

Key West Community Sailing Center Mission Statement

Our mission is to advance sailing education and encourage the public and sailors of all ages to experience the joy of sailing in a safe and fun environment.

To establish and sustain ongoing programs for sailing, education and community involvement in the city of Key West and surrounding areas.

To provide safe and fun environment for youth interested in sailing and boating. Learning to handle small craft teaches young students seamanship, safety, self-reliance, planning, thoughtful decision making, communication, team building and confidence. We will strive to encourage these skills through our educational programs.

To impart a love of sailing as a life sport, while providing the fundamental skills necessary for participants to advance in the sport as far as their desire, skill and hard work may take them.

KWCSC 2015 Summer Youth Program

This summer, 2015, the KWCSC offered a ten-week sailing program. The summer camp was very successful; over 100 individuals, including 22 on scholarships, participated in the program. The camp was broken up by week and consisted of three different skill levels. We offered one young beginner course, five beginner courses, three intermediate courses and one racing course. The goal of the entire program was to get kids interested in the sport of sailing and to allow them to further their ability and confidence on sailboats. Each skill level had a different focus and taught kids different abilities to better their sailing. The four levels are designed to be completed systematically; the student must complete each course in order to advance to the next.

The young beginner class was designed for younger kids between the ages of 7-10, to have fun and realize that although challenging sailing is very enjoyable. We did not pressure these younger students to completely learn how to sail but encouraged them to have fun and begin to understand the basics.

The beginner course was our most popular course. In this course the students would encouraged to focus on both the logic and actions of sailing. The goal of this course was for all willing students to be confident in sailing dinghies and be able to sail their boat by themselves. In this course we focused on wind sensing, boat control and the logic of sailing in any direction desired.

Our second most popular course, the intermediate course, focuses on confidence in ability and control of the sailboat. In this course we take beginner sailors and teach them more advanced logic and abilities that prepare them for racing. This course is where we saw the most improvement in the students as they became confident in their skill and began to fully enjoy the sport.

The final course of the summer was the racing course. This course was for advanced and experienced sailors who wanted to really get into the sport. In this camp we took confident sailors and showed them the excitement of racing. We talked about and practiced advanced boat handling and racing strategy. This class was a lot of fun and opened the students eyes to the sport of sailing outside our sailing club.

Graham Shivers

Graham began sailing as a young child on his fathers 25 ft. O'day. At the age of 9 in Kilmarnock Virginia he took his first formal sailing camp at Indian Creek Yacht Club. He went through the three levels there from Beginner to Racing. At the age of 13 his family moved to New Zealand where he joined the Timaru Boy High Sailing Team, a nationally competing team at the time. After returning to Virginia from New Zealand he went back to Indian Creek Yacht Club as a junior instructor for the summer seasons. During the school year he sailed for the Christchurch School varsity sailing team two seasons a year for all four years of high school. Each of those years Christchurch competed at the national level ranked in the top 20 all four years. During the summer he worked from a junior instructor up to the head instructor at ICYC, until he moved to Key West for college, pursuing a degree in Marine Biology. He now has completed two sailing programs at Key West Community Sailing Center, the spring homeschooler program and the summer youth camps.

Heidi Ruse

Heidi grew up in Deltaville Virginia, where her family owns a successful boatyard and marina, Deltaville Marina. She spent much of her childhood working and playing on the boats there. She also attended Christchurch School and participated on the Varsity Sailing Team becoming the team Captain Senior Year. During her summers she worked for the boatyard and marina, volunteered at Fishing Bay yacht club teaching young children how to sail optis, and 420's, and started her own rental business. She has lived on her 28 ft. Pearson sailboat since graduating high school in 2014 and has various cruising experiences. She now keeps her boat on a mooring ball here in Key West where she and Graham live. Heidi just had a successful summer at Key West Community Sailing Center coaching along side Graham. The two had over five beginner weeks, intermediate and advanced racing weeks, reaching our goal of teaching over 100 children to sail.






