WHEREAS, Rev. Steve has dedicated his life to showing compassion for those in need, and advocacy for justice and equality.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, TERI JOHNSTON, MAYOR of the City of Key West, along with the entire Key West City Commission do hereby recognize
