police Department responded to Fort Zachary Taylor State Park, after hearing officers struggling with a subject during a DUI investigation.

Upon arrival, I met with Ofc. Bernatova and Ofc. Ramos, who had been in what they described as a fight with the suspect Danny Aguilar-Vasquez. Aguilar-Vasquez was being investigated for possible DUI when he began fighting with officers.

I noticed swelling above the left eye of Ofc. Martinez, who told me he was punched in the face by Aguilar-Vasquez. Ofc. Bernatova had several scrape marks on her left hand and a bruise on the inside of her upper forearm. Both Officers looked as if they had been in a fight.

I assisted with a tow slip of the Aguilar-Vasquez vehicle and collecting taser probes and wires. During the course of the investigation Ofc. Bernatova informed us that Aquilar-Vasquez had moved his handcuffed hands from behind him to in front of him as he sat in the back seat of her patrol vehicle.

This created a safety concern as Aguilar-Vasquez could use the hand cuffs as a weapon against officers or attempt to destroy the inside of the police vehicle in an attempt to escape.

Ofc. Smith and Ofc. Martinez took Aquilar-Vasquez out of Ofc. Bernatova's patrol vehicle and I applied a hobble device to Aguilar-Vasquez legs. This device is used to restrain an uncooperative subject from further inflicting harm to officers as well as themselves.

I took the remaining length of the hobble and attached the clip to my set of handcuffs I applied along with the original handcuffs applied by officers prior to my arrival. This was done so that Aguilar-Vasquez could sit in the police vehicle in a normal restrained position but would not be able to move his hands underneath him again. I double locked my handcuffs and checked the first set of handcuffs to make sure they were locked as well.

After assisting with re-securing Aquilar-Vasquez, I moved Ofc. Martinez vehicle to the KWPD horse barn as he was transported by Key West Fire Rescue to Lowe Keys Medical Center to have his injury looked at.

I took no further action.

My Axon Body Camera was used for this case.
