WHEREAS, tragically, twenty-five (25) people were killed in crashes within the City of Key West during the years from 2016 through 2020 according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reporting, a fatality rate of 20.13 per 100,000 population; and

WHEREAS, City of Key West City Commission adopted Resolution 20-009 establishing a goal of "Vision Zero" on January 7, 2020 to achieve zero collision-caused right-of-way fatalities and serious injuries by the year 2035.

WHEREAS, the City of Key West applied for funding on September 12, 2022 and on February 1, 2023 received approval from

USDOT for a Grant Award from the Fiscal Year 2022 Safe Streets and Roads for All Grant Program funding cycle to assist with creating a City of Key West City-wide Comprehensive Safety Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, City staff recommends approval of the attached Grant Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the attached Grant Agreement, "U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION GRANT AGREEMENT UNDER THE FISCAL YEAR 2022 SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL GRANT PROGRAM", award number 693JJ32340014, with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for the City of Key West City-wide Comprehensive Safety Action Plan in the amount of \$400,000.00 Federal / \$100,000.00 City match (\$500,000.00 Total) is hereby approved and authorized.

Section 2: That reimbursement funding in an amount up to \$400,000.00 will be budgeted in the appropriate Grant Revenue accounts. Grant eligible costs will be budgeted in the appropriate Expense Accounts. City cost-sharing of 20% of the total project

funding is required and \$100,000.00 has been budgeting in Account 111-4903-549-3100 SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL - GRANT MATCH. Any necessary budget transfers and amendments to accept the grant funding are hereby approved.

Introduction

Approve the attached "U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION GRANT AGREEMENT UNDER THE FISCAL YEAR 2022 SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL GRANT PROGRAM", award number 693JJ32340014, with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for the City of Key West Citywide Comprehensive Safety Action Plan in the amount of \$400,000.00 Federal / \$100,000.00 City match (\$500,000.00 Total).

Background

On January 7th, 2020, the City Commission adopted a goal of "Vision Zero" with Resolution 20-009 to achieve zero collision-caused right-of-way fatalities and serious injuries by the year 2035. Tragically, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reporting, twenty-five (25) people were killed in crashes within the City of Key West within the years from 2016 through 2020, a fatality rate of 20.13 per 100,000 population.

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law established a Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary funding program that would assist with funding the creation of certain community safety action plans in support of "Vision Zero"-type programs over five years (2022-2026). Applicants with action plans can seek implementation grants for elements identified in the plan. The City of Key West applied for, and was awarded on February 1, 2023, \$400,000.00 in Federal funding for a City-wide Comprehensive Safety Action Plan. [https://www.transportation.gov/grants/ss4a/2022-awards] The action plan would seek to identify and quantify potential improvements within the right of way that would enable the City to reach its Vision Zero goal through the use of FHWA proven safety countermeasures.

Procurement

The City of Key West will receive up to a maximum reimbursement amount of \$400,000.00 of Federal funding to develop a City-wide Comprehensive Safety Action Plan. Grant revenue will be budgeted in account 1110000-3314900. Expenses will be budgeted in account 1114903-5493100.

Cost-sharing of 20% of the total project funding, up to \$100,000.00, is required from non-Federal sources and has been budgeted in account 1114903 5493100 SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL – GRANT MATCH.

Recommendation

The City Manager's Office recommends the Mayor and City Commission approve the resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute the attached grant agreement with FHWA, upon consent of the City Attorney, and execute any budget transfers or amendments necessary.

This agreement is between the Federal Highway Administration (the "FHWA") and the City of Key West (the "Recipient").

This agreement reflects the selection of the Recipient to receive a Safe Streets and Roads for All ("SS4A") Grant for the Key West City-wide Comprehensive Safety Action Plan.
