On 6/12/23 at approximately 1400 hours I, Officer K. Hansell was dispatched to 1341 McCarthy Lane Apt 215 for a welfare check. Police were called to Alan's apartment by his counselor Michael Hodge after Michael received several messages about Alan hearing voices and banging on his apartment walls.

Upon arrival, Alan began screaming and was irritate. He was talking about people not seeing him and that he had the beginning stages of bi-polar disorder. I observed Alan to be dirty and unkept as he stood in his door way. Alan's clothing had dirt all over them and his legs and feet were covered in dirt. Alan screamed no when I stated that we could take him to DePoo. Alan stated he had been there and they did not help him.

Alan refused to come with law enforcement to be evaluated. I told Alan he had to come with us and stepped toward him. As I stepped toward him I took hold of his right arm and wrist. Alan immediately began screaming to let him go and attempted to pull away from my grip multiple times. Alan pulled us toward his open apartment door in an attempt to get back inside and away from law enforcement. Officer Calvert and I were able to get Alan's wrists into a transport hold and I handcuffed Alan per KWPDP policy and procedure. Alan continued to attempt to pull away from both myself and Officer Calvert. Due to Alan's continued attempts to pull away from us, we transported Alan to the ground, guiding him to the ground so he was laying on his stomach. I was able to double-lock the handcuffs at this point. I positioned myself on Alan's right side with my knee over him upper thigh and my hand on his back and shoulder area.

When other officers arrived on scene, we stood Alan up and walked him to the elevator and then to my marked patrol vehicle without further incident. Rescue was requested and arrived to tend to the small lacerations Alan received on the back of his head and by his ear.

I transported Alan to the Lower Keys Medical Center under a Baker Act due to his erratic behavior and his unkept, unclear appearance. Alan could not determine for himself that he needed mental health care. This was evident by his behavior and his dirty, unkept appearance.

My BWC was activated and downloaded for review.

I notified Michael of Alan's status via phone per his request in the call notes.

On Monday, June 12, 2023 I (Ofc. M. Calvert) responded to 1341 McCarthy Lane, unit 215, as a back up Officer for Ofc. K. Hansell. We were responding for a welfare check at the request of a case worker for the resident, Michael Hodge.

Hodge was concerned for his client, Alan Chiras, and stated he was hearing voices and sounded particularly bad today. Ofc. K. Hansell and I approached Chiras apartment at Poinciana Royale on the second floor, and knocked. As soon as Ofc. K. Hansell knocked Chiras started speaking loudly and came to the door. Chiras, yelled at us that we are not supposed to see him and why were we there. Chiras displayed overly animated body movements when speaking to us. Chiras looked unkept with bare, dirty feet, long fingernails with dirt piled underneath and stained looking clothing. We explained that we were there to check on him at Michael's request, due to concern for his mental health. Chiras said that he was "bi-polar" and not on the medications he needed to be on, but refused to take himself for mental health treatment calling everyone at Depoo and LKMC "incompetent." It was clear to Ofc. Hansell and I that if left alone, Chiras' condition would deteriorate as he was not caring for his own well being in any way.

Ofc. K. Hansell and I went to place Chiras in protective custody, and he began screaming and trying to pull away. Chiras' apartment door was still ajar and he was trying to run away and close himself inside. Ofc. K. Hansell and I were both able to grab an arm, as Chiras tried to resist and get away. Once secured in handcuffs Chiras continued to scream, kick and was trying to lift his legs up to hinder us from getting him to the elevator and secure inside a patrol car. Ofc. K. Hansell and I decided the safest for everyone was to redirect Chiras to the ground in a controlled manner and hold him in place, waiting for other Officer's to arrive and assist. An arm drag technique was used to escort Chiras to the ground. Once Officers G. Abreu and J. Young arrived we stood Chiras up and were able to escort him to the elevator and down to Ofc. K. Hansell's patrol car.

We noticed a small amount of blood on Chiras' head and neck and had KWFD Rescue come check him. They stated there was a small cut on his head and cleaned it up, with no further medical treatment needed for it.

I did not have any significant injuries from the encounter, other than superficial scratches, redness on my arms, along with bruising on the left thigh and right shin. A notice of injury was not needed.

Sgt. Duponty was notified of the Response to Resistance.

Chiras was transported to LKMC as a Baker Act by Ofc. K. Hansell without incident and I followed behind her to the ER.

My BWC was activated during this encounter.

On 6/12/2023 at 1427 hours, I responded to 1341-215 Mccarthy Lane, to assist Officer K. Hansell and Officer Calvert after they called on the radio for expedited backup.

Upon arrival, I observed Officer K. Hansell, Officer Calvert and Officer Abreu struggling with what appeared to be a mentally ill male. The male was yelling and I noticed he had blood dripping down the right side of his face. The male repeatedly pulled away from Officers while handcuffed, while complaining the Key West Police Department was trying to kill him. Myself and other officers on scene were calm and transported the male to Officer K. Hansell's patrol car and placed him in the backseat, reassuring him that we were not there to harm him, but rather, help him.

Key West Fire Rescue arrived on scene and examined the male, who was subsequently transported to Lower Keys Medical Center and placed under a Baker Act.

My Axon bodycam was active and uploaded to evidence.com.

I have no further involvement with this case.

On June 12th, 2023, I (Ofc. G. Abreu), responded to assist Ofc. Calvert and Ofc. K Hansell at 1341 MCcarthy Lane Apt 215, Key West, FL, who were out with a male subject experiencing a mental crisis.

Upon arrival, Ofc. K Hansell and Ofc. Calvert had a male subject detained on the ground outside of apartment 215. The call originated as a welfare check for Alan Chiras. Chiras was the male subject on the ground in handcuffs. I noticed a small amount of blood on the back of Chiras head. Chiras was speaking in what I would describe as gibberish. Chiras then began screaming about us being "Killers" and "understanding our history". It was very obvious Chiras was experiencing some sort of mental crisis. Ofc. Hansell and I escorted Chiras down to Ofc. Hansells patrol vehicle. I placed a spit hood on Chiras while he was in the back seat as he was unintentionally spitting all over me while he was screaming. Key West Rescue responded and treated Chiras for the small laceration he had on the back of his head.

Ofc. Hansell transported Chiras to Lower Keys Medical Center as a baker act. My body worn camera was active during my encounter on scene.
