Anderson Arrest Narrative:

On April 05, 2026, at approximately 01:27hr, Ofc. S Anderson, responded to a physical altercation near the 800 block of Duval Street. Key West communications advised over the radio four males were actively engaged in a physical altercation.

Upon arrival I observed a male on the ground struggling with another in front of a crowd at the corner of 801 Duval St. It was made clear by the crowd that one of the males, later identified as Andrew Jed Atencio (dob4/30/2001) of Colorado, was the person who had started the fight. Officer Williams and I determined Atencio should be detained while we investigated the fighting. We assisted the male to his feet and placed him in handcuffs while securing him against the side of a patrol car. While being placed in handcuffs Atencio was tensing his arms and attempting to pull his arms away from us. Officer Williams secured the handcuffs and then Atencio began kicking. Officer Christina helped control Atencio. In the process both Officer Williams and Christina were kicked by Atencio in the legs and stomach.

Due to the level of active resistance from Atencio, he was escorted to the ground to establish control. While on the ground officers gave loud verbal commands for Atencio to stop resisting and stop fighting. He continued to resist us. Officer Lopez arrived on scene and delivered a drive stun with his taser to Atencio's abdomen which ultimately gained compliance.

Atencio was placed in the back of a patrol vehicle without further issue. The on-duty supervisor, Sergeant Stutz and rescue were called to respond.

Rescue transported Atencio to Lower Keys Medical Center for evaluation. The hospital gave medical clearance for Atencio.

Both my AXON body worn camera and fleet camera were activated during this call and were uploaded to Evidence.com

I find probable cause that Atencio is in violation of FSS 877.03 Disorderly Conduct; for fighting on a public sidewalk in front of a crowd of people.

I find probable cause that Atencio is in violation of FSS 843.02 Resisting without Violence; when he was tensing his arms and pulling away from Officer Williams and myself while we placed him in handcuffs.

I find probable cause that Atencio is in violation of FSS 843.01 Resisting with Violence; as he was throwing his body and kicking in an attempt to break officers' control of him.

I find probable cause that Atencio is in violation of FSS 784.07-2b Battery on a Law Enforcement Officer; for kicking both Officers Williams and Christina in the legs and stomach during his arrest, both Ofc. Williams and Ofc. Christina were in KWPD Class B uniform and easily recognizable as Officer in performance of their duties.

Williams Supplemental:

On Sunday, April 5, 2026, at approximately 0124 hours, I, Officer J. Williams, was dispatched to 801 Duval Street in reference to a physical disturbance.

Upon arrival, I observed a white male, later identified as Anthony Atencio (DOB: 04/30/2001), actively engaged in a physical altercation with an unidentified male outside of the establishment.

I immediately intervened and attempted to detain Atencio by placing him into handcuffs and escorting him to the rear of my patrol vehicle. While

doing so, Atencio began pulling away and actively resisting my lawful efforts to detain him. Atencio's resistance escalated into violent behavior, including kicking and physically pulling away from officers.

Officer Christina and Officer Lopez arrived on scene and assisted in attempting to gain compliance. Despite repeated lawful commands, Atencio continued to resist and kick, striking both myself and Officer Christina during the incident. Due to Atencio's continued violent resistance, officers utilized necessary force and took Atencio to the ground in an attempt to gain control and place him into custody.

Officers were eventually able to place Atencio into the rear of the patrol vehicle; however, he continued to actively resist while inside. Due to his continued non-compliance and violent behavior, Officer Lopez deployed a department-issued Taser in drive stun mode, after which Atencio complied and officers were able to safely secure him.

Through my investigation, I learned that Atencio had been inside the club located at 801 Duval Street, where he was involved in a physical altercation with multiple individuals. Witness statements and scene observations indicated that Atencio was actively fighting, punching individuals, and causing a disturbance inside the establishment. The altercation then continued outside of the club, where Atencio was again observed fighting with an unidentified male.

Rescue 2 responded to the scene and evaluated Atencio for any injuries sustained during the incident. Atencio, along with Officer J. Williams, was subsequently transported to Lower Keys Medical Center without incident for medical evaluation.

Nothing further at this time.

Lopez Supplemental Report:

On April 05, 2026, at approximately 0129 hours, Ofc. J. Lopez responded to a physical altercation to the 800 block of Duval Street. Key West communications advised over the radio four males were actively engaged into a physical altercation. Key West communications dispatched two officers. However, I determined it was necessary to respond to the above-mentioned area to assist the officers.

