The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to inform you that, per House Bill#2244/Senate Bill#1094, City of Key West, was appropriated \$500,000 for construction of the "**KEY WEST - VON PHISTER STREET SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS**". The new budget was signed into law on Monday June 30, 2025.

City of Key West must enter into a State Funded Grant Agreement (SFGA) with FDOT in FY 2026 (July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026) to secure the funding. Work cannot commence prior to the execution of the SFGA. 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The benefits of the project include increased stability and safety of road conditions in general, especially during and immediately after heavy rain and major weather events, including hurricanes. Regular maintenance of the paved road will pro-actively ensure safer driving conditions and continued use not impacted by flooding and wash-outs due to major weather events.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project will include paving with additional right-of-way, drainage, striping and reflective pavement markers, traffic signage and pedestrian crosswalk striping to enhance public and vehicular safety. This project will also improve water quality by eliminating sediment runoff into wetland areas.

Repair of the roadway and drainage facilities will provide safe infrastructure for the traveling public.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Residents and visitors of the City of Key West. Thousands of individuals are expected to be served by the safety improvements to Von Phister Street as well as the reduced traffic on state and county highways.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Provide a better driving surface preserving vehicle wear and tear while improving energy efficiency and facilitating the safe operation of drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists. The project also includes improved storm water management in the area with increased road shoulder permeability mitigating standing water in the roadway making driving during storm events safer. The benefits will be measured by comparing pre- and post-construction traffic collision data, monitoring vehicle speeds and traffic flow, tracking emissions reductions, and assessing pedestrian and bike safety through survey of accident reports.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Liquidated Damages would be used for exceeding contract period of performance. An extended warranty would be required for substandard work if not corrected (i.e. paying not consolidated/compacted to satisfaction).
