Training & Accomplishments

- The Key West Fire Department celebrated the 150-year anniversary of the Key West Fire Department with a proclamation presented by Mayor DeeDee Henriquez at the October 9th City Commission meeting. The milestone was also marked by a successful community anniversary party held at the Truman Waterfront.
- The Fire Prevention Bureau conducted a busy Fire Prevention Month campaign emphasizing this year's theme: educating the community on the dangers of Lithium-Ion batteries. The Fire Prevention Bureau along with on-duty fire trucks visited local schools throughout October focusing on the importance of smoke detectors and fire safety for children.
- The Key West Fire Department successfully provided full safety coverage for the thousands of revelers during Goombay and Fantasy Fest events. Through robust multi agency cooperation, the festivals concluded without any major incidents to report.

• Following a period of dedicated hard work, three of our firefighters have successfully passed the National Paramedic Exam and are now registered State of Florida Paramedics. They have officially started the KWFD Paramedic Sign Off Program under the supervision of Medical Director, Dr. Antonio Gandia. Upon successful completion of this in-house training, they will be fully approved to operate as Medical Director approved Paramedics.
