An ordinance of the city of Key West, Florida, amending Chapter 18 of the code of ordinances, entitled "Businesses", by amending Article II entitled "Alcoholic Beverages", Division II entitled Entertainment License, amending Section 18 – 57 to allow the Chief Licensing Official to accept the entertainment license application instead of the city manager, to increase the annual fee from \$150.00 to \$250.00, and to requiring an establishment to give 10 days notice to the Code Compliance Department regarding events scheduled to take place on their property, amending Section 18- 60 to reduce the number of violations of division 3 of article ii of chapter 6 and article IV of chapter 26 from three to one violations for a mandatory suspension or revocation hearing, Providing for enforcement, fees and penalties; providing for severability; providing for repeal of inconsistent provisions; providing for an effective date