When I arrived at the above-mentioned location, I saw a male on the ground near the curb area. Outside of 801 Duval Street. Ofc. D. Christina and Ofc. J. Williams appeared to be trying to gain control of the male. I saw the male actively resisting the above-mentioned officers. I saw the male on the ground beginning to kick, and I placed my knees on top of his legs to prevent the male from kicking the officers. Ofc. D. Christina told me to open the door of a Key West Police marked vehicle. When I opened the door, the male began to kick the officers and actively refusing to get into the vehicle. I pulled my department issued TASER. I told the male to stop resisting or he was going to be tased. The male was still kicking, and I had to Drive-stun against the male's abdomen area. The male did not comply, and I had to Drive-stun the male approximately two more times. The male then told me to stop and then complied briefly. The male was eventually placed in the rear side seat of a vehicle.

I advised Key West communications of my TASER used on Drive-stun.

My body-worn camera was activated, 3722.

I noticed a male standing near the area, and I asked if he had witnessed what happened. The male was identified with his Florida driver's license as Jeffrey S. Lane. I asked Lane to walk a few steps away from the loud area to be able to speak with him. When asked, Lane stated he was standing on the sidewalk adjacent to 801 Duval Street. Lane mentioned he was close to the intersection of Duval Street and Petronia Street. When asked, Lane stated he saw a male walking and screaming as he approached the above-mentioned area. Lane stated he walked toward "Geroge." Lane stated George was the male wearing a dark colored sweater and pointed at the male by name of George. Lane stated he saw the unknown male striking George on the face. When asked, Lane stated he saw the unknown male pushing George against the wall of the establishment located at 801 Duval Street. When asked, Lane stated he did not know why the unknown male was aggressive. Lane described the unknown male as acting, "Nuts." Lane

stated an unknown male with a beard had to intervene. Lane stated the male who had intervened had walked toward the Petronia Side.

The male described by the name of George was later identified as George Darden III.

The unknown male who was reported initiating the physical altercation was later identified as Andrew J. Atencio.

I located a male matching the description. The unknown male who with a beard who was later identified with his Florida driver's license as Dominic S. Bioni.

Bioni stated he was in the area and while he parked a scooter near the area he saw what was going on. When asked, Bioni stated he had to intervene by restraining Atencio due to his aggressive approach toward George. Bioni demonstrated how he had to restrain Atencio, which he described by getting behind Atencio and wrapping his arms around him to protect George from getting physically battered. Bioni stated he did the best he could to stop the aggressive male. When asked, Bioni stated he did not sustain any injuries.

A male was in the area, and he was identified as Sean P. Dermody.

Dermody stated he had to intervene to help Bioni during the situation.

I spoke with Darden and he stated Atencio was drunk and did not comprehend why Atencio became aggressive with him. When asked, Darden stated he was pushed by Atencio and other males intervene. When asked, Darden stated he did not sustain any injuries. When asked, Darden stated he did not wish to pursue charges against Atencio.

Darden filled out a refusal form wishing not to pursue charges. I later submitted the form into the Key West Records Division.

This incident was captured with my body-worn camera, 3722.

I informed Ofc. S. Anderson with the information I had gathered.

Christina Supplemental:

On 04/05/2026 at approximately 0126 hours I responded to 801 Duval St, in regard to a physical disturbance.

upon my arrival Officer J. Williams was already with the suspect. Due to this I located a victim and began to speak with him. Before I could start the investigation. I observed the suspect fighting with Officer J. Williams and Officer S. Anderson. There was also a civilian assisting. Due to the civilians involvement I determined intervention was necessary. I approached took physical control of the suspect at which time he started to kick behind him typically referred to as a "donkey kick" striking me in the right knee. Due to that he was guided to the ground. Once on the ground he was placed in the recovery position. He was then guided back to his feet. I instructed Officer Williams to open the rear door on his patrol vehicle. Once open the suspect grabbed Officer Williams pulling us into the patrol vehicle. Officer Lopez had arrived at this point. Ordering the suspect to comply to which he refused and continued to fight resulting in a taser drive stun to the abdomen which began to gain compliance. One more drive stun was delivered to his abdomen by Officer Lopez. During this time I instructed officer Williams to step back so that I could take full positive control of the suspect. I then picked up the suspect and placed him into the rear of the vehicle. While doing so the suspect

who was still kicking delivered a blow to my inner thigh near my testicles. He was placed in the rear seat and the door was shut. See supplements and report for further.

