A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING KEY WEST PORT OPERATIONS, WITH THE KEY WEST POLICE DEPARTMENT, TO ACCEPT GRANT AWARD NO. EMW-2021-PU-00389-S01 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$165,000.00 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY PORT SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (PSGP) (CITY MATCH \$55,000.00) FOR ACQUISITION OF TWO BOAT LIFTS FOR POLICE AND FIRE LOCATED ACROSS FROM THE POLICE AND FIRE STATIONS ON NORTH ROOSEVELT BOULEVARD, AND REFURBISHMENT OF KWPD'S 21-YEAR OLD 27-FOOT SAFEBOAT; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the Key West Port, with the Key West Police Department, via direction to the City Manager, is authorized to accept grant award NO. EMW-2021-PU-00389-S01 in the amount of \$165,000.00 (City match \$55,000.00) for acquisition of two boat lifts for police and fire, and refurbishment of KWPDs 21-year old 27-foot Safeboat.

Section 2: That grant revenue will be budgeted in account 001-0000-331-2000 (General Fund/Revenue/Public Safety) in FY 21/22. Expenses, including city matching funds

for this grant, will be budgeted in account 001-2104-521-6400 (General Fund Law Enforcement Grants/ Machinery and Equipment). Any necessary budget adjustments are hereby authorized.


Section 3: That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the Presiding Officer and the Clerk of the Commission.

Action Statement:

The Key West Police Department (KWPD) is seeking Commission authorization to accept the attached award package for Grant No. EMW-2021-PU-00389-S01 from the 2021 Port Security Grant Program (PSGP) funded by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) / Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) with a Federal award amount of \$165,000 for two boat lifts for Police and Fire located across the street from both stations on N. Roosevelt Blvd. and boat refurbishment of KWPD's 21-year-old 27-foot Safeboat.

Background:

Key West is included as a port of call on international cruises increasing its vulnerability as a hub for transit, as well as a final destination. Ferries are more vulnerable to improvised explosive device (IED) because their hulls are less robust than cruise ships. The Key West Police and Fire Departments take Chemical Biological Radiological Nuclear and Explosive (CBRNE) and IED threats seriously. In May 2021, the KWPD submitted a PSGP grant application to request funding for two boat lifts and boat refurbishment in the amount of \$220,000.00 (\$165,000.00 Federal share, \$55,000.00 City match).

Purpose and Justification:

Access to the Police and Fire boats is critical to adequately prevent, detect, respond to, and recover from IED and CBRNE incidents. The boat lifts will allow both the Fire and Police departments to access their boats and operate them on water more quickly and efficiently, improving their response rate to threats. Also critical is having a boat that is suitable with warrantied functionality that allows KWPD to remain in compliance with the requirements set forth by the Maritime Transportation Security Act (MTSA)/US Coast Guard as outlined in their Facility Security Plan. A refurbished boat ensures KWPD meets the minimum requirement of having three (3) fully functional, modern law enforcement boats by extending usable life by another decade.

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Article I - Summary Description of Award

The terms of the approved Investment Justification(s) and Budget Detail Worksheet(s) submitted by the recipient are incorporated into the terms of this Federal award, subject to the additional description and limitations stated in this Agreement Article and the limitations stated in subsequent reviews by FEMA of the award budget. Post-award documents uploaded into ND Grants for this award are also incorporated into the terms and conditions of this award, subject to any limitations stated in subsequent approvals by FEMA of changes to the award. Investments not listed in this Agreement Article are not approved for funding under this award.

Investment 1: Port of Key West Refurbishment of Police 27 Foot Safeboat is fully funded for \$112,500.

Investment 2: City of Key West Boat Lifts for Police and Fire Department Emergency Response Boats is fully funded for \$52,500.

Article II - Limited English Proficiency (Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title VI)

Article XX - Debarment and Suspension

Recipients are subject to the non-procurement debarment and suspension regulations implementing Executive Orders (E.O.) 12549 and 12689, which are at 2 C.F.R. Part 180 as adopted by DHS at 2 C.F.R. Part 3000. Port of Key West Refurbishment of Police 27 Foot Safeboat:

In order for the Key West Police Department to access and adequately serve the Port of Key West by way of water, they need to remain in compliance with requirements set forth by MTSA/US Coast Guard as outlined in their Facility Security Plan. Meeting the minimum requirement of the Key West Police Department having (3) fully functional, modern law enforcement boats will ensure that when cruise ships return to the port, they will be allowed to enter by the US Coast Guard. While they are currently in possession of three (3) boats that meet this requirement, one 27 foot Safeboat is twenty-one (21) years old and rapidly approaching catastrophic disrepair, thereby risking falling out of compliance. 16. Malicious mischief and vandalism on the job is the responsibility of the party submitted to in section 1. Electric Contractor shall not be responsible for any damage resulting therefrom. Party submitted to shall carry needed insurance.
17. Overdue accounts will be charged a late charge at the rate of 1.5% per month, or the maximum rate permitted by law, whichever is less.
18. In the event any party to this Contract commences any action, legal or otherwise, to correct the contract price, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover attorneys fees and all other costs incurred in connection with the action.