<p>COMMENTS</p> <p>On April, 5, 2026, at approximately 0129 hours, I (Sgt. Stutz) responded to 801 Duval St., regarding a response to resistance incident.</p> <p>Key West Police Communications had dispatched officers to a physical altercation at the above location reference multiple subjects.</p> <p>On arrival, I was advised that the altercation was still occurring when officers arrived and the primary instigator was being held down by multiple subjects. When officers attempted to take control of the subject, later identified as Andrew Antecio, he resisted by trying to pull away and tense his arms to defeat handcuffing. He was eventually secured with the assistance of the witness. The subject then aggressively resisted officers by kicking and striking them and was taken to the ground. The subject was again attempted to be placed into a patrol car, and he began kicking and striking officers again which led to the application of a Taser Drive Stun to the abdomen to gain compliance. The subject was then able to be secured and myself and Key West Rescue were summoned to the scene.</p> <p>Ofc. Christina Interview:</p> <p>Ofc. Christina stated when he arrived on scene, Ofc. Williams, with the assistance of the witness, was attempting to place handcuffs on the subject. Ofc. Christina directed Ofc. Anderson to assist Ofc. Williams so the witness could step away. The subject was struggling against Ofc. Williams attempt to handcuff him by pulling and tensing his arms. After the subject was handcuffed, he continued to struggle and escalated his behavior by kicking at officers. Ofc. Christina stated he approached to help and was kicked by the subject, leading him to grab him by the arm and hair and guide him to the ground with the assistance of Ofc. Williams. On the ground the subject continued resistance and continued to kick at the officers, striking him and Ofc. Williams again. Ofc. Christina stated the subject was removed from the ground and again attempted to be placed in the patrol vehicle. While placing him in the vehicle the subject began kicking officers again and Ofc. Lopez arrived and delivered a Taser Drive Stun to the subject's abdomen to gain compliance.</p> <p>Ofc. Lopez Interview:</p> <p>Ofc. Lopez stated when he arrived on scene, he observed the subject on the ground actively struggling against and kicking officers. Ofc. Lopez stated he assisted officer by securing the subject's legs to keep him from continuing to kick. Ofc. Lopez stated the subject was then stood up to be placed into the rear of a patrol vehicle and he escalated resistance again by kicking Ofc. Christina and Ofc. Williams. Ofc. Lopez said he gave loud, verbal commands for the subject to stop kicking or he would be Tased. The subject continued and Ofc. Lopez delivered two to three Drive Stuns to the subject's abdomen which gained compliance. The subject was then placed into the patrol vehicle and Key West Rescue, and I were requested to respond.</p> <p>Ofc. Anderson Interview:</p> <p>Ofc. Anderson stated he responded to the scene and observed the subject actively engaged with another individual and saw Ofc. Williams attempting to handcuff him. The subject was tensing and pulling away and he and a witness helped Ofc. Williams secure the subject in handcuffs. Ofc. Anderson stated when the subject was moved toward the patrol vehicle he continued to struggle and Ofc. Christina came to assist. Ofc. Anderson stated the subject started kicking officers and Ofc. Christina and Williams guided him to the ground. Ofc. Anderson stated he moved back while Ofc. Christina</p>

and Ofc. Williams continued to give load verbal commands to the subject to stop resisting and the subject continued to resist and kick. Ofc. Anderson stated Ofc. Lopez arrived ant they attempted to place the subject in the vehciel. Ofc. Anderson advised the subject continued to struggle and kick and was Tased in the abdomen by Ofc. Lopez. Ofc. Anderson said the subject then complied and was placed in the vehicle.

Ofc. Williams Interview:

Ofc. Williams advised when he arrived, he saw the subject actively fighting with another male. Ofc. Williams stood the subject up and attempted to handcuff him. Ofc. Williams stated the male pulled away his arms and tensed up in an attempt to defeat handcuffing. Ofc. Williams advised Ofc. Anderson came to assist and the subject continued to try to pull away but was eventually handcuffed. Ofc. Williams advised the subject continued to struggle and Ofc. Christina arrived to assist. Ofc. Williams stated the subject began kicking him and Ofc. Christina and they guided him back to the ground. Ofc. Williams stated the subject continued to pull away and try to kick officers, striking but himself and Ofc. Christina. Ofc. Williams advised Ofc. Lopez arrived as the subject was kicking and delivered a Taser Drive Stun to the subject's abdomen and gained compliance. The subject was then placed in the patrol vehciel.

Subject Interview:

Due to the subject's erratic behavior, he was transported to Lower Keys Medical Center for evaluation, and I conducted the interview there. I asked the subject what happened. The subject was incoherent and highly intoxicated. According to witnesses on scene, he may have also ingested drug infused edibles. I asked the subject if he was injured. The subject stated he was not. I asked the subject about the Taser Drive Stun to his abdomen. The subject seemed to slightly remember that but was still incoherent. I photographed the subject and observed contact burn injuries to the subject's abdomen where the Drive Stuns were applied. The subject was later medically cleared by Lower Keys Medical Center and transported to jail.

Witness Interview- Bioni :

Bioni advised he did not know the subject but witnessed him attacking multiple people in the area of 801 Pub and stated he had to intervene. Bioni stated he grabbed the subject from behind and held his arms until officers arrived. Bioni also attempted to help Officers as the subject continued to resist and pull away from them when they tried to handcuff. Bioni stated he saw the subject continued to fight as more officers arrived and stated the subject was out of control.

At this time, I find no violations of policy for this response to resistance.
